GROUND POUND: Since 2014, nobody has induced more ground ball double plays than Gibson, who has 132 over 1008.1 IP in that span...so far this season, Gibby has continued the trend, recording 13 GIDPs, tied for ninth-best in the American League, and the best on the Twins...in fact, he averages 0.88 GIDPs per 9.0 IP, eighth-best in the AL, 18th in the Majors.

Tonly four Twins since 1961 have recorded more double plays than Gibson...the list includes Jim Kaat (248 from 1961-73), Brad Radke (174 from 1995-2006), Bert Blyleven (158 from 1970-88) and Dave Goltz (148 from 1972-79).

♠ A large part of his double play prowess stems from the uptick in groundball percentage from his curveball...in 2018, Gibby's curveball was hit on the ground just 46.7 percent of the time, whereas this season it is averaging a 54.8 percent groundball rate...his sinker (61.4 percent) and changeup (58.0 percent) are also pitches he relies on to get the ball out of the air.
