**THE TWINS:** After completing their six-game homestand with a record of 3-3 (1-2 vs. Chicago-AL and 2-1 vs. Detroit), the Twins began their 10-game roadtrip with a win over the Sox last night...tonight the Twins will continue the trip with the second of three vs. the White Sox through tomorrow afternoon...after tomorrow's series finale, the Twins will travel to Detroit for four vs. the Tigers Friday-Monday, followed by three vs. the Red Sox next Tuesday-Thursday...Twins have won five straight road games.

**BIG MIKE, BOMBAS AND BULLPENS:** The Twins beat the White Sox last night at Guaranteed Rate Field by a score of 3-1...Michael Pineda (10-5) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched - his fourth straight win, tying his career-high...the bullpen combined for 4.0 scoreless innings as Dyson, Duffey and Romo each earned holds as Taylor Rogers earned his 21st save...the offense recorded eight hits including home runs from Marwin Gonzalez (15) and Jonathan Schoop (19).

**80'S NIGHT:** Last night the Twins earned their 80th win...below are the Twins quickest teams to 80 victories (since 1961) - credit Elias Sports Bureau:

**TWINS AND SOX:** The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the 15th of 19 times this season...the Twins are 9-5 against Chicago this season, going 4-2 at Target Field and 5-3 at Guaranteed Rate Field...the Twins are 13-5 in the last 18 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 33-19 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017, their most wins vs. any opponent since.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .362 (17-for-47) with six home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.178 OPS in 13 games vs. the White Sox this season...has hit safely in 11 of the 13.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .500 (22-for-44) with five doubles, eight home runs, 20 RBI and a 1.691 OPS in 11 games against the Sox this season...has seven multi-hit games and six multi-RBI games...Cruz's 1.159 slugging percentage is the fifth best all-time for a single-season vs. the White Sox.

☞ Since 1970, eight different players have hit eight-plus homers vs. the Sox in one season: Albert Belle (9 in 1995), Juan González (9 in 2001), Brian Dozier (8 in 2016), Justin Morneau (8 in 2007), Eddie Murray (8 in 1987), Jim Thome (8 in 1997) and Max Kepler/Cruz now.

**EXTRA SOX:** The Twins have 31 homers against the White Sox this season, most in franchise history...there are five games between these two remaining...below are the Twins most single-season homers vs. one team all-time:

**ROGER THAT:** Taylor Rogers' twin brother Tyler made his major league debut last night with San Francisco, pitching 1.0 scoreless inning against Arizona...they are now the 10th pair of twin brothers to play in Major League Baseball, \*seventh to play in same season\*:

- George (1909-10) and Bill Hunter (1912)
- Joe (1915) and Red Shannon (1915-26)\*
- Ray (1920-26) and Roy Grimes (1920)\*
- Bubber (1920-35) and Claude Jonnard (1921-29)\*

- Stan (1980) and Stu Cliburn (1984-88)

**CAUTION, HIGH WATER:** The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 29 games over .500, marking the first time being 29 over since games of September 26, 2010 at 92-63...the last time they were 30 games over was through games of September 25, 2010 at 92-62...the Twins high in 2010 was 32 over on September 24 at 92-60.

**20-BOMBA SQUAD:** Jorge Polanco and Jonathan Schoop each have 19 home runs...Twins have six players with 20-plus homers (Kepler - 35, Cruz - 33, Rosario - 27, Sanó - 26, Garver - 23, Cron - 21)...the MLB record for 20-plus homer players is seven, done by the 2018 Dodgers, 2017 Orioles, 2010 Blue Jays, 2009 Yankees, 2005 Rangers, 2000 Blue Jays and 1996 Orioles... additionally, Marwin Gonzalez has 15. (credit Elias Sports Bureau)

**ROAD RULES:** The Twins have won five straight on the road and nine of their last 11 away from Target Field...their season-high road win-streak is six, from May 6-18...they have gone 41-22 on the road this season, tied for second most road wins in baseball with Atlanta, trailing Tampa Bay (42-26)...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 388-291...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...41 wins marks their most on the road since 2017 (44-37), the club record being 51 (30 losses) in 1965...they are on pace to win 52 road games.

**LEADING OFF...THE CATCHER...** Mitch Garver has led off 18 times this season...he is hitting .260 (19-for-73) with three doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 16 RBI, 17 runs scored, a .337 OBP and a .995 OPS from that spot...he leads baseball in catchers at-bats from the leadoff spot (73), ahead of Tampa Bay's Travis d'Arnaud (58)...eight home runs for a catcher at the top spot in the order is the most since Paul Lo Duca had 14 for the Dodgers in 2001.

