| Last 20 games. | .10-10 | at the Coliseum by a score of 7-2, making them just 2-5 in their last seven games this season...All-Star Jose Berrios (8-5) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 11 hits, three from Nelson Cruz...the Twins went 1 -for-11 with runners in scoring position and left 11 men on base.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have placed right-handed pitcher Blake Parker on the Paternity List... Parker has appeared in 32 games, going 1-2 with a 3.77 ERA ( $31.0 \mathrm{IP}, 13 \mathrm{ER}$ ), 13 walks, 29 strikeouts and 10 saves...to replace Parker on the 25 -man roster, the Twins have recalled right-handed pitcher Kohi Stewart from Triple-A Rochester... Stewart, who recently appeared in two games for the Red Wings, made three appearances (2 starts) this season for the Twins, going $1-1$ with a 4.50 ERA ( $16.0 \mathrm{IP}, 8 \mathrm{ER}$ ), five walks and four strikeouts...this will be Stewart's fourth stint with Minnesota this season.

玉 The Twins own a team . 493 slugging percentage, which ranks sixth-best in baseball history pre-All Star break, trailing New York-AL (. 511 in 1936), Seattle (. 503 in 1996), Houston (. 500 in 2017), San Francisco (. 496 in 2000) and Boston (. 493 in 2003).

Field from June 22-24 and 1-2 at Globe Life Park from August 31-September 2...Twins are just 4-7 in their last 11 vs. the Rangers. $\Phi$ Byron Buxton has reached safely in each of his last 10 games with an at-bat vs. the Rangers, hitting 313 ( 10 -for- 32 ) with a .436 on-base percentage in that span.
$\Phi$ C.J. Cron is hitting . 299 ( 69 -for- 231 ) with 13 doubles, three triples, eight home runs, $45 \mathrm{RBI}, 12$ walks and a .827 OPS in 65 career games vs. Texas...the hits, doubles, triples, and RBI are all his personal most vs. any opponent.
玉 Nelson Cruz played for the Rangers from 2006-13, hitting . 268 ( 773 -for- 2886 ) with 170 doubles, 157 home runs and 489 RBI in 796 games...he still ranks eighth on the Rangers all-time list in home runs... he is hitting .307 ( 90 -for-293) with 16 doubles, 21 home runs, 50 RBI and a .976 OPS in 77 career games vs. his former team
$\Phi$ Miguel Sanó is hitting . 344 (22-for-64) with three doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.059 OPS in 17 career games vs. Texas. $\Phi$ Jonathan Schoop enters tonight with a nine-game hitting streak vs. Texas, hitting . 417 (15-for-36) with 13 RBI in that span.
GATES ARE OPEN: The Twins have sold out six games this season: Opening Day March 28 vs. Cleveland (39,519), May 25 vs. Chicago-AL (39,139), May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (39,913), June 14 vs. Kansas City ( 38,898 ), Jun 15 vs. Kansas City ( 39,267 ), and June 16 vs. Kansas City $(38,886)$...the last $40,000+$ attendance was Opening Day of $2016(40,638)$...Twins have sold out 167 regular season games at Target Field in 767 openings since 2010.
$\Phi$ Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 996,615 this season, trailing New York (1,789,422), Los Angeles $(1,595,139)$, Houston ( $1,491,294$ ), Boston ( $1,484,036$ ) and Texas ( $1,223,189$ )...through games of May 9 , the Twins had the third lowest attendance in the AL at 269,493 , averaging 16,843 per date.
\#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have 161 home runs on the season, the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (155), despite playing seventh fewest games in baseball ( 86 )...they now have a plus +57 home run differential, which also leads baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL $(+41)$, then Oakland $(+40) \ldots$ the Twins have scored a total of 486 runs this season, 247 of those runs have be produced via home run and 239 of those have been manufactured.

FELIZ CUMPLEAÑOS!: All-Star Jorge Polanco is celebrating his 26th birthday today.... he has played two career games on his birthday, first in 2017 vs. Los Angeles-AL, going 0 -for-3 with a walk, then in 2018, going 1 -for-3 with a double and a walk....he shares a birthday with former Twin Jesse Crain (38) and Angels star Shohei Ohtani (25).

LAST START: Pérez did not factor into the decision on June 27 vs. Tampa Bay despite throwing 7.0 innings of three-hit ball with two earned runs, one walk and six strikeouts...pitched around a one-out single in the first inning before surrendering two runs in the second inning, losing a 2-0, first-inning lead given by the offense...he sat down his final 16 batters of the game, marking his sixth quality start of the season...the outing was also his longest start since May 6 at Toronto when he threw 7.0 -scoreless innings in a Twins $8-0$ win.

