TWINS WIN SERIES OVER FISH: The Twins beat the Marlins last night by a score of 7-4, winning their 20th series (20-10-5)...José Berríos (10-5) was the starter and winner, pitching $7: 0$ shutout innings with two hits allowed, no walks and 11 strikeouts...the offense collected eight hits and walked six times...Max Kepler reached four times with one hit and three walks... Mitch Garver and Eddie Rosario each recorded two hits...Kepler hit his 29th home run, Rosario hit his 23rd and Garver hit his 20th.

SAM I AM: The Twins announced yesterday that they have acquired right-handed pitcher Sam Dyson from the San Francisco Giants in exchange for outfielder Jaylin Davis and right-handed pitchers Prelander Berroa and Kai-Wei Teng.
क Dyson, 31, has appeared in 49 games for the Giants this season, going 4-1 with a 2.47 ERA (51.0 IP, 14 ER), two saves, 17 holds seven walks, 47 strikeouts, a WHP of 0.90 and an opponent batting average of .213...Dyson has appeared in 36 '4 career major league games in parts of eight seasons with Toronto, Miami, Texas and San Francisco, going 23-23 with a 3.29 ERA ( 375.1 IP, 137 ER), 59 saves, 123 walks and 302 strikeouts
क Dyson was originally drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the fourth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina...the Tampa, Florida native has appeared in at least 70 games in three of the last four seasons, entering 2019...he has appeared in 326 games since the start of 2015 , tied for third most in baseball.

TRADING PLACES: After trading for right-handed pitchers Sam Dyson and Sergio Romo in the last five days, the Twins have acquired two relievers that have combined for a 2.94 ERA ( 88.2 IP, 29 FR) this season with 19 saves ( 21 opportunifies), 18 holds, a 103 WHIP 20 walks, 81 strikeouts and a . 221 batting average against (this excludes Romo's appearance on Tuesday night with Minnesota)...they have combined for 1,064 career major league games.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twịns have gone 5-6 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 1-1 vs. Milwaukee and 2-0 at Miami
$\mp$ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in each of his last 20 starts in IL Play, hitting 293 (22-for-75) with seven doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, 12 walks, a .398 on-base percentage and a .944 OPS in that span.
$\Phi$ Twins and Marlins are playing each other for the 16 th time in their history...the Twins are 9-6 against the Marlins, going 2-1 at the Metrodome, 2-1 at Dolphin Stadium, 2-2 at Marlins Park and 3-2 at Target Field.

EXTRA! EXTRA!: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base in 61 straight games, dating back to May 20...it is the ninth longest XBH hit-streak in club history...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009.

SWEEPS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their eighth sweep of an opponent this season...their previous seven sweeps came: three games May 24-26 vs. Chicago-AL, three games May 20-22 at Los Angeles-AL, three games May 6-8 at Toronto, three games April 26-28 vs May
Baltimore, three games at Baltimore April 20-21, two games April 13-14 vs. Detroit, and two games April 2-3 at Kansas City...Twins recorded seven sweeps all of last season...Twins are $7-6$ this season when attempting to secure a sweep.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1985, the Twins acquired Bert Blyleven from the Indians, in exchange for outfielder Jim Weaver, pitcher Curt Wardle and shortstop Jay Bell...in 1986 vs. Oakland, Blyleven became the third pitcher to join the 3,000 strikeout club panning Mike Davis in the fifth inning; he finished that game with 15 strikeouts - which tied the Twins single-game record and was tanning
eventually broken by Johan Santana, who struck out 17 Rangers on August 18, 2007...in that same game, Kirby Puckett hit for the cycle, the seventh cycle in Twins history (11 now)

HOF WEEKEND: This weekend the Twins will celebrate Hall of Fame Weekend, as former reliever Joe Nathan (Saturday) and former club President Jerry Bell (Sunday) will become the club's 32nd and 33rd members of the Twins Hall of Fame...first 10,000 fans in attendance on Saturday will receive a Joe Nathan bobblehead and the first 5,000 on Sunday will receive commemorative pin honoring both men.

LAST START: Pineda earned his seventh win of the season in his last start on Friday against the White Sox after allowing two runs on six hits (1 home run) over 7.0 innings pitched... marked his longest outing since May 16 at Seattle....his two runs came in the third inning on a two-run homer from Adam Engel that scored Yolmer Sánchez who reached on a single to right field...allowed just two hits over his final 18 batters, following the homer.

PINEDA PUTTING IN WORK: Pineda is $3-2$, with a 2.87 ERA ( 47.0 IP, 15 ER) over his last eight starts, as he ranks fifth in the AL for ERA since June 13...the Twins have went 6-2 over that stretch (Pineda is 3-2)...he has allowed 40 hits, with 11 walks, 47 strikeouts and an opponents' slash line of .231/.278/.353.

- Pineda has now limited teams to three earned runs-or-less in 13 of his last 14 starts,
dating back to May 5 at New York-AL....he owns a 3.62 ERA ( $82.01 \mathrm{IP}, 33 \mathrm{ER}$ ) while striking out 78 batters over that stretch (Twins are 9-5), with nine quality starts.

A DEEPER LOOK AT TIMES THROUGH THE LINEUP: Pineda has been the epitome of a "fast-starter" this season, as he boasts a 2.20 ERA ( $45.0 \mathrm{IP}, 11 \mathrm{ER}$ ) while he weaves through a given lineup for the first time in a game, with a BAA of .235 (39-for-166) with just nine XBH...however, those numbers spike the second time through, as his ERA balloons to 5.31 ( $42.1 \mathrm{IP}, 25 \mathrm{ER}$ ) and his opponents' average jumps to 247 the second time through...when he makes it to a third tour, his ERA rests at 6.46 (23.2 IP, 17 ER) with 12 extra-base hits and a BAA of . 313 (31-for-99).

WALK TALK: Pineda ranks sixth in all of baseball with 22 free passes this season, and is ranked second fewest in the American League among starters with at least 20 starts (excludes openers)...his walks-per-nine innings rate is 1.78 , which ranks eighth-best in the majors among qualified starters and is second in the American League behind Mike Leake (1.25) who was traded to Arizona yesterday...has seven starts without walking a batter this season and eight with walking just one.

- Michael also averages one walk per 0.48 batters he faces, the tied for the seventh-lowest in baseball (2nd-best in the AL, behind Leake), while his 4.55 strikeout-to-walk rate sits 18 th ( 8 th in the AL).

VIVA MIAMI: He is making just his second career start this afternoon against Miami and his first here at Marlins Park....he last faced them on June 17, 2015 where he was the starter and winner after throwing 6.2 innings of one-hit ball allowing just one run with two walks and nine strikeouts as a member of the Yankees.

- Over his career, Pineda has fared well against Interleague Opponents, posting a 8-4 record with a 2.99 ERA ( $99.1 \mathrm{ER}, 33 \mathrm{ER}$ ) over 17 games (all starts)....in three starts this season vs. IL opponents, he is 1-1, 3.18 ERA, ( $17.0 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with just one walk and 14 strikeouts.

BATTER UPI: Pineda has spent his entire career playing in the American League (2011 w/ SEA, 2012-2017 w/NYY), but has pitched against National League opponents a total of 17 times....with a bat in-hand, Pineda is 2-for-13 (.154) with a sacrifice...went 0-for-2 in his last at-bats on April 6 against the Phillies.... is last hit (a single to left field) came on May 5, 2017 at Chicago-NL off Kyle Hendriks.

## CAREER NDTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched. - Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August. - Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA ( 113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of 198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16 -year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
