THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-2 through three games on their six-game seven-day homestand...tonight the Twins will begin a three-game series with the Tigers...following Sunday afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to Chicago for an off-day, followed by three vs. the White Sox August 27-29, four vs. the Tigers August 30-September 2 and three vs. the Red Sox September 3-5...the Twins have 35 games remaining, 23 of which are against teams with a record under .500 .

TWINS SHUTOUT BY SOX: The Twins lost to the White Sox on Wednesday afternoon by a score of 4-0, just their second shutout of the season...Jake Odorizzi (13-6) was the starter and loser, allowing four runs ( 3 earned) on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the bullpen combined for 4.0 scoreless innings...the offense recorded just three hits with no walks and 12 strikeouts...Jonathan Schoop has the only extra-base hit, doubling in the eighth inning.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the 10th of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone are 6-3 vs. Detroit thus far, 4-2 at Target Field and 2-1 at Comerica Park...Twins have won eight of their last 11 over the Tigers and 12 of their last 16, dating back to August 19...Twins are 5-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last five, home or away. क C.J. Cron is hitting . 325 (39-for-120) with seven doubles, nine home runs and 30 RBI in 30 career games vs. Detroit...he has seven homers and 21 RBI vs. DET in his last 17 games. © Twins have scored 151 runs against the Tigers since the start of last season, their most for any opponent....also the most Tigers pitchers have allowed to any team since.
क Since 2017, Minnesota has gone 29-18 against Detroit and has a +77 run differential in those games...this is the Twins best run differential versus any opponent since, and the Tigers only have a worse mark against the Indians (-169)

MAX POWER: 31 of Max Kepler's 34 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, ahead of Ronald Acuña Jr. (29)...five players have hit as many as 31 home runs from the leadoff spot since 2012 in a single season: Charlie Blackmon (37 in 2017), Francisco Lindor (37 in 2018), Brian Dozier (34 in 2017), George Springer (34 in 2017) and Mookie Betts (32 in 2018)...since the start of 2018, he ranks fifth among AL players in homers from the leadoff spot, despite just 388 at-bats there (Lindor leads with 58 HR in 1096 AB's)...single-season club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Dozier in 2017 (Kepler 2nd).
$\Phi$ Along with Nelson Cruz's 33 home runs, they are one of three pairs of teammates in baseball with 33 -plus homers (Acuña Jr. 36/Freeman 34 and Bellinger 42/Muncy 33)...second set of teammates with club history (since 1961) with 33-plus, joining 1963 teammates Harmon Killebrew (45), Bob Allison (35) and Jimmie Hall (33).

CRUZIN' UP THE LIST: Nelson Cruz has hit 33 home runs, the fourth most in the AL... 17 of those home runs have been hit since the All-Star break, the most in baseball...he is on pace to hit 42 home runs and record 102 RBI....below is where Cruz ranks on baseball's all-time home run list

BERRÍOS SCUFFLES, BUT OFFENSE TRIUMPHS IN TEXAS: Amidst a 97 degree starting temperature down in Arlington last Saturday, 2019 All-Star José Berríos fought his command and struggled through 4.1 innings of seven-run ball, but fortunately for him only three of those runs were earned, in lieu of a Miguel Sano error in the second inning...the Twins overcame the right-hander's off-night, scoring 12 runs in a 12-7 win...over his last three starts, he owns an 8.44 ERA ( 16.0 IP, 15 ER) following a 12-start stretch in which he went 4-3 with a 2.31 ERA ( $78.0 \mathrm{IP}, 20 \mathrm{ER}$ ), from May 24-July 31.
क After being handed a 6-0 lead in the top of the first inning, Berrios immediately returned the favor in the bottom half as Danny Santana hit his first of two home runs on the night, a tworun homer to right...was stung for four more runs in the second frame, following an error by Sanó, as a single by Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Santana's second two-run home run brought the Rangers to within two runs....he settled down for the third and fourth innings, allowing just one hit, but issued a bases-loaded walk in the fourth inning, bumping him from the game. © Marked the shortest start of the season for Berríos, and his shortest since going just 4.0 innings back on Sept. 1, 2018, also in Arlington ( 29 starts in between).

Berríos is tied for fifth in the American Beaue (T-10th in MLB) with 17 quality starts, while 18 out of his 25 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including nine $7.0+$ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 96 career starts, Berríos has thrown 47 quality starts ( 49.0 percent).

MOTOWN MAKINA: José is making his eighth career start (2nd this season), against the Tigers...enters with a lifetime 6.25 ERA ( $36.0 \mathrm{IP}, 25 \mathrm{ER}$ ) against them, but a large part those earned runs came in his first two career starts in Detroit ( 0.2 IP-7 ER \& 3.1 IP-6 ER)
$\Phi$ Faced these Tigers back on April 14 here at Target Field, earning his second win of the season after tossing 6.2 IP, allowing two runs (both on a Gordon Beckham home run) on four hits with seven strikeouts in a 6-4 victory.
$\Phi$ The aforementioned 0.2 IP, 7 ER start against the Tigers was his fourth big league appearance back on May 16, 2016...also made his lone career appearance out of the bullpen against the Tigers on Sept. 29, 2017 here at home, throwing 1.1 IP and scattering two hits.