**CAREER YEAR FOR THE ALL-STAR:** Odorizzi has set a career high with 13 wins (13-6 in 25 starts), surpassing his 11 victories for Tampa Bay in 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts)...the first-time All-Star is tied for eighth in the AL in wins and winning percentage (.684), while ranking eighth in FIP (3.77), ninth in opponents' OPS (.690), 10th in opponents' batting average (.236, 116-for-491), ERA (3.57; 131.0 IP, 52 ER) and in strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (career-best 9.41, 137 SO in 131.0 IP), and 15th in WHIP (1.24).

☞ The Twins' .680 winning percentage (17-8) with Odorizzi on the mound is tops among the club's starting rotation.

**SOMETIMES, THEY FIND HOLES:** This will be Odorizzi's second straight start against the White Sox, after allowing four runs (three earned) in 5.0 innings and taking the 4-0 loss in the series finale a week ago today at Target Field (Aug. 21)...although he was outdone by the complete-game effort from Lucas Giolito, who tossed a three-hitter with 12 strikeouts, Jake was also victimized at key points by soft Chicago contact finding holes...an RBI-single by Matt Skole in the first inning left the bat at 67.7 MPH, while three hits during a run-scoring third registered at 78.2, 80.1 and 60.2 MPH, respectively...however, Odo did uncork a pair of wild pitches, just his third such career game (others coming with Tampa Bay, on May 15, 2015 at Minnesota and May 31, 2014 at Boston).

☞ The eight hits he allowed matched a career high in eight starts against the White Sox, tying an April 28, 2014 loss at Chicago (4.1 IP) and a June 8, 2017 win in Tampa (6.2 IP).

**BACK-TO-BACK:** This will be the fourth time this season that Odorizzi has faced the same opponent in consecutive starts...in the previous three occurrences, he has gone 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (16.0 IP, 4 ER) in the second game of the back-to-back set against the same team.

☞ After a 9-5 win April 22 at Houston, he outdueled Justin Verlander with 7.0 shutout innings in a 1-0 victory on April 22 at Target Field...following an 8-7 home win over Los Angeles-AL on May 15, he pitched 5.0 scoreless innings in an eventual 3-1 Twins victory May 20 at Angel Stadium.

☞ However, after he defeated the Royals 5-4 on June 15 at Target Field, he was tagged with a 4-1 loss June 20 in Kansas City.

**A RETURN TO FORM:** Jake's last five starts have produced four Twins wins, while he is 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA (28.0 IP, 8 ER), 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...he is trying to craft a stretch drive to mirror how his season began, as in his first 14 starts (through June 15), Odorizzi led the AL with a 2.24 ERA (76.1 IP, 19 ER) and 10 wins...over his next six (June 20 - July 24), he posted an 8.44 ERA (26.2 IP, 25 ER) and won just once...his last five trips to the hill have more closely resembled his All-Star status...a closer look at the three stretches:

**IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG:** Odorizzi has yielded just a .183 batting average (47-for-257) to right-handed hitters, third-best in the AL...he ranks fourth with a .567 OPS by righties.

**ROAD RULES:** The Twins have won all three of Odorizzi's road starts since the All-Star break (July 13 at Cleveland, July 30 at Miami and August 16 at Texas), while he is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA (16.2 IP, 5 ER) and a .203 opponents' batting average (12-for-59).

☞ He is 6-4 with a 3.75 ERA (57.2 IP, 24 ER) in 12 road starts overall this season (Twins are 8-4).

**3RD TIME NOT A CHARM:** Jake has held opposing hitters to a .207 batting average (41-for-198), 16 extra-base hits and a .618 OPS the first time through a lineup, then a .232 mark (45-for-194) with 11 XBH and a .654 OPS the second time...however, when navigating a lineup for a third time, Odorizzi has been touched for a .303 avg. (30-for-99), 13 XBH and a .903 OPS.

### FRIDAY'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS [SEASON: 10-7, 3.53 ERA // CAREER: 39-33, 4.20 ERA]

Berrios will take the mound tomorrow afternoon in the series finale...entering play today, José is tied for fifth in the AL with 17 quality starts and ranks ninth with a 3.53 ERA (163.0 IP, 64 ER)...is 0-2 with a 8.44 ERA (21.1 IP, 20 ER) in his last four starts (Twins are 1-3), as his season ERA has climbed 0.73 points (from 2.80)...has made three starts this season against the White Sox, going 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA (21.0 IP, 6 ER)...is 1-1, 3.14 (14.1 IP, 5 ER) in two starts at Guaranteed Rate Field (a 6-4 loss June 28 and a 10-3 win July 25)...is 9-2 with a 2.24 ERA (80.1 IP, 20 ER) in 12 career starts vs. Chicago-AL.
