THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-3 through five games on their six-game, seven-day homestand...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale with Detroit...following the game, the Twins will travel to Chicago for an off-day tomorrow, followed by three vs. the White Sox Tuesday-Thursday, four vs. the Tigers Friday-Monday and three vs. the Red Sox September 3-5...Twins have gone 10-14 at home since the All-Star break.

TWINS EVEN IT BACK OUT: The Twins beat the Tigers last night by a score of 8-5...Kyle Gibson (12-6) was the starter and winner, allowing five runs (4 earned) on 10 hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Taylor Rogers earned his 20th save with 1.1 scoreless innings...the offense recorded 11 hits, including home runs from Max Kepler (leadoff, 35), Miguel Sanó (26) and Jake Cave (5)...the game was played in front of 39,429 which marked the 10th sellout of the season.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the 12th of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone 7-4 vs. Detroit thus far, 5-3 at Target Field and 2-1 at Comerica Park...Twins have won nine of their last 13 over the Tigers and 13 of their last 18, dating back to August 19...Twins are 5-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last six, home or away.

SAUCE ON THE SIDE: Mitch Garver has hit 23 home runs this season, all at catcher, the most at the position in all of baseball, ahead of Gary Sánchez (22)...23 homers as catcher are tied for second-most in club history (Joe Mauer in 2009), trailing only Earl Battey's 26 in 1963... (Mauer totaled 28 in MVP season)...Garver's .627 SLG is the best in club history for a catcher, and it is the fourth-best single season SLG by a catcher since data is available back to 1974 (min. 250 PA as catcher).

SCHOOP AND THE LLWS: Today's second baseman, Jonathan Schoop, was born in Willemstad Curacao...the 27-year-old participated in the Little League World Series twice, and he helped win the title for his country back in 2004...Schoop went 2-for-3 with an RBI, and recorded the save in the championship game against the team from Thousand Oaks, CA...was teammates with Oakland's Jurickson Profar, whose little brother, Judrick, is on the current squad. ☞ Curacao will play Eastbank, LA at 2:10 P.M. CT on ABC for the LLWS championship.

SANÓ DOUBT ABOUT IT: Miguel Sanó is hitting .281 (48-for-171) with nine doubles, one triple, 17 home runs, 42 RBI and 28 walks in his last 49 games since June 28, including a .385 OBP/.643 SLG/1.028 OPS...since that date, his 1.028 OPS ranks 10th in baseball.

A SOUTHPAW STORY: The Twins are hitting .292 (351-for-1203) with 57 doubles, 75 home runs, 107 walks and an .885 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average, slugging (.531) and OPS vs. lefties. ☞ Mitch Garver is hitting .310 (26-for-84)...Max Kepler is hitting .293 (39-for-133), with an .871 OPS that ranks second in the American League among left-handed batters.

7 FOR 20: Jorge Polanco has 19 home runs...Twins have six players with 20-plus homers (Kepler - 35, Cruz - 33, Rosario - 27, Garver - 23, Sanó - 26, Cron - 20)...the MLB record for 20-plus homer players is seven, done by the 2018 Dodgers, 2017 Orioles, 2010 Blue Jays, 2009 Yankees, 2005 Rangers, 2000 Blue Jays and 1996 Orioles...additionally, Jonathan Schoop has 17 homers and Marwin Gonzalez has 14. (credit Elias Sports Bureau) ☞ The 2019 Twins currently own a .501 team slugging percentage, which would be the highest in baseball history, breaking the record of .491 set by the 2003 Boston Red Sox.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins have announced that outfielder Alex Kirilloff and Bailey Ober have been named Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Kirilloff, 21, played in seven games for Double-A Pensacola this week, hitting .444 (12-for-27) with one double, one home run, five RBI and a 1.075 OPS...Kirilloff was drafted by the Twins 15th overall in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and represented the Twins at the SiriusXM Futures Game in Cleveland this summer...Ober, 24, made one start for the Blue Wahoos on Wednesday at Mississippi, pitching 7.0 shutout innings with three hits, no walks and 12 strikeouts...Ober was drafted by the Twins in the 12th round of the 2017 MLB Draft out of College of Charleston.

IS THIS HEAVEN? NO, IT'S IOWA: Byron Buxton, who has missed the last 21 with left shoulder subluxation, will begin his rehab assignment with Single-A Cedar Rapids today...Buxton played for the Kernels in 2013, batting .341 with 8 HR and 55 RBI in 68 games...he was named the MWL Prospect and Player of the Year for 2013 and led all of MLB that season with 18 triples...the Kernels host Peoria at 2:05 today and complete their current homestand on Friday.

ALL HIS EXES WERE IN TEXAS: Returning to Globe Life Park for the first time as a visiting pitcher, Pérez was right at home as he spun 5.0 innings of two-run ball against his former team, guiding the Twins to a 6-3 win last Sunday, despite not factoring into the decision...the lefty was dominant early, not allowing a hit until the third inning, but struggled through the fourth inning as the Rangers scored two runs on four hits, punctuated by a Jeff Mathis two-out RBI single...threw 100 pitches in the outing, 65 for strikes.

☞ It was just the second time in his career (166 games, 150 starts) throwing at least 100 pitches while lasting 5.0 innings or less, the other coming back on July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore (4.1 IP, 102 pitches in a 10-6 loss).

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .236 (71-for-301) with an OPS of .705 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .309 average (68-for-220) with an .830 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .272 (34-for-125) with nine XBH and 48 RBI with RISP, including .292 (19-for-65) with 25 RBI with RISP and two outs.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 25 games, Pérez has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (4 games), Castro (9 games) and Garver (12 games)...below is a breakdown how the left-hander has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches, courtesy of Baseball Reference:

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact in 2019, as referenced by the 85.0 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, the second lowest in baseball behind Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough (83.8 MPH), with a minimum of 300 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 149 feet, fourth-best in the American League.

☞ Pérez also ranks in the 93rd percentile in opponents' hard hit percentage (5th in baseball, 29.6%, min. 300 batted balls).

ANTE LOS TIGRES: Pérez is making his second start against the Tigers this season, sixth career (also 1 relief appearance)...brings a 6.04 career ERA (28.1 IP, 19 ER) against them into this game, and hasn't defeated them since August 14, 2017.

☞ When he faced these Tigers on May 12 here at Target Field, he was handed the loss despite limiting them to just three runs on four hits with seven strikeouts over 5.0 innings pitched...he yielded two home runs that afternoon, one to now-Chicago Cub Nicholas Castellanos (2-run) and another to Brandon Dixon (solo).

☞ Since May 13, the Tigers have gone 21-68.

STATCAST FUN: Pérez has seen many positive changes in his performance on the mound this year compared to his 2018 season...his four-seamer has seen a 1.5 MPH increase as referenced by his 92.8 average velocity from last year, to a 94.3 average this year...the increased velocity has, in part, led to his 111 strikeouts, just four shy of his career-high 115, set back in 2017.

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
