THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game, eight-day roadtrip with a record of 5-2 (3-1 in Chicago and 2-1 in Miami), the Twins won their first game of the homestand last night the second of three vs Kansas city this weekend following this series the Twins will host Atlanta for three from Monday-Wednesday and four vs. Cleveland next weekend...the Twins have 28 home games remaining in 2019 and 25 on the road.
THE NELSON CRUZ GAME: The Twins beat the Royals last night by a score of 11-9 at Target Field...Martín Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing five runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Trevor May threw one pitch and earned the win while Sergio Romo earned his first Twins save with 1.1 scoreless innings...the offense recorded 11 hits as Nelson Cruz went 3 -for-4 with a home run, two doubles, a walk and five RBI... Twins also went 7-for-14 with runners in scoring position and left just five men on base.
TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the 11th of 19 games this season... they are 7-3 vs. KC this season, going 4-2 at Kauffman Stadium and 3-1 at Target Field... the Twins have gone $13-7$ in their last 20 vs . KC overall
क Miguel Sanó is hitting. 333 ( 32 -for- 96 ) with 35 RBI, a 402 0BP, a 677 SLG and a 1.079
OPS in his last 25 vs. Kansas City.... he has reached safely in each of his last 24 starts vs. KC
$\Phi$ Max Kepler is hitting . 343 (24-for-70) with three home runs, 12 RBI, 15 walks and a .453 OBP in his last 19 games vs. the Royals.
SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins 211 home runs are the most in baseball, 25 more than second-place Los Angeles-NL (186)...they need just 14 home runs to match their all-time record of 225 , set in 1963....below are the Twins all-time home run marks

MORE ON NELLY: Nelson Cruz drove in five runs in the Twins victory over the Royals...it is his third game this season with at least five RBI, the most among all players this season...there have only been three other players in Senators/Twins franchise history with three games of at least five RBI in a single season: Harmon Killebrew (3 in 1962), Gary Gaetti (3 in 1986) and Jason Kubel (4 in 2009). ## ROSTER MOVES: Twins announced today the following roster moves:

$\Phi$ Byron Buxton has been placed on the 10 -day IL with a left shoulder subluxation....Buxton who injured his left shoulder on Thursday in Miami, has appeared in 82 games this season hitting. 262 ( 71 -for-271) with 30 doubles, four triples, 46 RBI, 19 walks, 48 runs scored, 14 stolen bases and an . 827 OPS.
क Michael Pineda has been placed on the 10-day IL with a right triceps strain...Pineda has made 21 starts for the Twins this season, going 7-5 with a 4.15 ERA (117.0 IP, 54 ER), 23 walks, 103 strikeouts and 11 quality starts.
$\Phi$ C.J. Cron has been returned from rehab assignment and reinstated from 10-day IL... Cron, who has missed the last 12 games with right thumb inflammation, recently played in two rehab games with the GCL wins, going 1 -for- 8 with a solo home run
$\Phi$ Recalled right-handed pitcher Zack Littell from Triple-A Rochester...Littell, who appeared in three games for the Red Wings during his recent minor league stint, appeared in 14 games for the Twins this season, going 2-0 with a 4.91 ERA ( $18.1 \mathrm{IP}, 10 \mathrm{ER}$ ), six walks and 17 strikeouts.
क Recalled outfielder Jake Cave from Rochester...Cave, who played in seven games during his recent minor league stint with the Wings, has played in 35 games for the Twins this season, hitting 193 (16-for-83) with three doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and 10 walks.
$\Phi$ Left-handed pitcher Lewis Thorpe has been optioned to Rochester...Thorpe appeared in four games ( 1 start) for the Twins this season, going 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA ( 11.1 IP, 4 ER), two walks and 10 strikeouts.
A TALE OF TWO MIGGYS: Miguel Sanó is hitting. 309 ( 30 -for- 97 ) with six doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 24 RBI, 17 walks, 21 runs scored, a 412 0BP/ 670 SLG/ 1.082 OPS in his last 29 games since June $28 \ldots$...prior to that date, he was hitting . 195 ( 23 -for-118) with a 278 OBP/. 483 SLG/ 761 OPS in 31 games to begin the season.
SEAT FILLERS: The Twins have drawn $30,000+$ in 19 of their last 23 home games ( 33,448 avg.)...the season-high is 40,127 on July 24 vs. New York-AL...the Twins have sold out 169 regular season games at Target Field since 2010 ...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and eight in 2019.
STAND-UP AND SHOUT: Former Twins closer Joe Nathan is being inducted into the Twins Hall of Fame in a special pre-game ceremony this evening...Nathan pitched 16 seasons in the major leagues, including seven with the Twins from 2004-11...he finished his Twins career with a record of 24-13, 2.16 ERA (463.11P, 111 ER), 134 walks, 561 strikeouts and a club-record 260 saves in 460 games...he was named to the AL All-Star team four times for Minnesota and was the closer on three different AL Central Division championship teams. he saved 35 -plus games in six different seasons in Minnesota and led all of baseball in saves over a six-season stretch from 2004-09, saving 246 games during that time...the former right-hander pitched for five different teams over his career (SF, MIN, TEX, DET and CHC), compiling 377 saves, ranking him eighth on baseball's all-time list...more information on pages 413-420 in the Twins Media Guide.
RIP, YVONNE FOX: Yvonne Fox, late wife of former Twins executive Howard Fox, passed away recently at age 91...Howard Fox worked for the Twins in various roles for over 60 years.... Celebration of Life is scheduled for August 30 in Minnetonka Beach, MN.

