THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-1 over their seven-game, eight-day roadtrip, taking three of four in Chicago over the White Sox last weekend...the Twins will continue the roadtrip with the first of three in Miami through Thursday...the Twins have gone 11-11 this month and have two July games remaining...they haven't had a losing record in any month since going 13-14 in June of last season.

TWINS TAKE SOX SERIES ON SOUTH SIDE: The Twins beat the White Sox on Sunday afternoon by a score of 11-1, taking the third of four games in Chicago...Kyle Gibson (10-4) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 13 hits, three coming from Miguel Sanó, who hit his 18th home run...the Twins also got home runs from Max Kepler (28), Jorge Polanco (16) and Jonathan Schoop (16).

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 205 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL and Milwaukee (both with 177)...205 homers already are fourth most in club history...they need just 20 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 316 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season...below are the club all-time records:

ADDITIONALLY: Max Kepler leads the club with 28 home runs, in front of Nelson Cruz, who has 26...they are one of four sets of teammates in baseball with 26-plus homers each, joining Milwaukee's Christian Yelich (36) and Mike Moustakas (26), Los Angeles-NL's Cody Bellinger (34) and Max Muncy (26), and San Diego's Franmil Reyes (27) and Hunter Renfroe (26).

NELLY WINS THE WEEK: Nelson Cruz was named W.B. Mason AL Player of the Week yesterday afternoon...it marks Cruz's sixth career AL POW Award and first since June 24, 2018...Nelson becomes the third Twin to take the honor this season, joining Jake Odorizzi (May 6) and Max Kepler (May 27)...below are Cruz's numbers for the week:

- ☞ Posted a slash line of .414/.485/1.172 with 10 runs, 12 hits, a double, seven home runs, 13 RBI and three walks in seven games played.
- ☞ Homered in five straight games from July 22-26, matching the club record shared by Brian Dozier, Marty Cordova and Harmon Killebrew.
- ☞ Recorded the first three-homer game of his career on Thursday...became the ninth player in club history (11th time), and the first since Max Kepler June 6 of this season at Cleveland.
- ☞ With 26 home runs on the season, joined his teammate Kepler to become the second duo in team history to reach the 25-homer threshold in 102-or-fewer team games, joining Killebrew and Bob Allison in 1959.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 3-6 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York and 1-1 vs. Milwaukee...they are 214-197 all-time in IL play, the eighth most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (246), New York-AL (246), Los Angeles-AL (235), Texas (224), Oakland (222), Detroit (217) and Chicago-AL (216).

- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .320 (48-for-150) with 12 doubles, 10 home runs and 24 RBI in his last 37 games vs. NL opponents.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .348 (47-for-135) with a .935 OPS in 39 career games vs. NL teams.

TWINS-MARLINS: Twins and Marlins are playing each other for the 14th time in their history...the Twins are 7-6 against the Marlins, going 2-1 at the Metrodome, 2-1 at Dolphin Stadium, 0-2 at Marlins Park and 3-2 at Target Field...their last series came in 2016 at Target Field as the Twins won two of three.

☞ **DID YOU KNOW?** Miguel Sanó participated in the T-Mobile Home Run Derby at Marlins Park in 2017...Sanó was the fifth seed and faced Mike Moustakas in round one, winning 11 to 10...he then faced Gary Sánchez in the semifinals and won, 11 to 10...he then lost to Aaron Judge in the finals 11 to 10.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 33-20 on the road this season, a .623 road winning percentage, the best road win-percentage in baseball...the Twins most road wins ever came in 1965, going 51-30...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...their 116 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year, and have surpassed the club record of 113, set in 1963...the Twins have 28 road games remaining and 29 home games.

EVERYTHING GREAT SINCE JUNE 28: Following players info since June 28:

- ☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .321 (27-for-84) with four doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 22 RBI, 19 runs scored, 13 walks and a 1.127 OPS in his last 25 games...he ranks seventh in the AL in OPS in that time.
- ☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .311 (28-for-90) with four doubles, 13 home runs, 23 RBI, 19 runs scored, 12 walks and a 1.193 OPS in 24 games...he ranks second in the AL in OPS in that time, trailing just Yuli Gurriel (1.287).
- ☞ Luis Arraez is hitting .322 (28-for-87) with five doubles, one home run, nine walks, 14 runs scored and an .806 OBP in 24 games...he ranks 12th in the AL in batting average since.

INTERNATIONAL MAN OF VICTORY: Triple-A Rochester right-handed pitcher Randy Dobnak has been named International League Pitcher of the Week, the league office announced Monday...Dobnak made two starts during the period ending July 28, going 2-0 with a 1.46 ERA (2 ER, 12.1 IP) with seven hits, a hit batter, three walks, and 10 strikeouts...he was the only IL pitcher with two wins, tied for the league lead with 12.1 innings, and ranked fourth in the league with a 0.81 WHIP, and seventh with a .159 batting average against during the period.
