games last weekend losing two of three to the Braves this week, followed by two losses and a win against the Tribe today the Twins will complete the homestand with the four-game series finale against Cleveland...following today's game, the Twins will travel to Milwaukee... they will enjoy an off-day tomorrow, followed by two vs. the Brewers from Tuesday-Wednesday, then four against the Rangers from Thursday-Sunday.

TWINS TAKE IT BACK: The Twins beat the Indians last night by a score of 4-1 after a 1:51 rain delay...Jake Odorizzi (13-5) was the starter and winner, pitching 5.2 scoreless innings with six hits, four walks and six strikeouts...Sergio Romo earned his fourth hold as a win and Taylor Rogers pitcher 2.0 innings to earn his 18th save...the offense recorded 10 hits, highlighted
by Max Kepler's 32 nd home run and Marwin Gonzalez's 13th...Twins were 3 -for-3 with RISP.
TWINS-TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the 13 th of 19 scheduled meetings this season...Twins are 6-6 vs. the Indians this season...including today's game, they play each other seven more times this season, three at Progressive Field and four at Target Field...the next series will be September 6-8 at Target Field.
$\Phi$ Max Kepler has six home runs and nine RBI in 12 games against Cleveland this season... six homers lead baseball vs. Cleveland...his 14 career homers vs. the Tribe are his most (next CWS \& BAL - 9)...nobody has homered more vs. the Indians since 2016 than Kepler (14); next are Rosario (13) and Cruz (12).

Cron's next home run could give the Twins six players with 20-plus homers, which would tie the 1964 Twins for most players with 20-plus:

MAX POWER: Max Kepler has nine home runs in his last 19 games.... 30 of his 32 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball...three players in baseball hit as many as 30 homers from the leadoff spot in 2018: Francisco Lindor (37), Mookie Betts (32) and Matt Carpenter ( 30 )...since the start of 2018, he ranks ninth among all players in homers from the leadoff spot, despite just 358 at-bats there (Lindor leads with 57 HR in 1049 AB's)...sin-gle-season club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Dozier in 2017 (Kepler 2nd). $\Phi$ Kepler has reached safely in 19 consecutive starts, tied for third longest of his career, his long being 26, from July 5-August 6, 2018...during his current streak, he has a difference of 94 points between batting average (.295) and on-base percentage (.389).

SAUCE ON THE SIDE: Mitch Garver has hit 21 home runs this season, all at catcher, the most for at the position in all of baseball, ahead of Willson Contreras (19)... 21 homers as catcher rank third most in club history, trailing Earl Battey's 26 in 1963 and Joe Mauer's 23 in 2009 (Mauer totaled 28 in MVP season)...Garver's. 614 SLG is the best in club history for a catcher $\Phi$ Among all players in baseball with a minimum of 200 plate appearances, he ranks fifth in
slugging percentage (.614), trailing Yelich (.705), Trout (.673), Bellinger (.653) and Cruz (.650).
BRING 'EM OUT, BRING 'EM OUT!: Twins rank fifth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,707,042 this season, trailing New York (2,454,278), Boston ( $2,232,560$ ), Los Angeles $(2,127,840)$ and Houston $(2,050,387)$...they have drawn $30,000+$ in 26 of their last 31 home games for a total of $1,039,866$ in that span ( 33,544 avg)...the Twins biggest attendance for a series this season came June 14-16 in three games vs. the Royals, drawing 117,051...through these last three games vs. the Indians, the Twins have drawn 104,426...the Twins three highest four-game series totals in Target Field history are: 156,914 in May of 2013 vs. Detroit // 139,351 in July of 2014 vs. New York-AL // 135,518 in July of 2012 vs. Baltimore.
TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week honors have been announced and Double-A Pensacola outfielder Trevor Larnach and Single-A Ft. Myers right-handed pitcher Jordan Balazovic have been named...in five games for the Miracle, Larnach hit 412 (7-for-17) with two home runs, five RBI, four walks and a 1.289 OPS...the 22 -year-old was selected by the Twins 20th overall in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Oregon State University...Balazovic made the start on Thursday vs. Jupiter, pitching 5.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and nine strikeouts...the 20 -year-old was selected by the Twins in the fifth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of St. Martin SS in Mississauga, Ontario...the righty pitched 1.0 perfect inning at the SiriusXM Futures Game this July at Progressive Field.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2008, Ron Gardenhire earned his 600th managerial win in a 4-0 defeat of New York-AL.

OUCH: Berríos endured the worst start of his professional career in his last outing, allowing a ca-reer-high nine runs on nine hits with a season-high four walks and seven strikeouts, as the Atlanta Braves pounded their way to a 12 - 7 victory on Tuesday...reigning NL Rookie of the Year Ronald Acuña Jr. set the tone early, whacking the first pitch Berríos threw 426 feet, over the center field wall... José settled down momentarily, retiring seven of his next eight hitters before a walk and single preceded a Freddie Freeman three-run homer in the third...allowed back-to-back singles to score a run in the fifth, but the sixth inning would spell the end for José, as after beginning the frame with two strikeouts sandwiching a walk, the Braves went: single, (balked in a run), RBI single and RBI triple...Cody Stashak came in and immediately surrendered an RBI single, forcing home the ninth and final run of José's night.
$\Phi$ The outing snapped a streak of 12 starts without allowing more than three earned runs, a career-Iong streak, and the longest single-season stretch by a Twins starter since Johan Santana (22 straight starts) from June 9-Sept. 29, 2004.

LA CASA DE JOSÉ: In 10 starts at home this season, Berríos is $5-3$ with a 3.15 ERA (65.2 IP, 23 ER) with 64 strikeouts, compared to going 5-3, 3.31 ERA ( $81.2 \mathrm{IP}, 30 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 76 strikeouts away from Target Field....has 23 career wins at Target Field, second to only Kyle Gibson since its inception in 2010...below is a chart of all-time wins at Target Field:

$\Phi$ Berríos is sixth in the American League (T-11th in MLB) with 16 quality starts, while 17 out of his 23 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including nine $7.0+$ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 94 career starts, Berríos has thrown 46 quality starts ( 48.9 percent).
The $2.08 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ rate is the lowest by a qualifying Twins starter since Phil Hughes' 0.95 ( 16 BB in 152.1 IP) in 2015 ..teammate Michael Pineda currently owns a $1.77 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ rate ( $23 \mathrm{BB}, 117.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the top young pitchers in Twins history... his 3.24 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 ( 2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 34 walks in 23 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an $8.55 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ ratio ( 140 SO), and is on-pace to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a S $0 / 9$ ratio north of 8.00 , joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).
$\mp$ Berríos has 140 strikeouts through 23 starts and an ERA of $3.24 \ldots$.... is trying to become the third Twins starter, at age 25 or younger, to record 200-plus strikeouts and a sub-3.00 ERA, joining Johan Santana ( 2.61 ERA, 265 SO, 25 years old in 2004) and Bert Blyleven, who did it five years in a row from 1971-75 (age 21 through age 25 seasons).

## CAREER NOTES

- Teamed with Jake Odorizzi (11 Ks on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with
30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva -
33 , and Boof Bonser - 30 ).
