TWINS SECURE ANOTHER SOUTH SIDE SERIES: The Twins beat the White Sox last night by a score of 8-2... Jake Odorizzi (14-6) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 12 hits, three from Mitch Garver who added a home multi-homer game this season...Twins improved to 3-2-0 in series play over the Sox this season.

BOMBA COUNTER: After three home runs last night, the Twins now have 258 homers on the season, moving within nine of the MILB all-time record and within two of tying Texas' 2005 total for third...below is baseball's all-time single-season home run list:

7 FOR 20: Last night Jonathan Schoop hit his 20th and 21st home runs, giving the Twins seven players with 20-plus homers (Kepler 35, Cruz - 33, Rosario-27, Sanó - 26, Garver-24, Cron-21), setting a new club record ( 6 players in 1964) and tying the MLB record for most 20 -plus homer players (previous teams below)...next with 20 would be Jorge Polanco at 19 homers.

MOWED DOWN BY MOTOWN: Being opposed by Drew VerHagen, who was making his eighth career start and who owned a career ERA north of 5.00, Berríos was handed a Detroit Tigers team that had won just 38 of their first 125 games...Berríos was ultimately handed his seventh loss of the season, pitching to an unsightly 5.1 IP, 5 ER, 10 H statline, but that doesn't tell the story of his start, as he was dominant through the first five innings before things quickly unravelled in the sixth
$\Phi$ Berríos had traffic on the base paths early in the game, but never broke as he stranded four runners through the first three innings...faced the minimum through the fourth and fifth, including a double play ball from Victor Reyes, but was rocked for five runs on five hits in the sixth inning, punctuated by a Ronny Rodríguez grand slam.

- Despite the tough outing, Berríos is still tied for fifth in the American League (T-10th in MLB) with 17 quality starts, while 18 out of his 26 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including nine $7.0+$ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 97 career starts, Berríos has thrown 47 quality starts ( 48.5 percent).

WAKE ME UP WHEN SEPTEMBER STARTS: Earlier this season, Berríos made his second career appearance in an All-Star Game, and it was ultimately deserved, as he pitched to an 8-5 record with a crisp 3.00 ERA (117.0 IP, 39 ER) with 104 strikeouts and 15 home runs allowed in 18 starts...since then, he has stumbled to a 2-2 record with a 4.89 ERA ( $46.0 \mathrm{IP}, 25 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 51 strikeouts and seven homers in just eight starts.
क His month of August has been particularly brutal, as he owns an 8.44 ERA (21.1 IP, 20 ER) following a 12 -start stretch in which he went 4-3 with a 2.31 ERA (78.0 IP, 20 ER), from May 24-July 31.
Since the beginning of August, he has seen both of his fastballs dip in velocity, going from 93.6 MPH (12\% whiff) to 92.4 MPH (8\% whiff) on his four-seam fastball, and 92.7 MPH (8\% whiff) to 91.3 MPH (4\% whiff) on his two-seam fastball.
क He is no stranger to second-half swoons, as he owns a career 3.58 ERA ( 379.1 IP, 151 ER) from March-July ( 62 starts), but has pitched to a 5.56 ERA (183.0 IP, 113 ER) with 28 home runs allowed from August-October ( 37 games, 35 starts, includes postseason).

EL REY DE CHICAGO: Berríos owns a lifetime line of 9-2, 2.24 ERA ( 80.1 IP, 20 ER) with 17 walks and 84 strikeouts over 12 games (all starts) vs. the White Sox; his 2.24 ERA is the 13th-lowest ERA vs. the Pale Hose (min. 10 starts) in the Live Ball Era (1920-present)...in six starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, Berríos owns a 3.53 ERA ( 35.2 IP, 14 ER), with his last win here coming on July 25, when he threw 7.0 innings, allowing three runs ( 2 earned) on six hits in a 10-3 Twins win.
Is 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA ( 21.0 IP, 6 ER) against the White Sox this season....he pitched at least 6.2 innings in each of his starts against them and all three starts were quality starts.

## CAREER NDTES

Teamed with Jake Odorizzi (11 Ks on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks. - Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva 33 , and Boof Bonser - 30 ).
