THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game homestand with a loss and a win to the White Sox the last two nights...today they will complete the three-game series against Chicago...after tomorrow's off-day, the Twins will host the Tigers for three over the weekend...the Twins have 36 games remaining, 24 of which are against teams with a record under .500.

RALLY SQUIRREL GOES FULL NELSON ON SOX: The Twins beat the White Sox last night by a score of 14-4, scoring seven runs in the eighth inning...Michael Pineda (9-5) was the starter and winner, allowing four runs on six hits in 7.0 innings pitched and threw 79.5% of his pitches for strikes (70/88)...the offense recored 14 hits, four from Nelson Cruz, who recored three doubles and a home run...C.J. Cron, Max Kepler and Cruz each drove in three runs apiece.
☛ Three previous players in the modern era have had four XBH after turning 39-years-old: Bob Thurman (39.95 in 1956), Dave Winfield (39.192 in 1991) and Rickey Henderson (40.103 in 1999).

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the 13th of 19 times this season...the Twins are 8-4 against Chicago this season, going 4-1 at Target Field and 4-3 at Guaranteed Rate Field...the Twins are 12-4 in the last 16 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 32-18 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

☛ Miguel Sanó is hitting .400 (16-for-40) with six home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.330 OPS in 11 games vs. the White Sox this season.

☛ Max Kepler is hitting .385 (15-for-39) with four doubles, eight home runs, 20 RBI and a 1.521 OPS in nine games against Chicago this season...six multi-hit games.

☛ Nelson Cruz is hitting .528 (19-for-36) with five doubles, eight home runs, 20 RBI and a 1.897 OPS in nine games against the Sox this season...has six multi-hit games and six multi-RBI games.

☛ Since 1970, eight different players have hit eight-plus homers vs. the Sox in one season: Albert Belle (9 in 1995), Juan González (9 in 2001), Brian Dozier (8 in 2016), Justin Morneau (8 in 2007), Eddie Murray (8 in 1987), Jim Thome (8 in 1997) and Kepler/Cruz now...Cruz and Kepler both rank in the top 8 all-time in single-season slugging % against the Sox:

EXTRA SOX: Polanco's home run last night was the 29th by the Twins against the White Sox this season, setting the franchise record for single-season home runs vs. the Sox, previously held by the 1958 Washington Senators (27)...there are seven games between these two remaining...below are the Twins all-time most single-season homers vs. one team:

MAX POWER: 31 of Max Kepler's 34 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, ahead of Ronald Acuña Jr. (28)...five players have hit as many as 31 home runs from the leadoff spot since 2012 in a single season: Charlie Blackmon (37 in 2017), Francisco Lindor (37 in 2018), Brian Dozier (34 in 2017), George Springer (34 in 2017) and Mookie Betts (32 in 2018)...since the start of 2018, he ranks fifth among AL players in homers from the leadoff spot, despite just 384 at-bats there (Lindor leads with 58 HR in 1088 AB's)...single-season club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Dozier in 2017 (Kepler 2nd).

☛ Along with Nelson Cruz's 33 home runs, they are one of two pairs of teammates in baseball with 33-plus homers (Acuña Jr. 35 and Freeman 33)...second set of teammates with club history (since 1961) with 33-plus, joining 1963 teammates Harmon Killebrew (45), Bob Allison (35) and Jimmie Hall (33).

CRUZIN' UP THE LIST: After two doubles and a home run last night, Nelson Cruz has six games with at least three extra-base hits, three more than the next group of five players, each with three (Story, Devers, Benintendi, Bell and Báez)...Cruz has hit 33 home runs, the fourth most in baseball...17 of those home runs have been hit since the All-Star break, the most in baseball...he is on pace to hit 42 home runs and record 102 RBI...below is where Cruz ranks on baseball's all-time home run list:

CAVE, MAN: Jake Cave enters tonight with an eight-game hitting streak, tying his career-high, done twice previously (July 5-13, 2018 & September 23, 2018-March 31, 2019)...during the current streak he is hitting .500 (14-for-28) with five multi-hit games, four doubles and an OPS of 1.176...in fact, in his last 25 games, he is hitting .361 (22-for-61) with five doubles, two home runs and a .970 OPS, raising his batting average 104 points in that span (.161 to .265).

SEVEN GOING ON 20: Jorge Polanco hit his 19th home run last night...Twins have six players with 20-plus homers (Kepler - 34, Cruz - 33, Rosario - 27, Garver - 23, Sanó - 23, Cron - 20)...the MLB record for 20-plus homer players in seven, done by the 2018 Dodgers, 2017 Orioles, 2010 Blue Jays, 2009 Yankees, 2005 Rangers, 2000 Blue Jays and 1996 Orioles...additionally, Jonathan Schoop has 17 homers and Marwin Gonzalez has 14. (credit Elias Sports Bureau)

HBD, AD!: Infielder Ehire Adrianza is celebrating his 30th birthday today...he has appeared in three career major league games on his birthday, one in 2015 and two last season in a doubleheader at Guaranteed Rate Field...in those three games, he combined to go 0-for-3 with two walks, two runs and a hit-by-pitch.

