THE TWINS: After completing their season-long 10-game nomestand with a record of 5-5 (3-0
against the Royals, 1-2 against the Braves and 1-3 against the Indians), the Twins began
their six-game roadtrip with a win over the Brewers in Milwaukee last nighttoday the Twins
will play the second of two at Miller Parkfollowing today's game, the Twins will make their
final trip to Globe Life Park for a four-game series against the Rangers from Thursday-Sunday.

MARWIN BLASTS TWINS BACK INTO FIRST: The Twins beat the Brewers last night by a score of 7-5, moving back into first place in the AL Central by a half-game over Cleveland...Martín Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, despite allowing just one unearned run on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Tyler Duffey picked up the win with 1.0 scoreless inning of relief as Sam Dyson recorded his first hold as a Twin and Sergio Romo earned his second save as a Twin...the offense recorded nine hits, two from both Eddie Rosario and Marwin Gonzalez...Mitch Garver hit his 22nd home run and Gonzalez hit his 14th, the decisive three-run shot off Josh Hader with two outs in the eighth inning to take the lead.

THE YEAR OF THE BOMBA: The Twins 230 home runs are the most in club history and most in baseball, 12 more than second-place New York-AL (218)...they need 37 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 313 with 43 games remaining...C.J. Cron's next home run could give the Twins six players with 20-plus homers, which would tie the 1964 Twins for most players with 20-plus:

BORDER BATTLE/INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 7-9 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 2-1 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami and 1-2 vs. Atlanta...they have four more IL games remaining: today at Miller Park against the Brewers and three vs. Washington from September 10-12...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7).

▼ The Twins are 231-223 all-time against the Brewers (games since 1970) and have a record of 65-54 against them in Interleague Play.

▼ Migual Sané hase peopled have serificially played to the last 24 starts in IL Play hitting 207

**Miguel Sanó has reached base safely in each of his last 24 starts in IL Play, hitting .297

(27-for-91) with eight doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI, 15 walks, a .402 on-base percentage and a .951 OPS in that span...he has reached base safely in each of his 10 career games against the Brewers, while in five games at Miller Park, he has gone 8-for-19 (.421) with a double, home run, three RBI and six walks.

© Eddie Rosario is hitting .328 (59-for-180) with 14 doubles, 12 home runs, 29 RBI and a .968 OPS in his last 44 games vs. NL teams.

Dorge Polanco is a career .311 hitter (50-for-161) with a .843 OPS in 46 IL games, including a .409 mark (18-for-44) with four doubles, one triple and a .983 OPS in 12 games vs. the Brewers.
 Mitch Garver is batting .350 (14-for-40) with a 1.266 OPS in 11 IL games this season...Garver's seven IL home runs this season are second most among AL players, trailing just Yuli Gurriel (8, in 18 games)...Garver is tied with Torii Hunter (2005) for the second-most single season homers by a Twin in Interleague Play, trailing only Trevor Plouffe's nine in 2012.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have the second-best road winning percentage in baseball at .632 (36-21), trailing only Tampa Bay's .645 mark (40-22)...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...the Twins have outscored opponents on the road 345-265...where the Twins

SWEEPS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their ninth sweep of an opponent this season...their previous eight sweeps came: three games May 24-26 vs. CWS, three games May 20-22 at LAA, three games May 6-8 at TOR, three games April 26-28 vs. BAL, three games at BAL April 20-21, two games April 13-14 vs. DET, two games April 2-3 at KC and three games August 2-4 vs. KC...Twins recorded seven sweeps all of last season...Twins are 8-7 this season when attempting to secure a sweep, going 1-5 in their last six attempts.

CLUTCHING UP: Since July 25, the Twins lead all of baseball with a .372 average (42-for-113) and a 1.150 OPS with runners in scoring position...the Twins have eight doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 65 RBI and 11 walks in those clutch spots over the last 18 games. **©** For the season, the Twins own an .855 OPS with RISP, fourth-best in baseball...it is also their best team-mark in history (since 1961), 29 points higher than the 2008 club (.826)

VIRAL SENSATION: Major League Baseball and YouTube have announced that the Minnesota Twins at Milwaukee Brewers game this afternoon has been selected as the sixth MLB Game of the Week Live on YouTube...as such, YouTube will have exclusive rights to telecast the game; it will be made available globally, allowing fans to view the game, free of charge and without signing up for a YouTube account, on any PC, mobile device or smart TV...broadcast team will feature analysis from four-time Twins All-Star and 2006 American League MVP Justin Morneau, along with three-time Brewers All-Star Dan Plesac...Rich Waltz will handle play-by-play, while Minnesota native Jamie Hersch provides insignt from the field...the Twins will return to FOX Sports North as their television home for the remainder of the 2019 regular season, beginning tomorrow night at the Texas Rangers (7:05 P.M. CT).

LAST TIME OUT: Gibson was the starter and loser last Thursday vs. the Indians after allowing six runs (5 earned) on four hits with a career-high six walks and just two strikeouts over 4.1 innings pitched...the loss was his first since June 19 vs. Boston, snapping a four-game winning streak (a span of nine starts)...after a clean first inning, a lead-off triple from Yasiel Puig in the second followed by a throwing error on a pickoff attempt to first base, plated the Indians first run of the game...Gibson threw another perfect inning in the third until the wheels fell off in the fourth and fifth innings...he walked the first two batters in the fourth who would come around to score on a single and a double...in the fifth, a single and another walk put runners on before a double from José Ramiréz brought home two more for the Tribe.

The errant pickoff throw was just his second error of the season (4/28 vs. Baltimore), and the third of his career.

AGAINST THE NATIONAL LEAGUE: This will be Gibson's sixth career start vs. Milwaukee and his first since 2018...is 1-2, 5.70 ERA (30.0 IP, 19 ER) with seven walks and 21 strikeouts...in his last start against them on July 2 of last season, he did not factor into the decision after tossing 5.0 innings of four-run ball (3 earned), on eight hits with a home run, two walks and three strikeouts...his only career win vs. the Brewers came here at Miller Park back on June 27, 2015.

© Gibson is 4-9 over 17 career games (all starts) against National League opponents...owns a 5.47 ERA (97.0 IP, 59 ER) while the Twins are just 6-11 over those 17.

₱ Has only faced one NL opponent this season: at the New York Mets back on April 9...did not factor into the decision after tossing 4.2 innings allowing three runs on six hits in a 14-8 Twins win.

HAVE A DAY: Gibby has found success in his starts during the day this season posting a 5-2 record over 10 games (9 starts) with a 3.51 ERA (48.2 IP, 19 ER) while allowing seven home runs and striking out 51...however, at night, he is 6-3, with a 4.69 ERA over 78.2 IP with 10 home runs, 33 walks and 75 strikeouts over 14 games (all starts).

GROUND WORK: Gibson owns a 0.85 GIDP/9 this season which is 20th best in all of baseball and ninth in the AL...since 2014, Gibson is first in GIDP in the majors with 131 and is second in GIDP/9 with 1.18...has induced 12 double plays in 2019, T-10th in the AL.

12 IS THE NUMBER: The right-hander is looking for his 12th win here today in what will be his 24th start of the season...the last time he recorded 12 wins came in 2017 (12-10), when he earned the 12th in his 28th start...in 2014, he went 13-12 with the 12th win coming in his 29th start...with the win today, it would mark the fastest to 12 wins over his seven-year career.
