THE TWINS: After completing their six-game roadtrip with a record of 5-1 (1-1 in Milwaukee and 4-0 in Texas), the Twins began their six-game homestand with a loss to the White Sox last night...tonight they will play the Sox for the second of this three-game series...they will conclude the series tomorrow afternoon, enjoy an off-day on Thursday then host the Tigers for three over the weekend...the Twins have 37 games remaining, 25 of which are against teams with a record under .500.

TWINS CAN'T CUSHION DIVISION LEAD: The Twins lost to the White Sox last night by a score of 6-4...Kyle Gibson (11-6) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on six hits in 6.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 15 hits, went 3-for-9 with runners in scoring position and left 10 men on base...Nelson Cruz returned from the IL and went 2-for-5 with one RBI...Luis Arraez and Eddie Rosario each recorded three hits apiece.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the 12th of 19 times this season...the Twins are 7-4 against Chicago this season, going 3-1 at Target Field and 4-3 at Guaranteed Rate Field...the Twins are 11-4 in the last 15 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 31-18 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

Ⓢ Miguel Sanó is hitting .429 (15-for-35) with six home runs, 13 RBI and a 1.430 OPS in 10 games vs. the White Sox this season.

Ⓢ Max Kepler is hitting .382 (13-for-34) with three doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI and 12 runs scored in eight games against Chicago this season.

Ⓢ Nelson Cruz is hitting .484 (15-for-31) with two doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI and a 1.755 OPS in eight games against the Sox this season...since 2000, seven different players have hit seven-plus homers vs. the Sox in one season, six of which are Twins: Cleveland's Juan Gonzalez (9 in 2001), Brian Dozier (8 in 2016), Justin Morneau (8 in 2007), Nelson Cruz (7 in 2019), Torii Hunter (7 on 2006), Max Kepler (7 in 2019) and Jorge Polanco (7 in 2017).

EXTRA! EXTRA! The Twins have recorded an extra-base hit in 79 straight games, fourth longest streak in club history (since 1961), third longest for a *single-season*:

MARWIN GOING GONZO: Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .344 (22-for-64) with four doubles, two home runs, 12 RBI, eight runs scored and a .864 OPS in his last 17 games...during that span, he is hitting .444 (8-for-18) with runners in scoring position.

THE ARRIVAL OF ARRAEZ: Luis Arraez is hitting .348 (71-for-204) in his first 59 career games...among all MLB players with at least 200 plate appearances, he ranks first in batting average and strikeout rate (1 for every 14.44 PAs)...14.44 PA/K is the best mark for a Twin since Brian Harper posted a 19.76 PA/K ratio in 1993.

Ⓢ Since being recalled for the second time, June 18, he is hitting .344 (62-for-180), fifth best average in the AL since that date and seventh best in all of baseball.

CAVE, MAN: Jake Cave enters tonight with a seven-game hitting streak, one short of his career-high of eight, done twice previously (July 5-13, 2018 & September 23, 2018-March 31, 2019)...during the current streak he is hitting .500 (13-for-26) with five multi-hit games, four doubles and an OPS of 1.190...in fact, in his last 24 games, he is hitting .356 (21-for-59) with five doubles, two home runs and a .969 OPS, raising his batting average 100 points in that span (.161 to .261).

NOT FEELING MINNESOTA: The Twins have lost six of their last seven at Target Field and are 8-12 at home since the All-Star break, a .400 winning percentage that is tied for the fifth-lowest in baseball (ahead of only the Pirates, White Sox, Tigers and Orioles)...while the offense has averaged 5.75 runs-per-game and hitting .281 (195-for-695) with 42 home runs in that span, Twins pitching has a 5.79 ERA (182.0 IP, 117 ER) and has allowed 32 home runs, an .861 OPS and a .296 batting average (219-for-739)...the Twins are 1-4-1 in their first six home series in the second half.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1997, the Twins traded outfielder Roberto Kelly to Seattle for a player to be named later...the deal was finished on October 9, sending Joe Mays to the Twins...Mays eventually became an All-Star in 2001, going 17-13 with a 3.16 ERA in 34 starts.

THIS AND THAT:

Ⓢ Mitch Garver is averaging a home run every 10.57 at-bats this season, the fifth-best rate in the majors among players with at least 250 plate appearances...Nelson Cruz ranks second in the majors with a 10.25 AB/HR ratio this season, trailing only Mike Trout (10.22) (min. 250 PA).

Ⓢ The Twins are 23-5 (.821) this season in games in which Max Kepler hits a home run...in wins this season, Kepler is batting .303 with 28 home runs -- in losses he is batting .181 with five home runs.

Ⓢ Eddie Rosario is hitting .389 (37-for-95) with 13 multi-hit games and a .981 OPS in his last 23 home games.

Ⓢ Miguel Sanó has reached base 16 times (9 hits, 7 walks) in his last 35 plate appearances (.457 OBP and a 1.136 OPS).

