THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game, eight-day roadtrip with a record of 5-2 (3-1 in Chicago and 2-1 in Miami), the Twins won the first two games of the homestand over the Royals...today the Twins will continue their season-long 10-game homestand with the third of three vs. Kansas City...tomorrow night the Twins will begin a three-game series vs. Atlanta through Wednesday, followed by four vs. Cleveland next weekend.

THE NELSON CRUZ GAME, PART II: The Twins beat the Royals last night by a score of 11-3... Kyle Gibson (11-4) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs (2 earned) on four hits in 6.2 innings pitched...C.J. Cron returned from the Injured List and went 3-for-4 with a home run...Nelson Cruz went 3-for-4 with five RBI (see more below).

ALL ABOUT THE BOOMSTICK: Historic night in Nellyville:

- ☞ Nelson Cruz has 30 home runs on the season, tied for second most in the AL...he now has 30 for the sixth straight season...actives with 30+ homer streaks include Pujols (12) from 2001-12, Encarnación (8) from 2012-19, and Cabrera (7) from 2007-13.
- ☞ Cruz's 30 home runs pass Chili Davis' 1991 total (29) for the most by a DH in club history (MLB all-time record is 54 by David Ortiz in 2006).
- ☞ Current .652 slugging percentage is the highest in club history (next: Killebrew, .606 in 1961).
- ☞ Three homers last night marked the 12th time in club history: Allison ('63), Killebrew ('63), Oliva ('73), Morneau ('07), Kepler ('16), Dozier ('16), Rosario ('17), Buxton ('17), Rosario ('18), Kepler ('19), Cruz ('19) and Cruz ('19).
- ☞ Becomes the 23rd player in baseball history with multiple three-homer games in a season (first in Twins history)...the first in MLB history with multiple after turning 39.
- ☞ After Cruz's three-homer game July 25 at CWS, he joins Doug DeCinces (8/3 & 8, 1982) and Johnny Mize (7/13 & 20, 1938) as the only players to homer three times within 10 days.
- ☞ Leads baseball in home runs since ASG (14), next players, Kepler and Mancini have nine... also leads baseball in RBI since ASG (26)
- ☞ Joins Kubel (2009) as the only two players in club history with four five+ RBI games in a season.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the 12th of 19 games this season... they are 8-3 vs. KC this season, going 4-2 at Kauffman Stadium and 4-1 at Target Field... the Twins have gone 14-7 in their last 21 vs. KC overall.

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins 216 home runs are the most in baseball, 29 more than second-place Los Angeles-NL (186)...they need just nine home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...below are the Twins all-time single-season home run totals and total multi-homer game ranks:

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins have placed right-handed pitcher Sam Dyson on the 10-day Injured List with right biceps tendinitis...Dyson, who was acquired via trade with San Francisco on Wednesday, appeared in two games for the Twins, allowing six runs on six hits...the reliever came from the Giants, in exchange for outfielder Jaylin Davis and right-handed pitchers Prelander Berroa and Kai-Wei Teng at the MLB trading deadline this week...to replace Dyson on the 25-man roster, the Twins have recalled left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer from Triple-A Rochester...Smeltzer, who will be in his fourth stint with the Twins, recently made a start for the Red Wings on Tuesday, allowing four runs on three hits in 3.0 innings pitched.

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 26 games over .500, their highest since ending the 2010 season 26 games over (.94-.68)...prior to that, their most games over .500 was 27, the day before their final game of 2010, on October 2 when they were 94-67.

SWEEPS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their eighth sweep of an opponent this season...their previous seven sweeps came: three games May 24-26 vs. CWS, three games May 20-22 at LAA, three games May 6-8 at TOR, three games April 26-28 vs. BAL, three games at BAL April 20-21, two games April 13-14 vs. DET, and two games April 2-3 at KC...Twins recorded seven sweeps all of last season...Twins are 7-7 this season when attempting to secure a sweep, going 0-5 in their last five attempts (all up 2-0 entering finale).

