THE TWINS：The Twins have gone just 1－3 through four games on their six－game，seven－day tonight they will play the second of three with the A＇s．．．．following tomorrow afternoon＇s game， they will travel home for a three－game series against Texas this weekend to finish the＂first halt＂of the season．

TWINS LOSE ODO AND OPENER IN OAKLAND：The Twins lost to the A＇s last night by a score of 8－6．．．Jake 0dorizzi（10－4）was the starter and loser，allowing six runs（5 earned）on four strain），allowing one run on three hits in 3.1 innings pitched．．．the offense recorded 10 hits， three from Jason Castro，who doubled and homered twice，the fifth multi－homer game of his career．．．Miguel Sanó added a home run，his 13th of the season．

## ON THE VERGE OF PRE－ASG HISTORY：

 maining before the All－Star break the 160 homers are one shy of the record set last season by New York－AL（161），while they have already passed the all－time Twins pre－ASG record of 125 ，set back in 1964.histwins own a team ． 497 slugging percentage，which ranks fourth－best in basebal and Houston（． 500 in 2017）．
玉 The club＇s 53 wins are two shy of the Senators／Twins record of 55 （done 2 times，last in 1970）through 84 games．．．the franchise record for pre－All Star Game wins is 59 ，set back in 1969 （59－37）．

POLOS ROAD INFO：Jorge Polanco ranks second in all of baseball in road batting average at ． 350 （63－for－180），trailing the Mets＇Jeff McNeil（．369）．．．Polanco has reached safely on the road in 27 straight and has hit safely on the road in 19 straight．．． 27 straight on－base straight from April 9－June 26，2019．．．the 19－game hit－streak is longest since Pittsburgh＇s Kevin Newman hit in 22 straight from May 12－June 29， 2019.

玉 The last Twins road hit－streak as long was Orlando Hudson，hitting safely in 19 straight from April 8－May 19，2010．．．the last Twin with a road hit－streak of 20 games－or－more the club record．

ROSTER MOVE：The Twins announced today that they have placed right－handed pitcher Jake Odorizzi on the 10－day Injured List with a blister on his right middle finger，an injury he suffered last night vs．the Athletics．．．Odorizzi，who was named to the AL All－Star team this week，has gone 10－4 with a 3.15 ERA （ 88.2 IP， 31 ER ）， 30 walks， 96 strikeouts and a ． 214 opponent batting average in 17 starts．．．to replace 0 dorizzi on the 25 －man roster， the Twins have recalled right－handed pitcher Zack Littell from Triple－A Rochester．

STRAIGHT A＇S：The Twins and Athletics are playing each other for the second of seven times this season．．．they face off for two more games here tonight and tomorrow，and a four－game series in Minneapolis from July 18－21．．．since 2010，the Twins are 27－40 against Oakland，including 10－22 at the Coliseum．．．Twins haven＇t won a season－series over Oakland since 2015 （3－1）．．．they haven＇t won a series vs．Oakland since taking two of three May 2－4，2017，having gone 0－3 since．
玉 Ehire Adrianza is slashing ．417／．481／．583（1．065 OPS）with four doubles and six runs scored in nine career games against 0akland， including going 5 －for－12，with all four doubles，here last season．
$\Phi$ Jonathan Schoop is 31 －for－ $99(.313)$ career against the A＇s，with three home runs，six doubles， 12 RBI， 14 runs scored and an .817 OPS in 26 games．．．enters with a six－game hitting streak against Oakland．
玉 Nelson Cruz leads all active players with 34 home runs against the Athletics．．．also leads with 115 RBI，is second with 171 games played and third with 165 hits．

TWINS AND THEIR HOMERS：With three more homers last night，the Twins now have 160 on the season，the most in baseball，ahead of Seattle（152），despite playing seventh fewest games in baseball（84）．．．they now have a plus +59 home run differential，which also leads baseball，ahead of Los Angeles－NL（ +39 ），then Oakland（ +38 ）．
$\Phi$ Jason Castro reached the double－digit home run mark last night，giving the Twins nine players now with 10－plus homers（Kepler－21， Rosario－20，Cron－17，Cruz－16，Sanó－13，Schoop－13，Garver－12，Polanco－11 and Castro－10）．．．the 2017 and 2004 Twins each had nine players with such marks with the club record being 11 in 20－16．

