THE TWINS: The Twins completed their seven-game, eight-day roadtrip with a record of 5-2, going 3-1 in Chicago over the White Sox and 2-1 in Miami...tonight the Twins will begin a season-long 10-game homestand with three vs. Kansas City this weekend, three vs. Atlanta from Monday-Wednesday and four vs. Cleveland next weekend...the Twins have 29 home games remaining in 2019 and 25 on the road.

TWINS WALKED-OFF IN MIAMI: The Twins lost to the Marlins in Miami yesterday afternoon by a score of 5-4 in 12 innings, marking their first time suffering a walk-off this season...Michael Pineda was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Sam Dyson made his Twins debut, allowing three runs in the ninth inning...the offense recorded nine hits, two from both Byron Buxton and Max Kepler...Kepler hit his 30th home run to lead off the game - his fifth leadoff homer this season.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the 10th of 19 games this season...they are 6-3 vs. KC this season, going 4-2 at Kauffman Stadium and 2-1 at Target Field...the Twins have gone 12-7 in their last 19 vs. KC overall.

☞ Twins split their last series with the Royals at Kauffman Stadium, winning the two middle games of the four-game series June 20-23.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .337 (31-for-92) with 34 RBI, a .408 OBP, a .696 SLG and a 1.103 OPS in his last 24 vs. Kansas City...he has reached safely in each of his last 23 starts vs. KC.

☞ Max Kepler is hitting .328 (22-for-67) with three home runs, 11 RBI, 13 walks and a .432 OBP in his last 18 games vs. the Royals.

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins 210 home runs are the most in baseball, 25 more than second-place Los Angeles-NL (185)...they need just 15 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...below are the Twins all-time home run marks:

MAD MAX: Max Kepler has hit seven home runs in his last 11 games, dating back to July 21, tied with teammate Nelson Cruz and St. Louis' Paul Goldschmidt for most in baseball since that date...he is hitting .319 (15-for-47) with a 1.248 OPS in his last 12 games...28 of his 30 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, three players in baseball reached 30 homers from the leadoff spot last season: Francisco Lindor (37), Mookie Betts (32) and Matt Carpenter (30)...the club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Brian Dozier in 2017 (Kepler already second).

EXTRA-BASE BUCK: Byron Buxton hit his 30th double yesterday afternoon and has six doubles in his last seven games...since returning from the 10-day Injured List (concussion-like symptoms), he is hitting .385 (10-for-26)...Buxton's 30 doubles are fifth most in the American League, despite the only player to have played less than 85 games (82 games) in the top 20.

EXTRA! EXTRA! The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base hit in 62 straight games, dating back to May 20...it is tied for the eighth longest XBH hit-streak in club history...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009.

THE SANÓ STORM: Miguel Sanó is hitting .312 (29-for-93) with six doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 23 RBI, 17 walks, 20 runs scored, a .418 OBP/.688 SLG/1.106 OPS in his last 28 games since June 28...prior to that date, he was hitting .195 (23-for-118) with a .278 OBP/.483 SLG/.761 OPS in 31 games to begin the season.

SELLING TICKETS: Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,404,066 this season, trailing New York (2,265,353), Los Angeles (2,127,840), Boston (2,022,327), Houston (1,853,408) and Texas (1,452,864)...they have drawn 30,000+ in 18 of their last 22 home games (33,495 avg).

☞ The Twins have sold out 169 regular season games at Target Field since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and eight in 2019.

HOF WEEKEND: This weekend the Twins will celebrate Hall of Fame Weekend, as former reliever Joe Nathan (Saturday) and former club President Jerry Bell (Sunday) will become the club's 32nd and 33rd members of the Twins Hall of Fame...first 10,000 fans in attendance on Saturday will receive a Joe Nathan bobblehead and the first 5,000 on Sunday will receive commemorative pin honoring both men.

QUALITY START, BUT NO SUPPORT: In his last start, Pérez was the tough-luck loser as he worked his way through 6.0 innings against the Chicago White Sox, limiting them to three runs on seven hits, tying a season-high, while registering his eighth quality start of the year, second in his last three starts (7/17 vs. NYM)...following a scoreless first inning, the Sox plated their first run of the game on an Adam Engel fielder's choice, and the White Sox would score a leadoff double in the third inning with a sacrifice fly...saw his third and final run cross the plate as Yoán Moncada cracked a one-out home run in the fifth inning, as the Twins lost 5-1.

