OFFENSE GETS BIGGER IN TEXAS: The Twins beat the Rangers last night by a score of 13-6, their highest run total since July 5 vs. Texas (15)...Michael Pineda ( $8-5$ ) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Devin Smeltzer earned his first career save with 4.0 innings of relief...the offense recorded 14 hits, six being extra-base hits, including home runs from Miguel Sanó (22), Eddie Rosario (27) and Luis Ârraez (3).

MARWIN GOING GONZO: Marwin Gonzalez tied a career-high with four hits last night, marking the fifth time in his career with four hits...in his last five games, he is hitting 500 (10-for-20) with two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and a 1.400 OPS...for the month hits...in his last five games, he is hitting, 500 (10-for-20) with two do
of August, he is hitting .319 (15-for-47) with eight RBI in 13 games.
A-RRAEZ-ING TO THE OCCASION: Luis Arraez had three more hits last night, giving him 66 hits in 55 career games...according to Elias, only three players in Twins history (since 1961) had more hits in their first 55 games than Arraez: Kirby Puckett (81), Tony Oliva (71) and Rod Carew ( 70 )...since being recalled for a second time June 18, he has 57 hits, the most on the club...additionally in that span, he has a . 352 batting average, fifth best in the AL.
SAUCE ON THE SIDE: Mitch Garver has hit 23 home runs this season, all at catcher, the most for at the position in all of baseball, ahead of Gary Sánchez (21)... 23 homers as catcher rank tied for third most in club history with Joe Mauer's 23 in 2009 and trailing Earl Battey's 26 in 1963...Garver's . 653 slugging percentage at catcher is the best in club history.
ฐ Twins catchers have 36 home runs (Garver - 23, Jason Castro - 12, Willians Astudillo-1)...MLB record is 43 by the 2003 Atlanta catchers... 36 by Twins catchers is already tied for 10th best in baseball history.

ICYMI: Double-A Pensacola hit four homers last night, giving them 111 homers this season, setting a franchise record...Triple-A Rochester set their new home run record on August 7 (155th homer) and the Twins set their new homer record last Friday vs. Cieveland

A BAKER'S DOZEN OF WINS: Odorizzi has set a career high with 13 wins ( $13-5$ in 23 starts), surpassing his 11 victories for Tampa Bay in 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts)...the first-time All-Star is tied for fifth in the AL in wins...is just 0.2-inning shy of qualifying for additional leaderboards; otherwise, he would rank 10th in the AL in strikeouts-per- 9.0 innings (career-best $9.42,126 \mathrm{SO}$ in 120.1 IP); 10th in ERA (3.44; 120.1 IP, 46 ER), 11th in FIP (3.92) and opponents' batting average (.230, 103-for-447); 13th in opponents' OPS (.685); and, 16th in WHIP (1.22).
$\Phi$ Odo, along with rotation-mates Kyle Gibson (11-5) and José Berríos (10-6), have given the Twins three 10-game winners for just the third time this decade ( 6 in 2010 and 3 in 2017; Minnesota's only two postseason trips in that span).
HOT AUGUST NIGHTS (STARTING IN JULY): Jake's last three starts -- all Twins wins -- have harkened back to his All-Star form, as he is 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA (17.1 IP, 2 ER), eight walks, 18 strikeouts and a .224/.307/. 343 opponents' slash line ( 15 -for- 67 with 1 home run).
क Odorizzi's last start came August 10 at Target Field, as he improved to 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (17.0 IP, 2 ER) this season against Cleveland with 5.2 -shutout innings in a 4-1 victory...scattered six hits and a season high-tying four walks, pitching his best ball when in trouble...held the Indians to an infield single in 11 at-bats with runners in scoring position (4 strikeouts and 1 walk), as Cleveland left 10 runners on base during his start.

THE TWO JAKES: Odorizzi is looking to craft a final two months that match his first three-plus...in his first 14 starts (through June 15), Jake led the American League with a 2.24 ERA (76.1 IP, 19 ER) and 10 wins...over his next six outings (June 20 - July 24), he posted an 8.44 ERA (26.2 IP, 25 trips to the hill...a closer look at his seasons-within-a-season, to-date:


IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the American League against right-handed hitters, yielding a league-low . 174 batting average ( 41 -for-236)...he ranks second with a . 557 OPS vs. righties (Houston's Brad Peacock has a .536 mark in 165 ABs)

ROAD RULES: Jake has won each of his two road starts since the All-Star break, posting a 1.64 ERA (11.0 IP, 2 ER) in victories at Cleveland (July 13) and Miami (July 30).
$\Phi$ Is $6-4$ with a 3.63 ERA ( 52.0 IP, 21 ER ) in 11 road starts overall this season (Twins are 7-4).
TIME FOR THE HEATER: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.8 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 57.1 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of $54.1 \%$ )... used his four-seamer 60.6 \% of the time through his first 14 starts (10-2, 2.24 ERA), however, his last the full breakdown of his (2-0, 1.04), throwing in to full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:
