**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 4-4 on their current homestand, sweeping the Royals in three games over the weekend, losing two of three to the Braves, followed by consecutive losses to the Indians the last two nights...tonight the Twins will continue their season-long 10-game homestand with the third of four against the Indians through tomorrow...following tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to Milwaukee for an off-day, followed by two vs. the Brewers Tuesday-Wednesday, then four against the Rangers from Thursday-Sunday. ☞ Twins have lost a season-high four straight, looking to avoid losing five straight for the first time since September 1-5, 2018 (also 5).

**TRIBE TAKE ANOTHER FROM TWINS:** The Twins lost to the Indians last night by a score of 6-2...Devin Smeltzer (1-2) was the starter and loser, allowing six runs on seven hits in 4.1 innings pitched, holding the Indians to one run through his first four...Randy Dobnak made his major league debut with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief, six hits, no walks and three strikeouts...the offense recorded eight hits, two from both Jorge Polanco and Jake Cave...the attendance was 36,641, their 12th highest attendance total this season.

**TWINS-TRIBE:** The Twins are playing the Indians for the 12th of 19 scheduled meetings this season...Twins are 5-6 vs. the Indians this season...including tonight's game, they play each other eight more times this season, three at Progressive Field and five at Target Field. ☞ Max Kepler has five home runs and eight RBI in 11 games against CLE this season...five homers lead baseball vs. CLE...his 13 career homers vs. CLE are his most (next CWS & BAL - 9). ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .317 (90-for-284) with 13 doubles, four triples, 17 home runs, 38 RBI and a .922 OPS in 75 career games vs. Cleveland.

**NOTE:** Twins have spent 125 days in first place (or a share) of the AL Central...only Los Angeles-NL has spent more days leading their division this season (129 days)...until last night, they spent 104 consecutive days in sole possession of first in the division.

**SOUND THE BOMBA HORN:** The Twins 226 home runs are the most in baseball, 18 more than second-place New York-AL (208)...they set the club record last night for home runs in a single season...they need 41 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 315 with 46 games remaining...below are the club top five home run totals (since 1961):

**ALL A-RRAEZ:** In 39 games since June 18, Luis Arraez ranks first among American League rookies in hits (50), second in batting average (.340) and on-base percentage (.409), third in OPS (.817), fourth in runs (24), and tied for fourth in walks (16)...his batting average among all players in club history (since 1961) through 50 games, ranks fifth best:

**SAUCE ON THE SIDE:** Mitch Garver has hit 21 home runs this season, all at catcher, the most for at the position in all of baseball, ahead of Willson Contreras (19)...21 homers as catcher rank third most in club history, trailing Earl Battey's 26 in 1963 and Joe Mauer's 23 in 2009 (Mauer totaled 28 in MVP season)...Garver's .658 SLG is the best in club history for a catcher. ☞ Among all players in baseball with a minimum of 200 plate appearances, he ranks fifth in slugging percentage (.616), trailing Yelich (.705), Trout (.668), Bellinger (.659) and Cruz (.650).

**A TALE OF TWO MIGGYS:** Miguel Sanó is hitting .297 (35-for-118) with seven doubles, one triple, 11 home runs, 31 RBI, 21 walks, 25 runs scored, a .407 OBP/.653 SLG/1.060 OPS in his last 36 games since June 28...prior to that date, he was hitting .195 (23-for-118) with a .278 OBP/.483 SLG/.761 OPS in 31 games to begin the season.

**MAD MAX:** Max Kepler has hit eight home runs in his last 18 games...29 of his 31 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, three players in baseball reached 30 homers from the leadoff spot last season: Francisco Lindor (37), Mookie Betts (32) and Matt Carpenter (30)...the club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Brian Dozier in 2017 (Kepler already second).

**BRING 'EM OUT, BRING 'EM OUT!:** Twins rank fifth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,671,774 this season, trailing New York (2,454,278), Boston (2,196,170), Los Angeles (2,127,840) and Houston (2,050,387)...they have drawn 30,000+ in 25 of their last 30 home games for a total of 1,004,598 in that span (33,486 avg)...the Twins have sold out 169 regular season games at Target Field since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and eight in 2019.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1971, Harmon Killebrew hit his 500th and 501st career home runs against Baltimore at Met Stadium...in 1994, Kirby Puckett drives in seven runs as the Twins defeat the Red Sox by a score of 17-7...Glenn Adams and Randy Bush hold the club record, each with eight.

**BRIEFLY:** Twins have acquired outfielder Ian Miller from the Mariners in exchange for cash considerations...Miller has played in 106 games for Triple-A Tacoma this season, hitting .269 (105-for-390) with 27 doubles, 11 home runs, 54 RBI and 29 stolen bases.