- The 16 consecutive batters were the most by a Twins pitcher since Jake Odorizzi retired 20 straight Tigers back on May 10 at Target Field.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS: Allowed 16 earned runs in the month of June over five starts after allowing 12 in May over six starts and 13 in six March/April appearances...he remains winless in his last six starts, in which he's $0-2$ with a 6.39 ERA ( $31.0 \mathrm{IP}, 22 \mathrm{ER}$ ), after starting 7-1, 2.95 ERA (58.0 IP, 19 ER).

STILL UP IN THE RANKS: Since joining the rotation on April 15, Pérez still ranks tied for 14th in the AL with six wins (T-28th in the majors) and is 17th in the AL in ERA (3.79).

QUALITY QUARTET: Pérez has won seven games this season (six as a starter)...with a win today, Pérez, Jake Odorizzi (10), Kyle Gibson (8) and José Berríos (8) would become the first Twins quarter ever to have eight wins apiece through 87 team games...they would become the first quarter of Twins to reach eight wins in a season since 2015 (Gibson, Phil Hughes, Trevor May and Tommy Milone.

TEXAS FOREVER: Pérez is making his first career start against his former Texas Rangers tonight...he signed as an undrafted free agent 12 years ago last Tuesday (7/2/2007) and made his Major League debut on June 27, 2012 at the age of 21...over seven seasons he compiled a 43-49 record with the Rangers, including a 4.58 ERA and 544 strikeouts in 761.1 IP.

- His 128 starts rank fourth all-time among Texas left-handers, while his 761.1 IP rank fifth, his 43 wins are tied for fifth with Jon Matlack and his 426 strikeouts rank seventh. - Led 2017 Rangers' staff in wins (career-high 13), starts (32), and innings (185.0)... also established a career-high in strikeouts (115), second on club (Darvish-148).
- In 2013, he finished sixth in the American League Rookie of the Year Award voting after compiling a 10-6 record and 3.62 ERA.
- In 2009, Named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (114.2 IP, 37 ER ) with one save and 119 strikeouts in $27 \mathrm{G} / 19 \mathrm{GS}$.

I'M COMIN' HOME, AGAIN: Pérez is making back-to-back home starts for just the third time this season...since the beginning of 2015, he is $24-14$ with a 4.28 ERA (342.2 IP, 163 ER ) in 61 games ( 57 starts) played on his home turf...Pérez is 3-2, 3.42 ERA (47.1 IP, 18 ER) with 14 walks and 49 strikeouts in eight games ( 7 starts) at home this year... on the road, he is $4-1$ with a 4.97 ERA ( $41.2 \mathrm{IP}, 23 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 24 walks and 33 strikeouts in nine games ( 7 starts)....over his career he owns a lifetime record of $30-22$ with a 4.24 ERA in 83 home games ( 75 starts), as opposed to 20-30 with a 4.97 ERA over 75 road games ( 67 starts).

ORGULLO VENEZOLANO: Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclena, daughter, Malena, and newborn son, Martín, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500.0 IP) in starts (142), sixth in wins (50) and innings pitched (850.1), while at sitting eighth in strikeouts (544).

STATCAST FUN: Pérez has seen many positive changes in his performance on the mound this year compared to his 2018 season... his four-seamer has seen a 1.6 mph increase as referenced by his 92.8 average velocity from last year, to a 94.4 average this year....his whiff percentage on his changeup has increased $3.4 \%$, going from $30.2 \%$ last year, to $33.6 \%$ this year.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON: 5-4, 4.78 ERA ; CAREER: 45-45, 4.13 ERA]

Pineda will be on the bump tomorrow afternoon making his 17 th start of the season and his first against the Texas Rangers...in his last start on June 29 at Chicago-AL, Pineda earned his fifth win of the season after throwing six innings of one-run, four-hit ball with one walk and a season-high-tying eight strikeouts...marked his 44th consecutive start dating back to July 31, 2016 without allowing three or more walks...tomorrow marks his seventh career start against the Rangers, he owns an 0-4 record with a 5.66 ERA ( 35.0 IP, 22 ER) with eight walks and 37 strikeouts....hasn't faced TEX since June 25,2017 , where he received a loss after allowing seven runs on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts over 4.0 innings pitched.
