Park - 12, Trevor Plouffe - 12, Robbie Grossman - 11, Joe Mauer - 11, Byron Buxton - 10, Eddie Rosario - 10 and Kennys Vargas - 10).

The Seven times in baseball history has a team reached 11 players with 10-plus homers: 2018 Yankees - 12, 2019 Twins - 11, 2018 Blue Jays - 11, 2017 Astros - 11, 2016 Twins - 11, 2015 Astros - 11 and 2004 Tigers - 11.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 4-6 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 1-1 vs. Milwaukee and 1-0 at Miami...they are 215-197 all-time in IL play, the eighth most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (246), New York-AL (246), Los Angeles-AL (235), Texas (224), Oakland (223), Detroit (217) and Chicago-AL (216). ₱ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in each of his last 19 starts in IL Play, hitting .301 (22-for-73) with seven doubles, four home runs,

12 RBI 10 walks, a .393 on-base percentage and a .955 OPS in that span.

Eddie Rosario is hitting .318 (49-for-154) with 12 doubles, 10 home runs and 24 RBI in his last 38 games vs. NL opponents.

Φ Jorge Polanco is hitting .341 (47-for-138) with a .920 OPS in 40 career games vs. NL teams.

TWINS-MARLINS: Twins and Marlins are playing each other for the 15th time in their history...the Twins are 8-6 against the Marlins, going 2-1 at the Metrodome, 2-1 at Dolphin Stadium, 1-2 at Marlins Park and 3-2 at Target Field.

DOUBLE-DIGIT WINS: José Berríos enters tonight with a record of 9-5...with a win he will join Jake Odorizzi (12-5) and Kyle Gibson (10-4) as the third Twins pitcher with double-digit win totals, which would mark the third time since 2010...the other seasons coming in 2017 (Ervin Santana - 16-8, Berrios - 14-8 and Gibson -12-10), and 2010 (Carl Pavano - 17-11, Francisco Liriano - 14-10, Kevin Slowey -13-6, Scott Baker - 12-9, Nick Blackburn - 10-12 and Brian Duensing - 10-3).

EXTRA! EXTRA!: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base in 60 straight games, dating back to May 20...it is tied for the ninth longest XBH hit-streak in club history...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009...it marks the fourth longest active streak in baseball, trailing Boston (108), Los Angeles-NL (62) and New York-NL (61)...for the season, the Twins rank first in baseball in extra-base hits with 436, ahead of Boston (420) and Colorado (402).

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Since returning to the lineup on July 25 (concussion-like symptoms), Byron Buxton is slashing .412/.389/.824 with four doubles, one home run, two RBI and five runs scored...the Twins are 52-24 when Buxton is in the lineup and 13-17 when he is not.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: in **1989**, the Twins traded the previous season's AL Cy Young Award winner, Frank Viola, to the Mets for five players, including pitchers Rick Aguilera, David West and minor leaguer Kevin Tapani...Viola became the first Cy Young Award winner to be traded during the following season...in **2018**, the Twins traded second baseman Brian Dozier to the Dodgers, in exchange for second baseman Logan Forsythe, outfielder Luke Raley and left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Making his fifth start on the road in his last six outings. Berrios dominated the Chicago White Sox at Guaranteed Rate Field last Thursday, spinning 7.0 innings of three-run ball (only 2 of those runs were earned) with eight strikeouts, his most since June 17 vs. Boston (10)...the toling 2 of thisse this were earliedy with eight strikeouts, in short since the plane 17 vs. buston (10)...treight-hander earned the win with his 15th quality start of the year (4th-best in AL), snapping a seven-start stretch without earning a victory, despite pitching to a 2.62 ERA (44.2 IP, 13 ER) in that span.

Berríos pitched a perfect first inning before Yoán Moncada connected for a solo shot to lead off the second inning...allowed another run in the fourth on three consecutive singles, and

- one more in the sixth as Moncada reached on an error, and later scored on a sacrifice fly
- ♣ José received 10 runs of support in the effort, surpassing the total he received in his entire seven-game winless streak (9), which was the second fewest runs of support among AL starters in that span (min. 5 starts, excluded openers).

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 2.94 ERA through 21 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019. 2017-

Berríos is tied for fourth in the American League (T-8th in MLB) with 15 quality starts, while 16 out of his 21 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including eight 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 92 career starts, Berríos has thrown 45 quality starts (48.9 percent).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old. Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the top young pitchers in Twins history...his 2.94 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 30 walks in 21 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an 8.15 SO/9 ratio (122 SO), and is on-pace to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with

a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).

© Kyle Gibson, Michael Pineda and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have SO/9 rates higher than 8.00...would become first quartet of Twins to do so in the same season.

INTERLEAGUE PLÉ: Berríos owns a lifetime line of 4-7, 3.80 ERA (66.1 IP, 28 ER) with 26 walks and this season, back on April 7 at Philadelphia, when he was the tough-luck loser, throwing 6.0 innings, allowing two runs on two hits (1 home run), as the Twins fell 2-1 to Zach Eflin.

He has limited NL hitters to a .207 average (50-for-241) with 10 home runs and an OPS of .677.

Is making his first career start against Miami...is 0-2 in two starts vs. NL East, also losing in

- his lone start in New York against the Mets on Sept. 16, 2016.

 It is a career .167 hitter (2-for-12) with hits on Sept. 16, 2016 at New York-NL and June 10, 2017 at San Francisco (both singles).

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 86.0 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.3) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.2), (min. 500 batted balls).

ኞ A large part of Berríos' success in 2019 has been the horizontal movement on his curveball, a pitch he has thrown 630 times this season...according to Baseball Savant, his hook breaks 17.2 inches across the plate (7.1 inches more than average), ranking him fourth in baseball (min