**DANDY DOZEN:** Odorizzi has set a career high with 12 wins (12-5 in 21 starts), surpassing his 11 victories for Tampa Bay in 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts)...the first-time All-Star is tied for sixth in the AL in wins...is 1.1-inning shy of qualifying for additional leaderboards; otherwise, he would rank 11th in the AL in opponents' batting average (.229, 97-for-424), 10th in strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (career-best 9.42, 120 SO in 114.2 IP), 11th in opponents' OPS (.681), 12th in FIP (3.95), T-12th in WHIP (1.19) and 12th in ERA (3.61; 114.2 IP, 46 ER).

☞ Odo, along with rotation-mates Kyle Gibson (11-5) and José Berríos (10-6), have given the Twins three 10-game winners for just the third time this decade (6 in 2010 and 3 in 2017).

**THAT'S MORE LIKE IT:** Jake's last two starts -- both Twins wins -- have harkened back to his All-Star form, as he is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (11.2 IP, 2 ER), four walks, 12 strikeouts and a .205/.271/.318 opponents' slash line (9-for-44 with 1 home run).

☞ Last pitched Monday vs. Atlanta, holding the Braves to one run (a solo homer by Freddie Freeman) on five hits over 6.0 innings, while he struck out seven and walked three...departed with a 3-1 lead; after Atlanta tied it in the seventh, the Twins won on Miguel Sanó's pinch-hit, two-out, two-run walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth.

**THE TWO JAKES:** Odorizzi is looking to craft a final two months that match his first three-plus... in his first 14 starts (through June 15), Jake led the American League with a 2.24 ERA (76.1 IP, 19 ER) and 10 wins...over his next six outings (June 20 - July 24), he posted an 8.44 ERA (26.2 IP, 25 ER) and won just once...as noted above, Odorizzi's recaptured his success during his last two trips to the hill...a closer look at his seasons-within-a-season, to-date:

**IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG:** Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the American League against right-handed hitters, yielding a league-low .172 batting average (39-for-227)...he ranks third with a .557 OPS vs. righties.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** The Twins have won eight of Odorizzi's 11 starts this season at Target Field, while he is personally 6-1 with a 3.59 ERA (62.2 IP, 25 ER) here at home...has struck out 72 batters (10.34 per 9.0 IP) against just 18 walks at home (4.00 SO/BB ratio), while holding opponents to a .229/.281/.415 slash line (54-for-236, with 11 home runs).

☞ In his first 27 home starts for Minnesota, Odo is 11-5 with a 4.21 ERA (143.1 IP, 67 ER)...the Twins are 18-9 (.667) when he takes the mound at Target Field.

**TIME FOR THE HEATER:** Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.9 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 57.2 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%)...used his four-seamer 60.6% of the time through his first 14 starts (10-2, 2.24 ERA), however, threw it just 47.8% of the time over his next six (1-3, 8.44)...has returned to the heater over his last two outings (1-0, 1.54), throwing it for 125 of his 212 pitches (59.0%)...below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

**CONSISTENCY IS KEY:** Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is third in the American League with 174 starts and fifth with a .235 opponents' batting average since 2014.

☞ Only Rick Porcello (181) and Justin Verlander (177) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.

☞ Chris Sale (.214), Verlander (.219), Corey Kluber (.223) and Marco Estrada (.234) are the four with lower BAAs.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS (SEASON: 10-6, 3.24 ERA // CAREER: 39-32, 4.14 ERA)

Berríos will take the mound tomorrow afternoon for the finale of this four-game series vs. Cleveland...enters his 23rd start of the season ranked seventh in the AL with a 3.24 ERA (147.1 IP, 53 ER) and sixth with 16 quality starts...saw his ERA jump 0.44 points (from 2.80) after allowing a career-high nine runs (all earned) over 5.2 innings in a 12-7 loss Tuesday to Atlanta...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (18.2 IP, 4 ER) in three starts vs. Cleveland this season, including a dominating Opening Day performance here at Target Field...tossed 7.2 innings of two-hit, shutout ball with one walk and 10 strikeouts, leading the Twins to a season-opening, 2-0 victory...last faced the Indians on July 14 in Cleveland, but did not factor in the decision in a 4-3 Tribe win, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.0 innings...has won four-straight decisions vs. the Indians and is 5-2 with a 3.86 ERA (56.0 IP, 24 ER) in 10 career starts...is 2-2, 3.95 (27.1 IP, 12 ER) in five starts at Target Field, including consecutive victories.
