THE TWINS: The Twins completed their six-game roadtrip with a record of 5-1, going 1-1 in Milwaukee and 4-0 in Texas...tonight they will begin a six-game homestand with three vs. the White Sox, an off-day on Thursday, followed by three games with the Tigers over the weekend...the Twins have won five of their last six games and six of their last eight...they have matched their season-high of 28 games over . 500 .
TWINS SEND OFF GLOBE LIFE PARK: The Twins beat the Rangers yesterday afternoon by a score of 6-3 in their final game at Globe Life Park....Martín Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Taylor Rogers earned his 19th save with a scoreless ninth inning...the offense recorded eight hits, two from both Jorge Polanco and Ehire Adrianza...the win marked the first time in club history that the Twins swept the Rangers in Texas in four games.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the 11th of 19 times this season...the Twins are 7-3 against Chicago this season, going 3-0 at Target Field and 4-3 at Guaranteed Rate Field...the Twins are 11-3 in the last 14 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 31-17 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.
$\mp$ Miguel Sanó is hitting . 433 (13-for-30) with six home runs in nine games vs. the White Sox this season.
Ф Max Kepler is hitting . 382 (13-for-34) with three doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI and 12 runs scored in eight games against Chicago this season.
$\Phi$ Nelson Cruz is hitting . 500 ( 13 -for-26) with two doubles, seven home runs, 16 RBI and a 1.385 OPS in seven games against the Sox this season.
© Relievers own a 1.52 ERA against the White Sox this season (23.2 IP, 4 ER) with $28 / 3$ S0/BB...is the lowest ERA vs. CWS by the Twins bullpen since 2005 (1.18 ERA, 53.1 IP, 7 ER. CWS won World Series that year)
क The Twins have amassed a 2.07 ERA (87.0 IP, 20 ER) against the White Sox this season, almost 60 points lower than the lowest franchise ERA against them (2.66 ERA, 159.0 IP, 47 ER) in 1970...2.07 is the lowest single-season ERA against the White Sox by any AL Central team, since 1994 when the division was created.
THE BOMBA SQUAD: The Twins 240 home runs are the most in club history and most in baseball, 13 more than second-place New York-AL (227)...they need 27 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 313 with 38 games remaining.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have reinstated designated hitter Nelson Cruz from the 10-day Injured List and have optioned right-handed pitcher Zack Littell to Triple-A Rochester...Cruz, who missed the last nine games with a left wrist strain, is hitting . 294 (95-for-323) with 19 doubles, 32 home runs, 76 RBI, 41 walks, 59 runs scored and a 1.035 OPS in 87 games this season...to make room on the 25 -man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Zack Littell to Triple-A Rochester...Littell appeared in 19 games for the Twins this season, going 2-0 with a 3.60 ERA ( $25.0 \mathrm{IP}, 10 \mathrm{ER}$ ), seven walks and 22 strikeouts.

MARWIN GOING GONZO: Marwin Gonzalez has multiple hits in six of his last eight games, going 17-for-33 (.515) with four doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.348 OPS...the going 17 -for- -33 (.515) with four doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.348 OPS...t he

RATED ROOKIE: Luis Arraez is hitting . 342 ( 68 -for-199) in his first 58 career games...among all MLB players with at least 200 plate appearances, he ranks first in batting average and strikeout rate ( 1 for every 14.13 PAs)...since being recalled for a second time June 18, he has a team-high 59 hits and ranks 10th in the AL with a .349 batting average.

RIJO NAMED MWL POW: The Midwest League and MiLB.com announced today that Single-A Cedar Rapids pitcher Luis Rijo (20-years-old) has been named the Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the period ending August 18...Rijo allowed two hits and struck out nine over 7.0 IP in a 2-1 Kernels win at Wisconsin on August 15 th....he has made 17 starts for the Kernels this season, posting a 5-7 record and 2.63 ERA....he was acquired by the Twins on July 30, 2018 as part of a trade with the New York Yankees for Lance Lynn...Rijo is the fourth Kernels pitcher this season to earn MWL weekly honors.

