THE TWINS: The Twins finished 5-5 on their season-long, 10-game homestand, going 3-0 against the Royals, 1-2 against the Braves and 1-3 against the Indians...tonight, the Twins begin a six-game roadtrip with the first of two at Miller Park against the Brewers...following tomorrow afternoon's game, the Twins will make their final trip to Globe Life Park for a fourgame series against the Rangers from Thursday-Sunday.

TWINS SLAMMED IN 10TH: The Twins lost Sunday's series finale to the Indians by a score of $7-3$ in 10 innings, as Carlos Santana hit a grand slam off Taylor Rogers (2-3) to snap a 3-3 tie...the Twins rallied to tie the game with two runs in the ninth off Cleveland closer Brad Hand but had the potential winning run thrown out at the plate...Luis Arraez, Eddie Rosario and Marwin Gonzalez all had two hits, with Gonzalez' second the game-tying double in the ninth.

A CHANGE AT THE TOP: Cleveland's walk-off win over Boston last night put the Twins into second place in the AL Central for the first time since the morning of April 20, when Minnesota was 9-7 and a season-high 1.0 game behind...the Twins swept a doubleheader at Baltimore that day to pull even atop the division and then held at least a share of first place for 113 consecutive calendar days (April 21-August 11)...to overtake the Twins, the Indians have put together their best 119-game record since 1999, tied for the fifth-best 119-game mark by an AL Central team in the Wild Card era:

NOTE: At 71-47, the Twins, regardless of tonight's outcome, already own their best 119-game record in the Wild Card era, surpassing the 2002 and 2006 division champions (both 70-49)... the Twins have spent 126 days in first place (or a share) of the AL Central...only Los Angeles-NL has spent more days leading their division (132).

THE YEAR OF THE BOMBA: The Twins 228 home runs are the most in club history and most in baseball, 11 more than second-place New York-AL (217)...they need 39 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 313 with 44 games remaining.....J. Cron's next home run could give the Twins six players with 20-plus homers, which would tie the 1964 Twins for most players with 20-plus:

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have reinstated right-handed pitcher Sam Dyson from the 10-day Injured List and have optioned right-handed pitcher Cody Stashak to Triple-A Rochester...Dyson, who was acquired via trade with San Francisco at the MLB trade deadline, has appeared in two games for the Twins this season, allowing six runs on six hits in 0.2 innings pitched...he has missed the last nine games with right biceps tendinitis...in 51 games between the Giants and Twins this season, he has gone 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA (51.2 IP, 20 ER), nine walks, 48 strikeouts, two saves and 17 holds.

BORDER BATTLE/INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 6-9 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 1-1 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami and 1-2 vs. Atlanta...they have five more IL games remaining: these two at Miller Park agains the Brewers and three vs. Washington from September 10-12...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7)
$\Phi$ The Twins are 230-223 all-time against the Brewers (games since 1970) and have a record of 64-54 against them in Interleague Play...the Twins snapped a four-game losing streak to the Brewers with a $5-3$ win May 28 at Target Field...the Twins are looking for their first win at Miller Park since August 10, 2017 , suffering a three-game sweep here last year from July 2-4, 2018.
$\Phi$ Miguel Sanó has reached base safely in each of his last 23 starts in IL Play, hitting . 313 ( 25 -for-80) with seven doubles, six home runs, 18 RBI, 14 walks, a .415 on-base percentage and a 1.040 OPS in that span.... he has reached base safely in each of his nine career games against the Brewers while in four games at Miller Park he has gone 7 -for- 15 ( 467 ) with a double, home run and three RBI क Eddie Rosario is hitting 324 (57-for-176) with 13 doubles, 12 home runs, 29 RBI and a .959 OPS in his last 43 games vs. NL teams
$\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is a career .312 hitter ( 49 -for-157) with a .8480 OSS in 45 IL games, including a .425 mark (17-for-40) with four doubles, one triple and a 1.017 OPS in 11 games vs. the Brewers.
क Mitch Garver is batting .371 (13-for-35) with a . 914 OPS in 10 IL games this season, while his six home runs vs. NL teams match Max Kepler and Baltimore's Renato Núñez for second-most among AL players in 2019.

