THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game roadtrip with a two-game series split with the Brewers at Miller Park, winning the first and losing the second, both teams won on three-run eighth inning homers...tonight the Twins will make their final trip to Globe Life Park in Arlington for the first of four with the Rangers through the weekend...Twins have won eight of their last 12 on the road...each of the Twins next 17 games are against teams at .500 -or-below and 12 on the road...each of the Twins next 17 games are against teams at $.500-$ or
have a combined winning percentage of 421 ( 4 vs. TEX, 6 vs. CWS, 7 vs. DET).

TWINS LOSE THRILLER AT MILLER: The Twins lost to the Brewers yesterday afternoon in Milwaukee by a score of 6-5... Kyle Gibson was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Sergio Romo blew his first save as a Twin, allowing a three-run homer to Trent Grisham in the eighth inning...the Twins offense recorded just six hits and went 1 -for- 6 with runners in scoring position (Milwaukee went 4 -for15 with RISP)...Mitch Garver (23), Miguel Sanó (21) and Eddie Rosario (26) each homered.

BRINGING LONGBALLS TO LONE STAR STATE: The Twins 233 home runs are the most in club history and most in baseball, 14 more than second-place New York-AL (219)...they need 34 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 314 with 42 games remaining...C.J. Cron's next home run could give the Twins six players with 20 -plus homers, which would tie the 1964 Twins for most players with 20 -plus: 1964

$\Phi$ Jonathan Schoop enters today with a 12 -game hitting streak vs. Texas, hitting. 417 (20-for-48) with five doubles, four homers, 18 RBI and a 1.244 OPS in that span...marks his second longest streak vs. any team (Houston - 13, 2017-19).
$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting 352 ( 31 -for- 88 ) with seven doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI and 14 runs scored...his 31 hits are his most vs. any non-AL Central opponent...he has hit safely in all 10 career games at Texas, hitting .409 ( 18 -for-44) in this ballpark $\Phi$ C.J. Cron is hitting . 310 ( 18 -for-58) with six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.0010 PS in his last 16 vs. Texas.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have reinstated right-handed pitcher Michael Pineda from the 10 -day Injured List and have optioned right-handed pitcher Randy Dobnak to Triple-A Rochester...Pineda, who missed the Twins last 12 games with a right triceps strain, has started 21 games this season, going 7-5, 4.15 ERA (117.0 IP, 54 ER), 23 walks and 103 strikeouts...prior to suffering his injury, Pineda went 3-2, 2.72 ERA ( $53.0 \mathrm{IP}, 16$ ER), 12 walks, 50 strikeouts, a 237 opponent batting average and six quality starts from June 13-August 1...Dobnak appeared in one game in relief last Friday, pitching 4.0 scoreless innings with six hits, qua walks and three strikeouts.

EDDIE, MONEY: Eddie Rosario hit his 26th home run yesterday afternoon, the 100 th of his career and is just one away from tying his single-season career-high of 27, done in 2017...in his last 28 games, he is hitting . 330 ( 37 -for-112) with six doubles, six home runs, 22 RBI and a 887 OPS....he has 77 home runs as an outfielder since 2017, tied for eighth most in the American League.
MAD MAX, FURY ROAD: Max Kepler has reached safely in each of his last 18 road games, dating back to June 23, posting a 1.052 OPS during that span...it marks the second longest on-base streak of his career, his best being 26 straight from June 25-August 18, 2016 .. Jorge Polanco had a 26 -game road on-base streak earlier this season from May 6 -July 3.

MORE ON MAX: Max Kepler is hitting . 257 ( $94-$-for- 366 ) with 23 doubles, 30 home runs, 65 RBI, 42 walks, 73 runs scored and a .901 OPS from the leadoff spot this season... 30 home runs from the leadoff spot are the most in baseball...his 53 extra-base hits from the leadoff spot are tied with Whit Merrifield for second most in baseball, trailing only Charlie Blackmon (62).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2010, Kevin Slowey pitched 7.0 no-hit innings against Oakland, but was taken out of the game having reached his pitch count limit; Slowey skipped his previous start because of elbow tendinitis...in 2011, Jim Thome hit two home runs in a 9-6 win over Detroit to become the eighth player to reach 600 home runs; Thome hit a two-run homer off Rick Porcello in the sixth for number 599, then a three-run shot against Daniel Schlereth in the seventh.
HAPPY BIRTHDAY, TK!: Former manager Tom Kelly is celebrating his 69th birthday today...TK shares a birthday with former Twins player Chad Allen (51) and former Vikings Quarterback Bubby Brister (57)...Kelly is the Twins all-time managerial wins leader (1140).