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 6.0 innings last Sunday against the White Sox, allowing just one run on seven hits as the Twins won 11-1 over Chicago...held the Pale Hose scoreless through the first five innings before a trio of singles from Leury García, Yoán Moncada and Jon Jay in the sixth inning led to their first and only run of the game....he then struck out the last three batters he faced in the sixth before exiting...marked his third start in July in which he lasted 6.0+ innings while allowing three or fewer runs. $\Phi$ Received nine runs of support in the win, which ties the most runs he's had behind him this season (done twice, on May 25 vs. Chicago-AL as well as July 23 vs. NYY).
$\Phi$ Earned his 10th win of the season in his 22nd game (21st start) of the season which ties his fastest to 10 wins over his career....in 2014 he also earned his 10 th win in his 21st start of the season (2015-29th start, 2017-26th start, 2018-32nd start).

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Gibson is making his 21st career start against Kansas City, third this season.... owns a career line of 8 -5 with a 3.59 ERA ( 125.1 IP, 50 ER) against the Royals... in his last start vs. KC here on June 14, Gibson pitched 8.0 -shutout innings allowing just two hits while striking out six Royals in a $2-0$ win, as Mitch Garver delivered a two-out. two-run home run in the bottom of the eighth (tied a season-low for hits, minus his 1.0 inning stint on July 7 vs. Texas where allowed one)
$\Phi$ The Twins have won both of his starts against the Royals this season (Gibby's season debut April 3 at Kansas City, and June 14 here at Target Field), while he is 1-0 with a 3.55 ERA ( $12.2 \mathrm{IP}, 5 \mathrm{ER}$ ).
$\Phi$ Including the win here June 14 , Gibson is 5 -2 with a 3.27 ERA ( $55.0 \mathrm{IP}, 20 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in nine career starts vs. KC at Target Field (the Twins are 7-2)
$\Phi 125.1$ career IP and 20 starts are his personal most vs. any opponent...his eight wins are T-2nd most (CWS - 9, DET - 8)...since 2014, only Corey Kluber has pitched more innings vs. the Royals at 133.2 (Gibby w/ 119.1)...his 19 starts since, also second to Kluber (21).
(WWW)INNING WAYS: The Twins have gone 14-7 in Gibson's 21 starts this season (14-6, excluding his 1.0 -shutout inning as an opener July 7 vs. Texas), and his 10 total wins are tied for second on the staff with José Berríos, behind Jake Odorizzi (12)...the Twins are 29-24 in Gibson's 53 starts since the beginning of the 2018 season.
$\Phi$ Has a three-game winning streak over his last seven starts (including July 7 vs. Texas as an opener)...is $3-0$ with a 4.04 ERA ( $35.2 \mathrm{IP}, 16 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in that span, with 37 strikeouts against 11 walks...the Twins are 5-2 (5-1 in his traditional starts).

GROUND WORK: Gibson owns a 0.86 GIDP/9 this season which ranks 20th in all of baseball and 10th in the AL (minimum 20 starts)...since 2014. Gibson is first in GIDP in the majors with 130 and is second in GIDP/9 with 1.18 (Martín Pérez-1.46)...has induced 11 double plays in 2019, ranks T-10th in the AL.

SWING AND A MISS: After fanning nine White Sox batters over 6.0 innings in his last start, Gibson ranks 11 th in the AL with a career-best average of 9.13 strikeouts-per- 9.0 innings (116.1 IP, 118 SO)...he's also 12th in the AL with a 3.58 strikeout-to-walk ratio ( 33 BB ).

HOME SWEET HOME: The right-hander has posted a 6-1 record over 11 games ( 10 starts) at Target Field this season, with a 4.17 ERA ( 58.1 IP, 27 ER) and a 222 opponents' batting average ( 48 -for-216)...the Twins are 6 -3 in his traditional starts (excluding July 7 opener vs. Texas).