- ☞ Received one run of support in the loss, the fewest runs he's had behind him since not getting any on May 30 at Tampa Bay (lasted only 2.2 IP in 14-3 loss)...marked the third time all season in which he's received one-or-zero runs of support (also May 12 vs. Detroit).
- ☞ Was challenged by White Sox manager Rick Renteria, as each of the starting nine batters lined up against Pérez were either right-handed or switch-hitters...Pérez entered the game with an opponents' average of .254 (80-for-315) vs. right-handers, just .004 points higher than lefties (.250), but all 12 homers he's allowed this season (including Moncada's) have come to right-handers.

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact, as referenced by the 85.2 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, tied for the third-lowest in baseball to only Kenta Maeda (85.0) and Ryan Yarbrough (84.6), with a minimum of 250 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 151 feet, fourth-best in the American League.

A DEEPER LOOK AT TIMES THROUGH THE LINEUP: Pérez has done his best work early in ballgames, as he boasts a 2.72 ERA (39.2 IP, 12 ER) while he weaves through a given lineup for the first time in a game, with a BAA of .216 (32-for-148) and just nine XBH...however, those numbers spike dramatically the second time through, as his ERA balloons to 4.50 (38.0 IP, 19 ER) and his opponents' average jumps to .264...when he makes it to a third tour, his ERA rests at 6.08 (23.2 IP, 16 ER) with 10 extra-base hits.

QUALITY QUINTET: Pérez currently has 97 strikeouts, and is three away from making the 2019 Twins' starting rotation the first five-man rotation in Twins history to record 100-plus strikeouts apiece through less than 110 games of any Twins season ever.

- ☞ The Twins have had four pitchers with 100-or-more strikeouts through 110 team games twice before, doing so in 1967 (Boswell-155, Chance-141, Kaat-123 & Merritt-112) and 2018 (José Berrios-148, Kyle Gibson-132, Jake Odorizzi-120 & Lance Lynn-100).

OVER THE WALL, A MAN GETS ONLY WHAT HE EARNS: Pérez has surrendered just 12 home runs this season in 111.0 innings of work, giving him a 0.97 HR/9 IP rate, which ranks 17th in all of baseball, sixth in the American League...he also ranks tied for 22nd in baseball (T-14th in the AL) with 34 extra-base hits allowed, (min. 15 starts).

OH LORDE, THEY'RE ROYALS: Pérez is making his sixth career start against the Kansas City Royals, third this season...owns a 1-1 record with a 3.73 ERA (31.1 IP, 13 ER) against the Royals.

- His lone win against these Royals came on July 14, 2017 at Kauffman Stadium (7.0 IP, 8 H, 3 R, 1 HR, 1 BB, 1 SO).
- So far this season, the lefty has gone 0-1 (Twins are 1-1) against Kansas City, receiving the loss on June 16 here at Target Field, while not factoring into the decision five days later in Kansas City...has a 6.17 ERA (11.2 IP, 8 ER) in those two starts.

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .211 (53-for-251) with an OPS of .610 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .316 average (56-for-177) with an .872 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .297 (30-for-101) with nine XBH and 42 RBI with RISP, including .327 (17-for-52) and 22 RBI with RISP and two outs.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON RHP [SEASON: 10-4, 4.10 ERA ; CAREER: 64-65, 4.43 ERA]

Gibson will take the mound tomorrow night in the second of three against the Royals...Gibby is coming off a win in his last start, giving the Twins 6.0 innings of one-run ball with nine strikeouts, his most in 12 starts (also 9 on May 25 vs. Chicago-AL)...earned his 10th win of the year, joining Berrios (10) and Odorizzi (12) Twins with 10-plus wins this season...is 1-0 against the Royals this season with a 3.55 ERA (12.2 IP, 5 ER), including a win in his last start against them on June 14 at Target Field (8.0 IP, 2 H, 0 ER, 6 SO)...owns a career 3.59 ERA against Kansas City (is 8-5, Twins are 14-6 in his starts).

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
