THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-3 through four games on their six-game, seven-day homestand...tonight the Twins will play the second of three with the Tigers...following tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to Chicago for an off-day, followed by three vs. the White Sox August 27-29, four vs. the Tigers August 30-September 2 and three vs. the Red Sox September 3-5...Twins have gone 9-14 at home since the All-Star break.

TIGERS TAKE IT TO TWINS: The Twins lost to the Tigers last night by a score of 9-6...José Berríos (10-7) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on 10 hits in 5.1 innings pitched - his fifth loss in his last seven decisions...the offense recorded nine hits, including four home runs, two from Jake Cave (1st career multi-HR) and two from Miguel Sanó (7th career multi-HR).

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have recalled right-handed pitcher Cody Stashak from Triple-A Rochester and have optioned right-handed pitcher Ryne Harper to Rochester...Stashak, who will be in his third stint with the Twins this season, has posted a 5-0, 1.44 ERA (25.0 IP, 4 ER) in 14 games (2 starts) this season at Triple-A...he has appeared in six games for the Twins this season, going 0-1, 5.40 ERA (8.1 IP, 5 ER), no walks and nine strikeouts...to make room for Stashak, the Twins have optioned Ryne Harper to Rochester...in 56 games Harper went 3-2, 3.65 ERA (49.1 IP, 20 ER), nine walks, 45 strikeouts and one save.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the 11th of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone are 6-4 vs. Detroit thus far, 4-3 at Target Field and 2-1 at Comerica Park...Twins have won eight of their last 12 over the Tigers and 12 of their last 17, dating back to August 19...Twins are 5-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last six, home or away.

♣ C.J. Cron is hitting .325 (39-for-120) with seven doubles, nine home runs and 30 RBI in 30 career games vs. Detroit...he has seven homers and 21 RBI vs. DET in his last 17 games.

♣ Since 2017, Minnesota has gone 29-19 against Detroit and has a +74 run differential in those games...this is the Twins best run differential versus any opponent since, and the Tigers only have a worse mark against the Indians (-98).

♣ DID YOU KNOW?: Just three players on the current Twins roster were ever on a Ron Gardenhire-managed team in Minnesota: Kyle Gibson started 10 games for Gardy in 2013 and 31 games in 2014...Trevor May pitched in 10 games (9 starts) in 2014...Jorge Polanco played five games in 2014.

CAVE, MAN: Jake Cave has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games (with an at-bat)...during that stretch he is hitting .485 (16-for-33) with six multi-hit games, four doubles, two home runs and an OPS of 1.328...in fact, in his last 27 games, he is hitting .364 (24-for-66) with five doubles, four home runs and a 1.063 OPS, raising his batting average 109 points in that span (.161 to .270).

SANÓ DOUBT ABOUT IT: Miguel Sanó is hitting .281 (47-for-167) with nine doubles, one triple, 16 home runs, 39 RBI and 28 walks in his last 48 games since June 28, that includes a .388 OBP/.635 SLG/1.022 OPS...since that date, his .635 slugging percentage ranks eighth in the AL and his 1.022 OPS ranks 10th.

(credit Elias Sports Bureau)

Last night's multi-homer games from Cave and Sanó gave the Twins 26 instances in which a player has a multi-homer game this season, setting an MLB record...previous record was 24, held by the 1961 Yankees, 2018 Yankees and 1966 Braves...the previous Twins record was 17 in 1986.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1981, in his first major league game, Kent Hrbek hit a 12th inning home run, giving the Twins a 3-2 victory over the Yankees...he became the fifth player in club history to homer in his first major league game (12 now)...Hrbek finished his career with 293 home runs, second most in Twins history, trailing only Harmon Killebrew (475).

TWINS ON A STICK: This morning Mitch Garver and Taylor Rogers went to the Minnesota State Fair to participate in a wool-packing contest with Minnesota State Fair Agrilympics and the Moo Booth...the Minnesota Twins Experience booth at the Minnesota State Fair is located on the south end of Cooper Street at Judson Avenue, next to the International Bazaar.

The first 10,000 fans in attendance tonight receive the third in a set of four commemorative Joe Mauer bobbleheads...today's features Mauer with his American League MVP, Gold Glove and Silver Slugger Awards from his historic 2009 season.
 Earlier today Nelson Cruz led the pre-game Skol Chant and sounded the Gjallarhorn at U.S. Bank Stadium before the Vikings and Cardinals pre-season game...Cruz also raised the "12 Flag" at CenturyLink Field in Seattle in 2015.

LAST TIME OUT: Gibson was the starter and loser his last time out on August 19 vs Chicago-AL, as he allowed five runs (all earned) on six hits with a home run, a walk and four strikeouts in a 6-4 defeat...marked the 12th time this season he's lasted 6.0-plus innings...gave up just one hit over his first two innings until a four-run four-hit third inning gave the White Sox a 4-2 lead...following a strikeout to James McCann, Matt Skole and Yolmer Sánchez knocked back-to-back singles before another single from Ryan Goins plated Skole for the Sox' first run of the game...a three-run home run from José Abreu put four on the board for the Pale Hose before Gibby exited after tossing perfect fourth, fifth and sixth innings.

P Has now allowed 17 runs (15 earned) on 22 hits over four starts in the month of August,

the most runs he's given up in a month this season and the most since August of last year (22 runs, 17 earned).

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 26 games, Gibson has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (3 games), Castro (9 games) and Garver (14 games)...below is a breakdown of how he has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches:

AGAINST THE TIGERS: The right-hander is making his 21st career start against the Tigers, second this season...owns a career record of 8-9 with a 5.30 ERA (112.0 IP, 66 ER) against them...in his last start against Detroit at on June 8 at Comerica Park, Gibson was dealt the loss after throwing 5.0 innings, allowing five runs on eight hits with eight strikeouts, in a 9-3 Twins loss...his last win over the Tigers came August 17 of last season, after he pitched 7.0 innings of three-run ball with eight hits, three walks and five strikeouts overall against Motown in 2018, he held them to just seven runs in 20.0 innings with 12 strikeouts...is a career 4-4 with a 5.84 ERA when facing them at Target Field

GROUND POUND: Since 2014, nobody has induced more ground ball double plays than Gibson, who has 133 over 1015.0 IP in that span...so far this season, Gibby has continued the trend, recording 14 GIDPs, tied for eighth-best in the American League, and the best on the Twins... in fact, he averages 0.91 GIDPs per 9.0 IP, ninth-best in the AL, 18th in the Majors.