SPRING IS IN THE AIR: The Twins today announced the home schedule for their 2020 Spring Training campaign, the club's 30th at the CenturyLink Sports Complex in Lee County, FL...Twins pitchers and catchers are scheduled to begin their workouts on Wednesday, February 12...the first full-squad workout is scheduled to take place on Monday, February 17 in conjunction with the club's annual Spring Training Open House for fans at the CenturyLink Sports Complex...the Twins 2020 Grapefruit League schedule features 31 games ( 15 home, 16 road), while the club will also host a pair of additional exhibition games, including the home opener at the CenturyLink Sports Complex against the University of Minnesota on Friday, February 21.

LAST TIME OUT: Following a start in which Gibson allowed a career-high six walks to the Indians on August 8, he bounced back with a 5.0-inning effort with just three walks, holding the Brewers to three runs in Milwaukee last Wednesday...despite the limited damage, he didn't factor into the decision as Sergio Romo yielded a three-run home run in the eighth inning, and the Twins fell 6-5, their only loss over their six-game roadtrip to Milwaukee (1-1) and Texas (4-0).
$\Phi$ Gibby did allow eight hits, the most he's allowed since June 8 vs. the Tigers ( 12 games, 11 starts)...the Brewers grabbed one run apiece in the first, third and fifth innings, two of which were driven in with two outs.
THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 25 games, Gibson has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (3 games), Castro (8 games) and Garver (14 games)...below is a breakdown of how he has tared, depending on who's calling his pitches:

$\Phi$ Mitch Garver, owns baseball's fifth-best catcher's ERA this season (min. 50 starts as catcher) at 3.79 ( 510.0 IP)...in fact, the 3.79 CERA is the lowest by a Twins catcher with at least 50 starts since Joe Mauer's 3.78 CERA (777.2 IP) in 2007.

VS. THE PALE HOSE This will be Gibson's 17th career start vs. the White Sox and his third this season....he has won both appearances against Chicago this year, throwing a combined 13.0 innings and allowing just two earned runs ( 1.38 ERA) with 19 strikeouts in them.

His last start against the White Sox at Target Field was back on May 25, an 8-1 Twins win, when Gibson spun 7.0 innings of one-run ball (a solo home run by José Abreu in the fourth inning) striking out nine batters, a career-high vs the White Sox.
$\Phi$ Is 9-4 with a 2.74 ERA in his career against the Wihte Sox...nine wins are the most for Gibby against any opponent, and the 2.74 ERA is his lowest against any opponent that he's made at least two starts against.
$\Phi$ He then matched that career-high for strikeouts against the Pale Hose in his next start against them on July 28 at Guaranteed Rate Field, throwing 6.0 innings, allowing just one more run.
$\Phi$ His lifetime 2.74 ERA against the White Sox is the 11th-lowest ERA among Twins pitchers with at least 10 starts against them (teammate José Berríos is seventh with a 2.24 ERA in 12 starts).

GROUND POUND: Since 2014, nobody has induced more ground ball double plays than Gibson, who has 132 over 1008.1 IP in that span...so far this season, Gibby has continued the trend, recording 13 GIDPs, tied for ninth-best in the American League, and the best on the Twins...in fact, he averages 0.88 GIDPs per 9.0 IP , eighth-best in the AL, 18 th in the Majors.
© Only four Twins since 1961 have recorded more double plays than Gibson...the list includes Jim Kaat (248 from 1961-73) Brad Radke (174 from 1995-2006), Bert Blyleven ( 158 from 1970-88) and Dave Goltz (148 from 1972-79).
$\Phi$ A large part of his double play prowess stems from the uptick in groundball percentage from his curveball...in 2018, Gibby's curveball was hit on the ground just 46.7 percent of the time, whereas this season it is averaging a 54.8 percent groundball rate...his sinker ( 61.4 percent) and changeup ( 58.0 percent) are also pitches he relies on to get the ball out of the air.