CLUTCHING UP: Since July 25 , the Twins lead all of baseball with a 380 average ( 38 -for-100) and a 1.172 OPS with runners in scoring position...the Twins have seven doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 60 RBI and 10 walks in those clutch spots over the last 17 games. $\Phi$ For the season, the Twins own an 853 OPS with RISP, fourth-best in baseball...it is also their best team-mark in history (since 1961), 27 points higher than the 2008 club.

VIRAL SENSATION: Major League Baseball and YouTube have announced that the Minnesota Twins at Milwaukee Brewers game on Wednesday, August 14 at 1:00 p.m. CT has been selected as the sixth MLB Game of the Week Live on YouTube...as such, YouTube will have exclusive rights to telecast the game; it will be made available globally, allowing fans to view the game, free of charge and without signing up for a YouTube account, on any PC, mobile device or smart TV...the Twins will return to FOX Sports North as their television

PÉREZ'S STRUGGLES CONTINUE AS TWINS FALL TO BRAVES: In his last start, Pérez labored through 6.0 innings against the Atlanta Braves, yielding a season-high tying three home runs for seven total runs ( 6 earned) on a career-high tying 11 hits, resulting in an 11-7 defeat last Wednesday... the Braves got to him early as Ozzie Albies and Freddie Freeman connected for back-to-back home runs, and Charlie Culberson knocked a two-out RBI single in the first inning...the Braves would sport another three-run inning in the third, as three singles, two walks, a passed ball and an error led to a six-run deficit...he would escape a bases-loaded, no-out jam in the third by recording his second triple play of the season, getting Tyler Flowers to ground out to Miguel Sano at third base, who flipped to Jonathan Schoop at second and then to CI Cron at first Pérez rode that momentum through a pair of scoreless innings before Albies got him again for a solo shot in the sixth.
$\Phi$ Pérez is the first AL pitcher to be on the mound for multiple triple plays in a season since Mark Buehrle in 2006.
玉 Has now allowed 11 home runs in his last five starts after having allowed just seven total over his first 18 appearances ( 15 starts)...since July 17, opponents are slashing .327/.374/.664 against first 18 appearances ( 15 starts)...since July 17 , oppo
him with 16 XBH , eight walks and a $12.33 \mathrm{H} / 9$ rate.
TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the windup, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .230 ( 65 -for-282) with an OPS of 691 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .318 average ( 62 -for-195) with an .864 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting 288 (32-for-111) with nine XBH and 45 RBI with RISP, including .321 (18-for-56) and 23 RBI with RISP and two outs.
A DEEPER LOOK AT TIMES THROUGH THE LINEUP: Pérez has done his best work early in ballgames, as he boasts a 3.30 ERA ( $43.2 \mathrm{IP}, 13 \mathrm{ER}$ ) while he weaves through a given lineup for the first time in a game, with a BAA of 229 (38-for-166) and 12 XBH....however, those numbers spike dramatically the second time through, as his ERA balloons to 5.23 ( 41.1 IP, 24 ER) and his opponents' average jumps to .283...when he makes it to a third tour, his ERA rests at 5.74 ( $26.2 \mathrm{IP}, 17 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 11 extra-base hits.

VS. NL: Pérez enters today's start with a 6-8 lifetime record against National League opponents in 25 games ( 22 starts), but his teams are 14-11 in those games.... 1 wns a 4.23 ERA (140.1 IP, 66 ER) with 89 strikeouts, but a total of 46 extra-base hits out of 147 total.
$\Phi$ Is making his third start against a National League opponent this season (NYM on 7/17, ATL on 8/7), but his fifth appearance, as he pitched twice on the Twins' initial roadtrip of the season against the Phillies and Mets, allowing a combined five runs (4 earned) in 4.2 IP of relief.
क His lone outing against Milwaukee was a start back on Sept. 26, 2016 in Arlington, Texas... he threw 6.2 innings, allowing eight runs on nine hits ( 2 home runs) on just 89 pitches... both home runs belonged to Jonathan Villar (now with Baltimore), and only three Brewers who played in that game are still on their current 25 -man roster: Ryan Braun, Hernán Pérez and Orlando Arcia.
