TWINS TAKE SOX SERIES ON SOUTH SIDE: The Twins beat the White Sox on Sunday afternoon by a score of 11-1, taking the third of four games in Chicago...Kyle Gibson (10-4) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 13 hits, three coming from Miguel Sanó, who hit his 18th home run...the Twins also got home runs from Max Kepler (28), Jorge Polanco (16) and Jonathan Schoop (16).

afternoon...it marks Cruz's sixth career AL POW Award and first since June 24, 2018...Nelson becomes the third Twin to take the hono this season, joining Jake Odorizzi (May 6) and Max Kepler (May 27)...below are Cruz's numbers for the week:
$\Phi$ Posted a slash line of . $414 / .485 / 1.172$ with 10 runs, 12 hits, a double, seven home runs, 13 RBl and three walks in seven games played $\mp$ Homered in five straight games from July 22-26, matching the club record shared by Brian Dozier, Marty Cordova and Harmon Killebrew $\Phi$ Recorded the first three-homer game of his career on Thursday...became the ninth player in club history (11th time), and the first since Max Kepler June 6 of this season at Cleveland.
$\mp$ With 26 home runs on the season, joined his teammate Kepler to become the second duo in team history to reach the 25 -homer threshold in 102-or-fewer team games, joining Killebrew and Bob Allison in 1959.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 3-6 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York and 1-1 vs. Milwaukee...they are 214-197 all-time in IL play, the eighth most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (246), New York-AL (246), Los Angeles-AL (235), Texas (224), Oakland (222), Detroit (217) and Chicago-AL (216)
$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting. 320 ( 48 -for-150) with 12 doubles, 10 home runs and 24 RBI in his last 37 games vs. NL opponents. $\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is hitting . 348 ( 47 -for-135) with a .9350 PSS' in 39 career games vs. NL teams.

TWINS-MARLINS: Twins are Marlins are playing each other for the 14th time in their history...the Twins are 7-6 against the Marlins going 2-1 at the Metrodome, 2-1 at Dolphin Stadium, 0-2 at Marlins Park and 3-2 at Target Field...their last series came in 2016 at Target Field as the Twins won two of three.
$\Phi$ IID YOU KNOW? Miguel Sanó participated in the T-Mobile Home Run Derby at Marlins Park in 2017...Sanó was the fifth seed and faced Mike Moustakas in round one, winning 11 to 10....he then faced Gary Sánchez in the semifinals and won, 11 to 10 ...he then lost to Aaron Judge in the finals 11 to 10 .

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 33-20 on the road this season, a 623 road winning percentage, the best road win-percentage in baseball...the Twins most road wins ever came in 1965, going 51-30...the Twins went $29-52$ on the road in 2018...their 116 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year, and have surpassed the club record of 113 , set in 1963...the Twins have 28 road games remaining and 29 home games.

THE TWO JAKES: When Odorizzi took the mound on June 20 at Kansas City, he did so riding a career-best 10-game winning streak, while he also stood as the American League's ERA leader at 2.24 ( $76.1 \mathrm{IP}, 19 \mathrm{ER}$ ) and co-leader with 10 wins (10-2 through 14 starts) beginning with a 4-1 loss to the Royals that night, however, he has gone 1-3 with a 8.44 ERA ( 26.2 IP, 25 ER) over his last six starts.... closer look at Jake's two seasons within a season, to-date:

ONE TO FORGET: Odorizzi had arguably his worst big league outing in his last start, July 24 vs. the New York Yankees at Target Field, yielding a career-high nine runs on 10 hits, including seven for extra bases, in just 4.0 innings of a 10-7 loss....retired the side in order in the first inning including the last two via strikeout over his final 3.0 frames, however, Yankees hitters went 10 -for- 18 with three doubles, two triples, two home runs, two walks and a sacrifice fly... Odo did finish with seven strikeouts.

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: One constant for Odorizzi this season has been his success against right-handed hitters, as he ranks second in the American League (6th in the majors) with a 178 batting average against ( 36 -for-202) and sixth with a .591 OPS by righties.
ROAD RULES, BUT BEWARE THE EAST: Odorizzi will make his second road start of the second half, after a $6-2$ win July 13 at Cleveland....he is $5-4$ with a 3.88 ERA ( $46.1 \mathrm{IP}, 20$ ER) in 10 road starts overall, but in his last eight efforts away from Target Field, he is 5 -2 with a 2.85 ERA ( $41.0 \mathrm{IP}, 13 \mathrm{ER}$ ).

- In two road starts this season at NL East ballparks, he is $0-2$ with a 11.81 ERA ( 5.1 IP, 7 ER)...was knocked out in the first inning of a 10-4 loss April 5 at Philadelphia ( 0.2 IP, 4 ER), then allowed three runs in 4.2 innings of a 9-6 defeat April 10 at the New York Mets.

HOPING TO DUPLICATE PRE-2019 INTERLEAGUE SUCCESS: Jake owns a 9-6 record with a 3.55 ERA (134.1 IP, 53 ER) in 25 career starts against the National League... however, his only two Interleague starts this season were the aforementioned losses at Philadelphia and New York-NL...he is now 2-4 with a 4.75 ERA ( $55.0 \mathrm{IP}, 29 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 11 career starts against the NL East.

- Is 2-for-21 (.095) with three RBI, one walk, eight strikeouts and five sacrifice bunts lifetime at the plate in Interleague games...last hit was an RBI single for Tampa Bay at St. Louis on August 25, 2017 (a game in which new-Twin Sergio Romo earned the relief win for the Rays)...is 0 -for- 6 with the Twins, with two strikeouts and three sacrifices (has a sacrifice in his lone PA in 2019).

GONE FISHING: Odorizzi will make his sixth career start and appearance against the Marlins, but first since May 1, 2017...is 2-1 with a 3.81 ERA (26.0 IP, 11 ER) in his first five efforts, while his teams are 4-1 (including three-straight victories)
$\bullet$ Jake has a 0.90 ERA ( 10.0 IP, 1 ER) with four walks and 13 strikeouts in two career starts at Marlins Park, pitching the Tampa Bay Rays to wins in both games...earned a 4-3 victory on May 24, 2016 with 5.0 innings of two-hit, shutout ball, then helped the Rays to a 4-2 win on May 1, 2017 (5.0 IP, 2 H, 2 R, 1 ER).

TIME FOR THE HEATER (AND HOOK)?: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.9 average MPH) and is still throwing it at a career-best 56.8 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of $54.1 \%$ )...however, after using his four-seamer $60.6 \%$ of the time through his first 14 starts, he has brought the heat for just $47.8 \%$ of his pitches over the last six starts (with the rest being off-speed)...over those six starts, his cutter rate has increased to $28.7 \%$ (from 17.5) and his split-finger usage has gone up to $19.7 \%$ (from 12.6), while his curveball percentage has dropped to $3.9 \%$ (from 9.3)...below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant: PITCH NUMBER (vs. RHB-LHB)/AVG MPH PERCENTAGE