Ⓢ The following scoring change has been made to the Minnesota-Atlanta game on August 7: top 3rd runners on second and third no out: Duvall reached first on what was originally scored a missed catch error on Cron, assist to Perez...that has since been changed to a single to pitcher...that makes all three runs that scored in the inning now earned (+H, ER for Pérez; -A for Pérez; -E for Cron; +H for Duvall).

LAST TIME OUT: Pineda was the starter and winner in his last start on Thursday against the Rangers at Globe Life Park...he allowed three runs while scattering six hits with a walk and six strikeouts over 5.0 innings pitched...now has 52 strikeouts over eight career games (all starts) vs. the Rangers, the most against any AL West opponent he's faced...pitched a scoreless three innings with his first hit coming in the fourth on a Nomar Mazara double to right field...a three-run, five-hit fifth inning started with a lead-off homer from Willie Calhoun that plated the Rangers first run and that was followed by back to back singles from Logan Forsythe and Rougned Odor...Jose Trevino grounded into a fielder's choice and a throwing error from Jorge Polanco allowed Odor to score...a single from Elvis Andrus brought home Trevino before Pineda struck out Mazara to end the inning and his outing. ☞ Marked his shortest outing since 6/23 at Kansas City, a span of seven starts...has lasted 6.0+ innings in 11 of his 22 starts this season.

PINEDA PUTTING IN WORK: Pineda is 4-2, with a 2.95 ERA (58.0 IP, 19 ER) over his last 10 starts as he ranks seventh in the AL for ERA since June 13 (min. 55.0 innings pitched)...the Twins have went 7-3 over that stretch...he has allowed 53 hits, with 13 walks, 56 strikeouts and an opponents' slash line of .242/.285/.370.

☞ Pineda has now limited teams to three earned runs-or-less in 15 of his last 16 starts, dating back to May 5 at New York-AL...he owns a 3.58 ERA (93.0 IP, 37 ER) while striking out 87 batters over that stretch (Twins are 10-6), with 10 quality starts.

WALK TALK: Pineda is fourth in all of baseball with 24 free passes this season, and has the second fewest in the American League among starters with at least 20 starts (excludes openers)...his walks-per-nine innings rate is 1.77, which ranks T-7th best in the majors among starters with at least 120.0 IP...has seven starts without walking a batter this season and 10 with walking just one.

☞ Michael also averages one walk per 0.47 batters he faces, which is T-7th lowest in baseball among pitchers with at least 120.0 IP while his 4.54 strikeout-to-walk rate sits 15th in the majors.

CHICAGO CALLING : Big Mike will be making his seventh career start against the White Sox this evening and his third of the 2019 campaign (first at Target Field)...owns a lifetime record of 3-3 with a 3.08 ERA (38.0 IP, 13 ER) with eight walks and 35 strikeouts...his last time out against the Pale Hose came July 26 at Guaranteed Rate Field where he was the starter and winner after allowing just two runs on six hits with one walk and five strikeouts over 7.0 innings of work, matching his season-high for innings pitched...in two career starts at home vs. the Pale Hose, Pineda is 1-1, 2.25 ERA (12.0 IP, 3 ER) while holding batters to a .244 average (11-for-45).

☞ Over seven starts against AL Central opponents this season, Pineda is 3-1, 3.92 ERA (39.0 IP, 17 ER) with three walks and 36 strikeouts...however, in his career he is 12-12, 3.86 ERA (184.1 IP, 79 ER) with 32 walks and 180 strikeouts over 31 games (all starts).

☞ The last time Pineda faced the White Sox on his home turf came September 24, 2015 as a member of the New York Yankees...he earned the win after tossing 6.0 innings of one-run ball with eight hits, zero walks and six strikeouts.

FINALLY HOME: He is making his first start at home since July 21 after three consecutive starts on the road (at CWS, MIA, and TEX)...he has fared well when pitching on his home turf this season posting a 2-3 record with a 4.07 ERA (59.2 IP, 27 ER) in 11 starts at Target Field as opposed to a 6-2 record with a 4.33 ERA (62.1 IP, 30 ER) over 11 starts on the road.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE OODRIZZI [SEASON: 13-5, 3.50 ERA // CAREER: 60-53, 3.90 ERA]

Oodorizzi will take the ball in the series finale tomorrow against the White Sox...did not factor into the decision in his last start on August 16 vs. the Rangers after allowing three runs on five hits in 5.2 innings...brings a 13-5 record into tomorrow's start (T-6th most wins in the American League)...making his second start against the White Sox this season...he last faced Chicago-AL on May 26 at Target Field where he earned the win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings with one hit and nine strikeouts...is 2-2 and owns a lifetime ERA of 2.95 (39.2 IP, 13 ER) against the Pale Hose...the 2.95 ERA against the White Sox is the lowest ERA against any AL Central opponent he's faced over his career.

CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
