BIG MIKE, BOMBAS AND BULLPENS: The Twins beat the White Sox last night at Guaranteed Rate Field by a score of 3-1...Michael Pineda (10-5) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched - his fourth straight win, tying his career-high...the bullpen combined for 4.0 scoreless innings as Dyson, Duffey and Romo each earned holds as Taylor Rogers earned his 21st save...the offense recorded eight hits including home runs from Marwin Gonzalez (15) and Jonathan Schoop (19).

CAREER YEAR FOR THE ALL-STAR: Odorizzi has set a career high with 13 wins (13-6 in 25 starts), surpassing his 11 victories for Tampa Bay in 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts)...the first-time All-Star is tied for eighth in the AL in wins and winning percentage (.684), while ranking eighth in FIP (3.77), ninth in opponents' OPS (.690), 10th in opponents' batting average (.236, 116-for-491), ERA (3.57; 131.0 IP, 52 ER) and in strikeouts-per- 9.0 innings (career-best $9.41,137 \mathrm{SO}$ in 131.0
IP), and 15th in WHIP (1.24). IP), and 15th in WHIP (1.24)
T The Twins' 680 winning percentage (17-8) with 0dorizzi on the mound is tops among the club's
starting rotation. starting rotation.
SOMETIMES, THEY FIND HOLES: This will be Odorizzi's second straight start against the White Sox, after allowing four runs (three earned) in 5.0 innings and taking the 4-0 loss in the series finale a week ago today at Target Field (Aug. 21)...although he was outdone by the complete-game effort from Lucas Giolito, who tossed a three-hitter with 12 strikeouts, Jake was also victimized at key points by soft Chicago contact finding holes...an RBI-single by Matt Skole in the first inning left the bat at 67.7 MPH, while three hits during a run-scoring third registered at 78.2, 80.1 and 60.2 MPH, respectively...however, Odo did uncork a pair of wild pitches, just his third such career game (others coming with Tampa Bay, on May 15, 2015 at Minnesota and May 31, 2014 at Boston).

क The eight hits he allowed matched a career high in eight starts against the White Sox, tying an
April 28, 2014 loss at Chicago (4.1 IP) and a June 8, 2017 win in Tampa ( 6.2 IP ).
BACK-TO-BACK: This will be the fourth time this season that Odorizzi has faced the same opponent in consecutive starts...in the previous three occurrences, he has gone 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA ( $16.0 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in the second game of the back-to-back set against the same team.
$\Phi$ After a 9-5 win April 22 at Houston, he outdueled Justin Verlander with 7.0 shutout innings in a 1-0 victory on April 22 at Target Field...following an 8-7 home win over Los Angeles-AL on May 15, he pitched 5.0 scoreless innings in an eventual 3-1 Twins victory May 20 at Angel Stadium. Ф However, after he defeated the Royals 5-4 on June 15 at Target Field, he was tagged with a 4-1 loss June 20 in Kansas City.

A RETURN TO FORM: Jake's last five starts have produced four Twins wins, while he is 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA (28.0 IP, 8 ER), 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...he is trying to craft a stretch drive to mirror how his season began, as in his first 14 starts (through June 15), 0dorizzi led the AL with a 2.24 ERA (76.1 IP, 19 ER) and 10 wins...over his next six (June 20 - July 24), he posted an 8.44 ERA (26.2 IP, 25 ER) and won just once...his last five trips to the hill have more closely resembled his All-Star status...a closer look at the three stretches:


IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has yielded just a .183 batting average (47-for-257) to right-handed hitters, third-best in the AL...he ranks fourth with a .567 OPS by righties.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have won all three of Odorizzi's road starts since the All-Star break (July 13 at Cleveland, July 30 at Miami and August 16 at Texas), while he is $2-0$ with a 2.70 ERA (16.2 IP 5 FR) and a 203 opponents' batting average (12-for-59).
$\Phi$ He is $6-4$ with a 3.75 ERA ( $57.2 \mathrm{IP}, 24 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 12 road starts overall this season (Twins are 8-4).
3RD TIME NOT A CHARM: Jake has held opposing hitters to a 207 batting average (41-for-198), 16 extra-base hits and a .618 OPS the first time through a lineup, then a 232 mark ( 45 -for194) with 11 XBH and a . 654 OPS the second time...however, when navigating a lineup for a third time, Odorizzi has been touched for a . 303 avg. (30-for-99), 13 XBH and a . 903 OPS.