ON THE BRINK OF A GRAND: Odorizzi enters today's game with 995.2 career innings pitched, 4.1 shy of the 1000-inning plateau...should he reach the milestone, he'll become the 63rd active pitcher with at least 1000.0 career innings (2nd Twin, as Kyle Gibson has 1066.0).

WHEN STARS ALIGN: The Twins have won all four games when Odorizzi has started opposite a fellow All-Star (as he will today, against the White Sox' Lucas Giolito), while he is personally 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA (24.0 IP, 7 ER).

☞ Odorizzi outduelled Houston's Justin Verlander in a 1-0 win on April 29, departed tied 3-3 in an eventual 6-4 victory over Tampa Bay and Charlie Morton on June 26, left with a 3-1 lead before the Twins defeated Mike Soroka and Atlanta on August 5, and turned in a solid effort last Friday in Texas, as Minnesota rallied for a 4-3 win over Mike Minor and the Rangers.

A BAKER'S DOZEN OF WINS: Odorizzi has set a career high with 13 wins (13-5 in 24 starts), surpassing his 11 victories for Tampa Bay in 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts)...the first-time All-Star is tied for sixth in the AL in wins, while ranking eighth in FIP (3.85), ninth in opponents' batting average (.231, 108-for-468), 10th in strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (career-best 9.36, 131 SO in 126.0 IP), 10th in ERA (3.50; 126.0 IP, 49 ER), 10th in opponents' OPS (.685) and 15th in WHIP (1.22).

A RETURN TO FORM: Jake's last four starts -- all Twins wins -- have harkened back to his All-Star form, as he is 2-0 with a 1.96 ERA (23.0 IP, 5 ER), 10 walks, 23 strikeouts and a .227/.306/.352 opponents' slash line (20-for-88 with 1 home run).

☞ Odorizzi pitched in 97-degree heat last Friday night in Arlington, when he did not factor in the decision for a 4-3 Twins win...limited the Rangers to one run on three hits through 5.0 innings, but did not make it out of the sixth...was an out away from stranding a leadoff double, but issued a full count walk and two-run double that gave Texas a 3-2 lead...Jonathan Schoop's two-run homer in the seventh lifted the Twins.

THE TWO JAKES: Odorizzi is trying to craft a stretch drive to mirror how his season began...in his first 14 starts (through June 15), Jake led the AL with a 2.24 ERA (76.1 IP, 19 ER) and 10 wins...over his next six (June 20 - July 24), he posted an 8.44 ERA (26.2 IP, 25 ER) and won just once...as noted, Jake's returned to form his last four trips to the hill...a closer look at the three stretches:

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the American League against right-handed hitters, yielding a league-low .171 batting average (42-for-245)...he ranks third with a .545 OPS vs. righties.

SOLAR POWERED: Odorizzi is making a perfect 5-0 with an AL-best 1.30 ERA (34.2 IP, 5 ER) in six day starts...however, after making six of his first 13 starts in the daytime, this will be Jake's first start under the sun since June 9, after 11 straight at night.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Twins have won nine of Odorizzi's 12 starts this season at Target Field, while he is personally 7-1 with a 3.29 ERA (68.1 IP, 25 ER) here at home...he has struck out 78 batters (10.27 per 9.0 IP) against just 22 walks at home (3.55 SO/BB ratio), while holding opponents to a .232/.290/.413 slash line (60-for-259, with 11 home runs).

3RD TIME NOT A CHARM: Jake has held opposing hitters to a .201 batting average (38-for-189), 19 extra-base hits and a .616 OPS the first time through a lineup, then a .220 mark (41-for-186) with 11 XHB and a .637 OPS the second time...however, when navigating a lineup for a third time, Odorizzi has been touched for a .312 avg. (29-for-93), 12 XHB and a .922 OPS.

FRIDAY'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS [SEASON: 10-6, 3.37 ERA // CAREER: 39-32, 4.16 ERA]

Berrios will take the mound Friday night in the opener of a three-game set against Detroit...entering play today, José is tied for fifth in the AL with 17 quality starts and ranks seventh with a 3.37 ERA (157.2 IP, 59 ER)...his ERA has risen 0.57 points (from 2.80) over his last three starts (16.0 IP, 15 ER; 8.44 ERA)...defeated the Tigers 6-4 here on April 14, allowing two earned runs over 6.2 innings pitched...owns a career 4-1 mark with a 6.25 ERA (36.0 IP, 25 ER) against Detroit, but is 4-0, 2.33 (27.0 IP, 7 ER) in his last five efforts.

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
