THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-1 through four games on their six-game roadtrip, splitting a two-game series in Milwaukee this week, followed by back-to-back wins over the Rangers in Arlington the last two nights...tonight the Twins will play the third of four at Globe Life Park in Arlington through the weekend...Twins have won 10 of their last 14 on the road and, at 38-22 (.633) overall, have the second-best road winning percentage in all of baseball... each of the Twins next 15 games are against teams below .500 and have a combined winning percentage of .420, 152-210 ( 2 vs. TEX, 6 vs. CWS, 7 vs. DET).
BOMBAS, 'PEN KEY TWINS WIN: The Twins won their second straight over the Rangers last night, this time by a score of 4-3...Jake Odorizzi started and was effective, but did not factor in the decision after allowing three runs on five hits over 5.2 innings...Tyler Duffey ( 0.1 IP ), Sam Dyson (1.0), Taylor Rogers (1.0) and Sergio Romo (1.0) combined for 3.1 innings of scoreless relief, with Dyson earning the win and Romo the save...the offense recorded nine hits, three by Marwin Gonzalez and two from Ehire Adrianza...Max Kepler (33) and Jonathan Schoop (17) each hit two-run home runs, with Schoop's the decisive blast in the seventh.
BRINGING LONGBALLS TO LONE STAR STATE: The Twins 238 home runs are the most in club history and most in baseball, 16 more than second-place New York-AL (222)... they need 29 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 316 with 40 games remaining...C.J. Cron's next home run could give the Twins six players with 20 -plus homers, which would tie the 1964 Twins for most players with 20-plus: 1964

WIN-NESOTA: With roughly one quarter of the season left (40 games), the 2019 Twins have the second-best 122-game record (74-48) of any team in the franchise's Minnesota era (since 1961)...only the 1965 American League champions were better, at 77-45, while the 1970 AL West champs and the 1991 World Series winners were both 73-49.

TWINS AND TEXAS: Tonight marks the sixth of seven games against the Rangers this season...at 4-1, the Twins have won the season series for the third time in the last four years... wins have out-scored the Rangers 40-23 this season...in the five games, the Twins have one 60-for-192 (.313) with 16 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 14 walks and a 943 OPS

Miguel Sanó is hitting 338 (27-for-80) with four doubles, one triple, six home runs
16 RBI, 15 walks and a 1.081 OPS in 22 career games vs. Texas.

IVING THE WEST LIFE: The Twins are 22-11 against AL West teams this year, their most wins against that division since 2010 (24-12).. the Twins have hit . 281 (321-for-1144) as a team vs. AL West pitching, with 63 home runs and an . 863 OPS...they have out-Scored their opponents 206-160, while going 4-3 vs. Houston, 5-1 vs. Los Angeles-AL, 3-4 vs. Oakland, 5-2 vs. Seattle and 4-1 vs. Texas.
KEPLER THE NEW EUROPEAN HOME RUN KING: With his 33rd home run, a two-run shot last night, Max Kepler now owns the MLB single-season record for most homers by a European-born player...the Berlin, Germany native surpassed Glasgow, Scotland-born Bobby Thomson, who hit 32 home runs for the 1951 New York Giants...Thomson's final homer in ' 51 was the legendary "Shot Heard 'Round the World" to clinch the NL pennant.

MARWIN GOING GONZO: Marwin Gonzalez has seven hits in nine at-bats in this series and now has five multi-hit efforts in his last six games, going 13-for-24 (.542) with two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and a 1.417 OPS...the damage has come from both sides of the plate, as he is 5-for-9 with one double and one homer hitting right-handed and 8-for-16 with a double and homer hitting left.
A-RRAEZ-ING TO THE OCCASION: Luis Arraez had another hit last night and is now batting . 353 ( 67 -for-190) in his first 56 career games.. among all MLB players with at least 200 plate appearances, he ranks first for batting average and strikeout rate ( 1 for every 15.43 PAs)...since being recalled for a second time June 18, he has a team-high 58 hits and ranks fifth in the AL with a . 349 batting average.
SAUCE ON THE SIDE: Mitch Garver has hit 23 home runs this season, all at catcher, the most at the position in all of baseball, ahead of Gary Sánchez (21)... 23 homers as catcher rank tied for third most in club history with Joe Mauer's 23 in 2009 and trailing Earl Battey's 26 in 1963...Garver's 643 slugging percentage at catcher is the best in club history.

BERRÍOS BOUNCES BACK: After enduring the worst start of his professional career on Aug. 6 vs. Atlanta, (career-high 9 runs on 9 hits with a season-high 4 walks), José gave the Indians all they could handle last Sunday at Target Field, tossing 6.0 innings of three-run ball, allowing six hits and a walk with four strikeouts, but the offense was stymied by rookie Aaron Civale as they only gave Berrío one run of support in an eventual $7-3$ loss.
$\Phi$ The three runs came in the first and third innings as Greg Allen knocked a solo home run before Yasiel Puig plated another with a double in the first...Carlos Santana drove in Francisco Lindor in the third inning...set down 11 straight batters before yielding back-to-back singles
to begin the seventh to Jason Kipnis and Franmil Reyes, knocking him out of the game.
Marked his 17th quality start of the season, tying a career-high....Kyle Gibson threw 18 quality starts last season; if Berríos gets to 20 , it'll be the most by a Twin since Ervin Santana (also 20) in 2017...most recent Twin with more than 20: Carl Pavano's 21 in 2010.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 24 starts, Berríos has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo ( 3 games), Castro ( 12 games) and Garver ( 9 games)...below is a breakdown how La Makina has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches:

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 3.29 ERA through 24 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019 .

$\Phi$ Berríos is tied for fifth in the American League (T-9th in MLB) with 17 quality starts, while 18 out of his 24 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including nine $7.0+$ inning efforts)....not only that, but in 95 career starts, Berríos has thrown 47 quality starts ( 49.5 percent).
$\Phi$ The $2.05 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ rate is the lowest by a qualifying Twins starter since Phil Hughes' 0.95 ( 16 BB in 152.1 IP) in 2015 ..teammate Michael Pineta currently owns a $1.77 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ rate ( $24 \mathrm{BB}, 122.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ).

TEXAS FOREVER: Is $2-1$ in three starts against the Rangers, but missed them during their trip to Target Field last month...was handed his loss to the Rangers in his only outing here on Sept. 1 of last season, as he lasted just 4.0 innings and allowed five runs on three hits (all home runs to Mazara, Beltré and Guzman).

Hasn't fared well in the state of Texas, pitching to a combined 1-2 record with a 7.36 ERA (11.0 IP, 9 ER) between his three starts here and in Houston.

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the top young pitchers in Twins history... his 3.29 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 ( 2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 35 walks 24 star.....ast season, he walked a to at or 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an 8.45 SO .
 (2004-07).
Barrios has 144 strikeouts this season and an ERA of 3.29 ....he is trying to become the third
Twins starter, at age 25 or younger, to record 200-plus strikeouts and a sub-3.00 ERA, joining Johan Santana ( 2.61 ERA, 265 So, 25 years old in 2004) and Bert Blyleven, who did it five years in a row from 1971-75 (age 21 through age 25 seasons).