## MICHAEL PINEDA


2019: 7-5, 4.15 ERA CAREER: 47-46, 4.07 ERA

- He is making his 22 nd start of the season.
- He is making his 139 th career appearance, all starts.


THE RETURN: The Minnesota Twins announced today that the right-hander has been reinstated from the 10 -day Injured List after missing the last 12 games with a right triceps strain.
$\Phi$ Marked his second stint on the IL this season after missing eight games (5/28-6/7) with right knee tendinitis.

LAST START: Pineda did not factor into the decision in his last start on August 1 vs. the Marlins in Miami....pitched a perfect first inning before allowing his only run of the game in the second on a Harold Ramírez triple that scored Starlin Castro who reached on an infield single...gave up two hits in the third and fourth innings and one in the fifth before exiting after the sixth with Bryan Holaday stranded on first after reaching on a throwing error from Jorge Polanco.
$\Phi$ Has lasted at least 6.0 innings in 11 starts this season, including five of his last six dating back to June 29 vs. the Chicago White Sox.
$\Phi$ Recorded his 11th quality start of the season despite allowing the most hits over his last seven starts.

PINEDA PUTTING IN WORK: Pineda is $3-2$, with a 2.72 ERA ( $53.0 \mathrm{IP}, 16$ ER) over his last nine starts as he ranks sixth in the AL for ERA since June 13 (minimum 50.0 innings pitched)... the Twins have went 6-3 over that stretch (Pineda is 3-2)...he has allowed 47 hits, with 12 walks, 50 strikeouts and an opponents' slash line of .237/.282/.359.
$\Phi$ Pineda has now limited teams to three earned runs-or-less in 14 of his last 15 starts, dating back to May 5 at New York-AL....he owns a 3.48 ERA (88.0 IP, 34 ER) while striking out 81 batters over that stretch (Twins are 9-6), with 10 quality starts.

WALK TALK: Pineda is T-3rd in all of baseball with 23 free passes this season, and has the fewest in the American League among starters with at least 20 starts (excludes openers)...his walks-per-nine innings rate is 1.77 , which ranks ninth-best in the majors among starters with at least $115.0 \mathbb{P}$ and is second in the American League behind Mike Leake (1.25)....has seven starts without walking a batter this season and nine with walking just one.
$\Phi$ Michael also averages one walk per 0.48 batters he faces, which is eighth lowest in baseball among pitchers with at least 115.0 IP (2nd-best in the AL, behind Leake), while his 4.88 strikeout-to-walk rate sits 18 th ( 8 th in the AL).

TEXAS FOREVER: Pineda is making his eighth career start against the Rangers and his second this season...he is 1-4, 5.05 ERA (41.0 IP, 23 ER ) with nine walks and 46 strikeouts over his seven career starts.... he made his Major League debut against Texas April 5, 2011 at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington, when he tossed 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts as a member of the Seattle Mariners; received the loss as the Mariners lost 3-2... his last time out against the Rangers came on July 6 at Target Field, when he earned the win after throwing 6.0 innings, allowing just one run on five hits while striking out a season-high nine batters in a 7-4 Twins win
$\Phi$ Is 3-1, 4.46 ERA (40.1 IP, 20 ER ) with 13 walks and 36 strikeouts while holding batters to a 240 average over seven starts against AL West opponents this season...however, over 33 career starts vs. AL West teams, Pineda is 12-11, 4.65 ERA (195.1 IP, 101 ER) with 49 walks and 184 strikeouts and holds batters to a .251 average

## CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018 , allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched. - Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August. - Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA ( 113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of 198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16 -year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
