LAST TIME OUT: Berríos was handed his fourth loss of the year as the Twins fell to the White Sox to begin this roadtrip in Chicago on Friday, after allowing six runs (three earned) over 7.1 innings pitched in a 6-4 Twins loss...was asked to give the Twins depth as they were coming off an 18-inning, 10-pitcher slog the day prior against the Rays, and he gave them 105 pitches and only needed Mike Morin (threw three pitches for final two outs of the eighth) to close the game out.

BERRÍOS JOINS POLO, ODO IN ASG: Yesterday, it was announced that José Berríos will be joining teammates Jorge Polanco and Jake Odorizzi at the 2019 MLB All-Star Game in Cleveland on July 9... marks the second time since 2010 the Twins have had three representatives at the Midsummer Classic, (2007, Kintzler, Sanó, Santana)...also marks the fifth time in Twins history that they have had two starting pitchers named to the team, ioining Johan Santana & Francisco Liriano (2006). Eric Milton & Joe Mays (2001), Jack Morris & Scott Erickson (1991) and Camilo Pascual & Jim Kaat (1962).

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 2.89 ERA through 17 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019. 2017-18 - 58 GAMES 2019-17 GAMES

Berríos is tied for second in Major League Baseball behind Max Scherzer (15) with 14 quality starts, while 15 out of his 17 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including seven 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 88 career starts, Berríos has an even 44 quality starts (50 percent).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the great young pitchers in Twins history...his 2.89 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 20 walks in 17 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits with an 8.20 SO/9 ratio (102 SO), and is looking to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).

Note: Kyle Gibson and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have SO/9 rates higher than 8.00, would become first trio of Twins to do so in the same season.

 Sits at 492 career strikeouts...if he throws eight today, would become first pitcher in Senators/Twins history to record 500 strikeouts in 90 career games (fastest: Bert Blyleven in 92 games, struck out Oakland's Mike Hegan on August 4, 1972 at The Met for 500th)...will also become the eighth Twin to do so at 25-or-younger, first since Johan Santana in 2004.

GOIN' GOIN', BACK BACK, TO CALI CALI: Berríos comes into today's start having faced Oakland just twice in his career, both last season...didn't fare too well against the A's, who eventually played in twice in his career, both last season...doin t fare too wen against the As, who eventually played in the AL Wild Card Game, as he went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (10.2 IP, 8 ER), including a no-decision on Sept. 21 here at the Coliseum in a start that he tossed 5.2 innings, allowing five runs on four hits and three walks with eight strikeouts in an eventual 7-6 Twins loss...has made at least one start in all five California stadiums (Angel Stadium, Dodger Stadium, Petco Park, Oracle Park and Oakland Coliseum)...in six starts in California, is 2-3 with a 5.13 ERA (33.1 IP, 19 ER) with an opponents' average of .286 (32-for-112) and 12 walks.

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact off the bat of his opponents for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 66.0 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.0) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.4), (min. 500 batted balls).
