BRINGING LONGBALLS TO LONE STAR STATE: The Twins 236 home runs are the most in club history and most in baseball, 14 more than second-place New York-AL (222)...they need 31 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 315 with 41 games remaining...C.J. Cron's next home run could give the Twins six players with 20-plus homers, which would tie the 1964 Twins for most players with 20-plus: 1964

TWINS AND TEXAS: Tonight marks the fifth of seven games against the Rangers this season...

Twins have out-scored the Rangers 36-20 this season...in the four games, the Twins have gone 51-for-157 (.325) with 15 doubles, two triples, eight home runs, 12 walks and a .984 OPS.

Miguel Sanó is hitting .346 (27-for-78) with four doubles, one triple, six home runs, 16 RBI, 13 walks and a 1.095 OPS in 21 career games vs. Texas.

Jonathan Schoop enters today with a 12-game hitting streak vs. Texas, hitting .417 (20-for-48) with five doubles, four homers, 18 RBI and a 1.244 OPS in that span...marks the second longest streak of his career vs. any team (Houston - 13, 2017-19).

Eddie Rosario is hitting .348 (32-for-92) with seven doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI and 16 runs scored...his 32 hits are his most vs. any non-AL Central opponent...he has hit safely in all 11 career games at Texas, hitting .396 (19-for-48) in this ballpark...his average here ranks first among actives (minimum of 50 plate appearances).

C.J. Cron is hitting .302 (19-for-63) with six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 16 RBI and a .955 OPS in his last 17 vs. Texas...he has 25 career RBI in this park, his personal most for any ballpark he has never called his home park (LAA, TB, MIN).

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have recalled left-handed pitcher Lewis Thorpe from Triple-A Rochester and have optioned left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer to Rochester. Thorpe, who will be in his third stint with the Twins, recently appeared in two games for the Red Wings earlier this month, posting a 1.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 1 ER) with three hits allowed, no walks and 11 strikeouts...to make room for Thorpe on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned Devin Smeltzer to Triple-A Rochester.

**700 CLUB:** The Twins scored their 700th run last night and are on pace to score 937 runs which would shatter the club record of 877, set in 1996...they have scored 800-plus seven times in club history, most recently in 2017, scoring 815...the Twins scored 738 runs last season and reached the 700-run mark on September 26...for the season, they rank third in baseball in runs, trailing New York-AL (734) and Boston (709).

**MARWIN GOING GONZO:** Marwin Gonzalez tied a career-high with four hits last night, marking the fifth time in his career with four hits...in his last five games, he is hitting .500 (10-for-20) with two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and a 1.400 OPS...for the month of August, he is hitting .319 (15-for-47) with eight RBI in 13 games.

A-RRAEZ-ING TO THE OCCASION: Luis Arraez had three more hits last night, giving him 66 hits in 55 career games...according to Elias, only three players in Twins history (since 1961) had more hits in their first 55 games than Arraez: Kirby Puckett (81), Tony Oliva (71) and Rod Carew (70)...since being recalled for a second time June 18, he has 57 hits, the most on the club...additionally in that span, he has a .352 batting average, fifth best in the AL.

SAUCE ON THE SIDE: Mitch Garver has hit 23 home runs this season, all at catcher, the most for at the position in all of baseball, ahead of Gary Sánchez (21)...23 homers as catcher rank tied for third most in club history with Joe Mauer's 23 in 2009 and trailing Earl Battey's 26 in 1963...Garver's .653 slugging percentage at catcher is the best in club history.

Twins catchers have 36 home runs (Garver - 23, Jason Castro - 12, Williams Astudillo - 1)...MLB record is 43 by the 2003 Atlanta catchers...36 by Twins catchers is already tied for 10th best in baseball history.

Among all players in baseball with a minimum of 200 plate appearances, Garver ranks sixth in slugging percentage (.614), trailing Christian Yelich (.690), Yordan Alvarez (.679), Mike Trout (.665), Cody Bellinger (.664) and Nelson Cruz (.650).

**LOVE ON THE LEFT SIDE:** The Twins are hitting .289 (328-for-1136) with 55 doubles, 70 home runs, 106 walks and an .881 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank second in OPS (Houston - .886).

**ICYMI:** Double-A Pensacola hit four homers last night, giving them 111 homers this season, setting a franchise record...Triple-A Rochester set their new home run record on August 7 (155th homer) and the Twins set their new homer record last Friday vs. Cleveland.
