THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-1 over their seven-game, eight-day roadtrip, taking three of four in Chicago over the White Sox last weekend, followed by consecutive wins in Miami...the Twins will conclude the trip with the third of three in Miami this afternoon...post-game today they will travel home to begin a 10-game homestand with three vs. Kansas City, three vs. Atlanta and four vs. Cleveland...the Twins have matched their season high at 25 games over .500 at 66-41 (also 52-27 and 58-33).

TWINS WIN SERIES OVER FISH: The Twins beat the Marlins last night by a score of 7-4, winning their 20th series (20-10-5)...José Berríos (10-5) was the starter and winner, pitching 7.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, no walks and 11 strikeouts...the offense collected eight hits and walked six times...Max Kepler reached four times with one hit and three walks...Mitch Garver and Eddie Rosario each recorded two hits...Kepler hit his 29th home run, Rosario hit his 23rd and Garver hit his 20th.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 209 home runs are the most in baseball...209 homers are already the third most in club history...they need just 16 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...with three home runs last night, the Twins hit 52 in July...it marked their third straight month with 50-plus homers...the first team in MLB history to have three-straight months with 50-plus homers (56 in May & 51 in June).

**Needs one more home run for 30

SAM I AM: The Twins announced yesterday that they have acquired right-handed pitcher Sam Dyson from the San Francisco Giants in exchange for outfielder Jaylin Davis and right-handed pitchers Prelander Berroa and Kai-Wei Teng.

☞ Dyson, 31, has appeared in 49 games for the Giants this season, going 4-1 with a 2.47 ERA (51.0 IP, 14 ER), two saves, 17 holds, seven walks, 47 strikeouts, a WHIP of 0.90 and an opponent batting average of .213...Dyson has appeared in 364 career major league games in parts of eight seasons with Toronto, Miami, Texas and San Francisco, going 23-23 with a 3.29 ERA (375.1 IP, 137 ER), 59 saves, 123 walks and 302 strikeouts.

☞ Dyson was originally drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the fourth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina...the Tampa, Florida native has appeared in at least 70 games in three of the last four seasons, entering 2019...he has appeared in 326 games since the start of 2015, tied for third most in baseball.

TRADING PLACES: After trading for right-handed pitchers Sam Dyson and Sergio Romo in the last five days, the Twins have acquired two relievers that have combined for a 2.94 ERA (88.2 IP, 29 ER) this season with 19 saves (21 opportunities), 18 holds, a 1.03 WHIP, 20 walks, 81 strikeouts and a .221 batting average against (this excludes Romo's appearance on Tuesday night with Minnesota)...they have combined for 1,064 career major league games.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 5-6 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 1-1 vs. Milwaukee and 2-0 at Miami.

☞ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in each of his last 20 starts in IL Play, hitting .293 (22-for-75) with seven doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, 12 walks, a .398 on-base percentage and a .944 OPS in that span.

☞ Twins and Marlins are playing each other for the 16th time in their history...the Twins are 9-6 against the Marlins, going 2-1 at the Metrodome, 2-1 at Dolphin Stadium, 2-2 at Marlins Park and 3-2 at Target Field.

EXTRA! EXTRA!: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base in 61 straight games, dating back to May 20...it is the ninth longest XBH hit-streak in club history...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009.

SWEEPS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their eighth sweep of an opponent this season...their previous seven sweeps came: three games May 24-26 vs. Chicago-AL, three games May 20-22 at Los Angeles-AL, three games May 6-8 at Toronto, three games April 26-28 vs. Baltimore, three games at Baltimore April 20-21, two games April 13-14 vs. Detroit, and two games April 2-3 at Kansas City...Twins recorded seven sweeps all of last season...Twins are 7-6 this season when attempting to secure a sweep.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1985, the Twins acquired Bert Blyleven from the Indians, in exchange for outfielder Jim Weaver, pitcher Curt Wardle and shortstop Jay Bell...in 1986 vs. Oakland, Blyleven became the third pitcher to join the 3,000 strikeout club, fanning Mike Davis in the fifth inning; he finished that game with 15 strikeouts - which tied the Twins single-game record and was eventually broken by Johan Santana, who struck out 17 Rangers on August 18, 2007...in that same game, Kirby Puckett hit for the cycle, the seventh cycle in Twins history (11 now).

HOF WEEKEND: This weekend the Twins will celebrate Hall of Fame Weekend, as former reliever Joe Nathan (Saturday) and former club President Jerry Bell (Sunday) will become the club's 32nd and 33rd members of the Twins Hall of Fame...first 10,000 fans in attendance on Saturday will receive a Joe Nathan bobblehead and the first 5,000 on Sunday will receive commemorative pin honoring both men.

WALK TALK: Pineda ranks sixth in all of baseball with 22 free passes this season, and is ranked second fewest in the American League among starters with at least 20 starts (excludes openers)...

- Michael also averages one walk per 0.48 batters he faces, the tied for the seventh-lowest in baseball (2nd-best in the AL, behind Leake)...

VIVA MIAMI: He is making just his second career start this afternoon against Miami and his first here at Marlins Park...he last faced them on June 17, 2015 where he was the starter and winner after throwing 6.2 innings of one-hit ball...

- Over his career, Pineda has fared well against Interleague Opponents, posting a 8-4 record with a 2.99 ERA (99.1 ER, 33 ER) over 17 games (all starts)...
