BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Making his fifth start on the road in his last six outings, Berríos dominated the Chicago White Sox at Guaranteed Rate Field last Thursday, spinning 7.0 innings of three-run ball...

- Berríos pitched a perfect first inning before Yoán Moncada connected for a solo shot to lead off the second inning...allowed another run in the fourth on three consecutive singles, and one more in the sixth as Moncada reached on an error, and later scored on a sacrifice fly.
• José received 10 runs of support in the effort, surpassing the total he received in his entire seven-game winless streak (9), which was the second fewest runs of support among AL starters in that span (min. 5 starts, excluded openers).

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 2.94 ERA through 21 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019.

- Berríos is tied for fourth in the American League (T-8th in MLB) with 15 quality starts, while 16 out of his 21 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including eight 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 92 career starts, Berríos has thrown 45 quality starts (48.9 percent).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the top young pitchers in Twins history...his 2.94 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...

- Kyle Gibson, Michael Pineda and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have SO/9 rates higher than 8.00...would become first quartet of Twins to do so in the same season.

INTERLEAGUE PLÉ: Berríos owns a lifetime line of 4-7, 3.80 ERA (66.1 IP, 28 ER) with 26 walks and 63 strikeouts over 12 games (all starts) vs. the National League...has made just one Interleague start this season, back on April 7 at Philadelphia, when he was the tough-luck loser, throwing 6.0 innings, allowing two runs on two hits (1 home run), as the Twins fell 2-1 to Zach Eflin.

- He has limited NL hitters to a .207 average (50-for-241) with 10 home runs and an OPS of .677.
• Is making his first career start against Miami...is 0-2 in two starts vs. NL East, also losing in his lone start in New York against the Mets on Sept. 16, 2016.
• Is a career .167 hitter (2-for-12) with hits on Sept. 16, 2016 at New York-NL and June 10, 2017 at San Francisco (both singles).

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 86.0 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.3) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.2), (min. 500 batted balls).

- A large part of Berríos' success in 2019 has been the horizontal movement on his curveball, a pitch he has thrown 630 times this season...according to Baseball Savant, his hook breaks 17.2 inches across the plate (7.1 inches more than average), ranking him fourth in baseball (min. 250 curveballs thrown).

BERRÍOS FIRES SCORELESS INNING IN ASG: Berríos was selected to his second consecutive All-Star Game as he replaced the injured Jake Odorizzi...José was handed the ball in the third inning, and following a leadoff double to Arizona's Ketel Marte, he would shut down the next three batters: a strikeout of 2018 NL Rookie of the Year Ronald Acuña Jr., another of 2018 NL Most Valuable Player Christian Yelich and a fly out recorded by his brother-in-law Javier Báez.

- Berríos became the first Twin to pitch a scoreless inning in back-to-back All-Star Games since Joe Nathan in 2008-09.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP (SEASON- 7-5, 4.30 ERA + CAREER- 47-46, 4.08 ERA)

Pineda will take the ball tomorrow afternoon in the series finale here in Miami...is 3-2 with a 2.87 ERA (47.0 IP, 15 ER) over his last eight starts, with five ER coming on his start June 23 at KC...is making his fourth Interleague start this season, and has fared well so far in those matchups, going 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (17.0 IP, 6 ER) with a 14.00 SO/BB ratio in those starts...has not faced the Marlins since June 17, 2015 (his only start against them), but he did earn the win after throwing 6.2 innings of one-run ball (a Christian Yelich home run being the only hit he allowed)...has never pitched in Marlins Park, but is 2-0, 1.04 ERA (17.1 IP, 2 ER) in three career starts on the road in NL East ballparks...is 2-for-13 lifetime at the plate, with his last hit coming in 2017.

CAREER NOTES

- Teamed with Jake Odorizzi (11 Ks on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.
• Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).

STRIKEOUTS FOR GOOD: Berríos will donate \$50 per strikeout in 2019 to Fundación CAP...Fundación CAP is a non-profit organization that since 1989 has been working for children with cancer at Hospital Pediátrico, the leading public pediatric hospital in Puerto Rico and the only one that treats certain types of cancer...the mission of CAP is to ensure that all children with cancer, regardless of their financial resources, have access to first-rate cancer treatment in Puerto Rico, close to their family and home...entering today's start, Berríos is set to donate \$6,100.

HISTORY MADE: In his start July 14, Berríos eclipsed the 500 strikeout threshold by setting down Jake Bauers to end the fifth inning, and his outing...the start was his 91st career game, meaning he became the first pitcher in Senators/Twins history to reach 500 strikeouts in 91 career games or fewer, passing Bert Blyleven who accomplished the feat in 92 games.

- He also became the eighth Twin to do so at 25 years old-or-younger, first since Johan Santana in 2004.
