ALL HIS EXES WERE IN TEXAS: Returning to Globe Life Park for the first time as a visiting pitcher, Pérez was right at home as he spun 5.0 innings of two-run ball against his former team, guiding the Twins to a $6-3$ win last Sunday, despite not factoring into the decision...the lefty was dominant early, not allowing a hit until the third inning, but struggled through the fourth inning as the Rangers scored two runs on four hits, punctuated by a Jeff Mathis two-out RBI single...threw 100 pitches in the outing, 65 for strikes.
I It was just the second time in his career (166 games, 150 starts) throwing at least 100 pitches while lasting 5.0 innings or less, the other coming back on July 30,2017 vs. Baltimore (4.1 IP, 102 pitches in a 10-6 loss).

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the windup, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .236 (71-for-301) with an OPS of .705 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .309 average (68-for-220) with an .830 OPS when pitching out of the stretch....with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting . 272 ( 34 -for-125) with nine XBH and 48 RBI with RISP, including 292 (19-for-65) with 25 RBI with RISP and two outs.

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact in 2019, as referenced by the 85.0 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, the second lowest in baseball behind Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough ( 83.8 MPH ), with a minimum of 300 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 149 feet, fourth-best in the American League.
Pérez also ranks in the 93rd percentile in opponents' hard hit percentage (5th in baseball, $29.6 \%$, min. 300 batted balls).

ANTE LOS TIGRES: Pérez is making his second start against the Tigers this season, sixth career (also 1 relief appearance)...brings a 6.04 career ERA (28.1 IP, 19 ER ) against them into this game, and hasn't defeated them since August 14, 2017.
$\Phi$ When he faced these Tigers on May 12 here at Target Field, he was handed the loss despite limiting them to just three runs on four hits with seven strikeouts over 5.0 innings pitched...he yielded two home runs that afternoon, one to now-Chicago Cub Nicholas Castellanos (2-run) and another to Brandon Dixon (solo).
$\Phi$ Since May 13 , the Tigers have gone 21-68
STATCAST FUN: Pérez has seen many positive changes in his performance on the mound this year compared to his 2018 season...his four-seamer has seen a 1.5 MPH increase as referenced by his 92.8 average velocity from last year, to a 94.3 average this year...the increased velocity has, in part, led to his 111 strikeouts, just four shy of his career-high 115 , set back in 2017.
