THE TWINS: After completing their six-game, seven-day roadtrip with a record of 2-4 (1-2 in Chicago-AL and 1-2 in Oakland), the Twins began their short three-game homestand with wrap the "first half" of the season tomorrow afternoon the Twins are 27-14 at home this season, winning 14 of their last 20 at Target Field.

FIREWORKS NIGHT AT TARGET FIELD: The Twins beat the Rangers last night by a score of 15-6...Martín Pérez (8-3) was the starter and winner, allowing four runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 20 hits as each starter in the lineup recorded one hit and at least eight starters had multiple hits.
〒 13 extra-base hits tied a Twins single-game record set earlier this season in game two of a doubleheader on April 20 at Baltimore.
$\Phi 20$ hits marked a season-high, their most since June 13,2017 vs. Seattle when they set a club-record with 28...marked the 57th time in club history for the Twins to reach 20 hits in a game.
$\Phi$ Nine doubles tied for the most in Senators/Twins history (since 1901), tying the Senators' nine back on June 9, 1934 at Boston.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have placed first baseman C.J. Cron on the 10-day Injured List with right thumb inflammation...Cron has played in 78 games for the Twins, hitting . 266 ( 80 -for-301) with 18 doubles, 17 home runs, 54 RBI and a .821 OPS...to replace Cron on the 25 -man roster, the Twins have recalled outfielder LaMonte Wade Jr. from Triple-A Rochester...Wade Jr., who was optioned to Rochester last Saturday after appearing in one game for the Twins, has hit . 246 ( 65 -for-264) with 12 doubles and five home runs in 77 games with the Red Wings this season.
TWINS AND TEXAS: The Twins went 2-4 against the Rangers last season, going 1-2 at Target Field from June 22-24 and 1-2 at Globe Life Park from August 31-September 2...the Twins will travel to Texas for four from August 15-18.
© Byron Buxton has reached safely in each of his last 11 games with an at-bat vs. the Rangers, hitting .333 (11-for-33) with a .450 on-base percentage in that span.
$\Phi$ Miguel Sanó is hitting . 343 (23-for-67) with three doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.042 OPS in 18 career games vs. Texas.
$\Phi$ Jonathan Schoop enters today with a 10 -game hitting streak vs. Texas, hitting. 439 ( 18 -for-41) with four homers and 17 RBI in that span.
CRUZIN': Since leaving the Rangers after the 2013 season, Nelson Cruz is slashing .307/.392/.584 in 77 games against his former team. his 21 home runs against Texas in that span rank fourth in MLB, behind only Khris Davis (29), George Springer (24), and Mike Trout (24)

In Cruz's last 22 games overall this season, he is hitting . 330 ( 29 -for-88) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 22 RBI, 12 walks,
a .416 on-base percentage and a 1.064 OPS.
GATES ARE OPEN: The Twins have sold out seven games this season: Opening Day March 28 vs. Cleveland (39,519), May 25 vs. Chi-cago-AL (39,139), May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (39,913), June 14 vs. Kansas City ( 38,898 ), June 15 vs. Kansas City (39,267), June 16 vs. Kansas City ( 38,886 ) and last night vs. the Rangers ( 38,073 )...the last $40,000+$ attendance was 0 pening Day of 2016 ( 40,638 )...Twins have sold out 168 regular season games at Target Field in 768 openings since 2010 ...Twins surpassed the 1 -million mark in attendance last night - one of six AL teams.
\#BOMBASQUAD: Last night the Twins reached 165 home runs for the season, marking a new Major League Baseball Pre-ASG record, surpassing the Yankees mark of 161, done in 2018... 165 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (156)...they had 166 home runs all of last season...they now have a plus +59 home run differential, which also leads baseball...the Twins have scored a total of 501 runs this season, 253 of those runs have be produced via home run and 248 of those have been manufactured.
ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2014, Glen Perkins and Kurt Suzuki were named to the American League All-Star team as they combined to pitch/catch the ninth inning and secure the 5-3 AL victory at Target Field.... in 2007, Ron Gardenhire earned his 500 th career managerial victory with a 20-14 win at Chicago-AL; Torii Hunter had three hits in that game and Joe Mauer had four.

- He is making his 17 th start of the season.

LAST START: Pineda earned his fifth win of the season and his first since May 21 last Saturday at Chicago-AL...he allowed just one run on four hits with one walk and eight strikeouts, which tied a season high, over 6.0 innings pitched...gave up his only run in the bottom of the first inning with a Jon Jay sacrifice fly that scored Leury García who reached on a single and was then moved over to third on a Yoán Moncada single and a José Abreu walk....wouldn't allow a hit until Yolmer Sánchez hit a triple to right field in the fourth inning then gave up a double to Jay before finishing the sixth inning with a strikeout to Eloy Jiménez.

- Has only given up one triple this season and just 16 over his career...since 2011, among
pitchers with at least 765.0 IP, Pineda is tied for 20th in the American League and tied
17th among actives for fewest triples allowed.
WALK HARD: Through 16 starts, Pineda has only issued 15 walks in 86.2 innings, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for third fewest in all of baseball among starters with at least 85.0 innings pitched...owns 762 career strikeouts, 172 walks and a lifetime SO/BB ratio of 4.43...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 44 starts...since 2016, is one of nine starters with an active streak of $40+$ starts with three-or-less walks in each, (full list below).

Y'ALL SAID TEXAS?: Pineda is making his seventh career start against the Rangers and his first since 2017...he is 0-4, 5.66 ERA ( $35.0 \mathrm{IP}, 22 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with eight walks and 37 strikeouts over his six career starts....he made his Major League debut against Texas April 5, 2011 at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington, when he tossed 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts as a member of the Seattle Mariners; received he loss as the Mariners lost 3-2....his last time out against the Rangers came June 25, 2017, when he was handed the loss after throwing 4.0 innings, surrendering seven runs (all earned) on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

- Is 2-1, 4.97 ERA (29.0 IP, 16 ER) with seven walks and 19 strikeouts while holding batters to a .250 average over five starts against AL West opponents this season... however, over 31 career starts vs. AL West teams, Pineda is 11-11, 4.74 ERA (184 IP, 97 ER) with 43 walks and 167 strikeouts and hold batters to a 253 average.

MORE WALK TALK: Pineda is tied for the third fewest in the all of baseball with 15 free passes this season, and the fewest in the American League among starters with at least 15 starts...his walks allowed per nine innings rate is 1.56 , which ranks seventh-best in the majors among qualified starters and is third in the American League (behind Mike Leake-1.33 and Carlos Carrasco-1.52)...has six starts without walking a batter this season and six with walking just one.

HAVE A DAY: Over 51 career day starts, Pineda has struck out 323 batters which ranks 17th-best among active pitchers in the AL since 2011 with at least 50 starts....among the top 25 pitchers in that category, Pineda has the least innings pitched (284.2).

## CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched. - Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August. - Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16 -year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