## THIS AND THAT：

$\Phi$ The Twins have been in first place in the AL Central for 86 days this season－－only the Dodgers（ 91 days）have spent more time leading their division this season．．．the last season in which Minnesota spent more days leading the AL Central was in 2010 （ 141 days）．
$\Phi$ Twins catchers have combined to hit .276 （ 86 －for－ 312 ）with 17 doubles， 23 home runs， 59 RBI and a .558 slugging percentage． they lead baseball in homers，slugging percentage and second in OPS（．903）．．．23 home runs are tied for best in club history from the catcher spot with the 2009 total－Joe Mauer＇s AL MVP season．
क Luis Arraez is hitting ． 429 （18－for－42）with three doubles，four RBI，six walks，seven runs scored and a 1.000 OPS in his last 13 games． $\Phi$ Miguel Sanó has six home runs and 11 RBI in his last 10 games．．．he has a 1.030 OPS in that span．

A RAY OF HOPE: Gibson was the starter and winner in his last start on June 25 vs . Tampa Bay, as he threw 7.0 innings, allowing four runs on seven hits with seven strikeouts in a 9-4 Twins win...threw 5.0 innings, having only allowed a two-out single to Willy Adames in the third inning with four strikeouts, but yielded his first run of the game on an Adames solo home run to begin the sixth...struck out the first two batters of the seventh, but his next four would go: single, double, two-RBI double and RBI triple, before he'd strike out Guillermo Heredia to end the inning and his outing...earned the win as the Twins' offense provided him with a season-high eight runs of support, including three runs on five hits in both the third and fourth innings off reigning AL Cy Young Award winner Blake Snell.

BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE: For the first time in his seven-year career, Gibson pitched out of the bullpen...last Thursday, two days after his start, the Twins recorded their second extra-inning marathon game in nine days, this time falling 5-2 to Tampa Bay in 18 innings...with all-but-one reliever having been used in the game, and eventual loser Ryne Harper having been used in back-to-back games prior, manager Rocco Baldelli turned to Gibson in the 17th inning, hoping to give his team one last chance to score a run and avoid Harper...Gibson threw 11 pitches, eight strikes in a perfect 17th inning, marking his first relief appearance in his 175th time on a big league mound...the only two times Gibson had pitched in relief professionally came as a member of the GCL Twins, with his most recent appearance coming on August 3, 2012 when he threw 1.1 IP against the Red Sox, who featured names like Jacoby Ellsbury, Carl Crawford and Tzu-Wei Lin.

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Gibson enters tonight's start with the sixth-most starts (164) and the seventh-highest innings pitched total (963.2) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (126, most in baseball), 11th in wins (60) and 14th in strikeouts (744).

GETTING AHEAD: Gibson has made a habit this season of getting ahead in the count, as referenced by his 66.5 percent rate on first pitch strikes, 11 th-best in baseball, fourth in the AL behind Masahiro Tanaka (69.1), Rick Porcello (68.1), and teammate José Berríos (66.7)... he has also induced a bevy of first pitch swinging strikes, as referenced by his 32.2 percent swings-on-first-pitch ratio, seventh-best in the American League... Gibby is also sixth in the AL in percent of swings that miss (31.0) while he's 20th with a 17.9 percentage on pitches in play.

- All this has led to a career-best pace for both strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9.03-14th in the AL ) and strikeout-to-walk ratio ( $3.83,11$ th in the AL).

AGAINST THE A'S: The right-hander is making his fifth career start against Oakland... Gibson only saw the A's once last season, as that start marked his first in The Bay since August 8, 2014...in that start, Gibson earned the win after spinning 7.1 innings of one-run ball, throwing 114 pitches in an eventual 5-1 win....owns a career line of 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA (22.1 IP, 10 ER) against them, but uncharacteristically has allowed more walks (13) than strikeouts (10).

FUN WITH STATCAST: Gibson has seen the most success this season with his slider, as opponents are hitting just. 145 ( 12 -for- 83 ) against it, and 47 of his 88 strikeouts have come via the slider ( 54.2 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his sinker, going 40-for-135 (.296) with three home runs and an average exit velocity of 91.5 with a wOBA of . 346 (weighted on-base average)...his slider has 39.4 inches of vertical drop, 2.9 percent above average, 15 th best in the Majors among pitchers who have thrown 250 -or-more sliders this season. - Gibson's slider has shown dramatic improvement since the beginning of last year, as he finished 2017 with an opponents' batting average of 241 ( 26 -for-108) on the slider, but last year dropped it to 165 ( 28 -for-170).

- Not only that, but has seen improvement in K Percentage (up to 54.2 from 40.5 in 2017), Put Away Percentage (up to 35.1 from 28.0 in 2017 ) and BB Percentage (down to 2.2 from 4.3 in 2017).