JERRY BELL, HOF: Jerry Bell is being inducted into the Twins Hall of Fame today, becoming the 33rd member...Bell was named the third president in Twins history in January 1987...he spent 16 years as Minnesota's Chief Executive, helping lead the team's business operations, while he was instrumental in the Twins 1987 and 1991 World Championship seasons...during his tenure, Bell led the effort to ensure the long-term viability of the Minnesota Twins and specifically oversaw the development, design, construction and opening of Target Field in 2010...other accomplishments include setting an American League attendance record in 1988, when the Twins became the first A.L. team to attract more than three million fans...he also led the development and construction of Minnesota's spring training facility, CenturyLink Sports Complex, located in Ft. Myers, Fla., which opened in 1991...in addition, Bell became the fourth recipient of the Herb Carneal Award in 2009 as presented by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: For the second straight week, the Twins have named Single-A Cedar Rapids outfielder Gilberto Celestino Twins Player of the Week...in six games for theernels, Celestino hit .458 (11-for-24) with one double, one home run, three RBI, two walks and a 1.144 OPS...Celestino was acquired by the Twins along with right-handed pitcher Jorge Alcalá near the 2018 trade deadline in exchange for right-handed pitcher Ryan Pressly...Single-A Ft. Myers right-handed pitcher Bailey Ober has been named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week...Ober made the start last Saturday, allowing one unearned run on six hits in 6.1 innings pitched, earning the win over Lakeland...the 24-year-old was drafted by the Twins in the 12th round of the 2017 MLB Draft out of College of Charleston.

WELCOME (BACK) TO THE SHOW: Smeltzer has made two starts and two relief appearances at the Major League level, posting a 2.91 ERA (21.2 IP, 7 ER), with four walks and 17 strikeouts...his last outing came in relief on July 24 against the New York Yankees, when he allowed one run on a home run over 5.0 IP...Smeltzer's first career start was his historic Major League debut against the Milwaukee Brewers on May 28...some of the highlights are listed below:

- Became the fourth Twins starter in history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1 on August 6, 2013), Anthony Swarzak (7.0 on May 23, 2009) and Eric Milton (6.0 on April 5, 1998).
- Recorded seven strikeouts, one shy of the franchise record in a debut, set by Boof Bonser on May 21, 2006 at Milwaukee...became just the fifth Twins pitcher to record seven-or-more strikeouts, joining Bonser, Yohan Pino (7 in 2014), Darrell Jackson (7 in 1978) and Bert Blyleven (7 in 1970)...was matched by Lewis Thorpe, who struck out seven in his debut against Chicago-AL on June 30, marking the first time in Senators/Twins history to have multiple rookies strikeout seven-plus batters in their debuts in the same season, and just the eighth pair in baseball history (Toronto's Trent Thornton and Jacob Waguespack did so earlier this year).
- Became just the fifth starter in Twins history to not issue a single walk in his debut, and just the second to last 6.0-plus IP and not walk a batter (Kyle Gibson, June 29, 2013)...the other starters to not issue a walk: Nik Turley (4.0 IP on June 11, 2017), Gibson, LaTroy Hawkins (1.2 IP on April 29, 1995) and Albert Williams (3.0 IP on May 7, 1980).

SMELTZER'S SMALL SAMPLE SIZE SUCCESS: Despite appearing in only four games with the big league club, Smeltzer has displayed an ability to limit damage when runners are on-base, holding opponents to an even .100 (3-for-30) batting average...among pitchers who have faced at least 30 batters with runners on-base, only a pair of relievers in Cleveland's Nick Goody (3-for-32, .094) and Miami's José Quijada (3-for-32, .094) have fared better in baseball.

LAST APPEARANCE: Smeltzer's last outing came July 24 vs. NYY, limiting the Yankees to one run (an Edwin Encarnación home run) over 5.0 innings of work...he's the first Twins pitcher to throw 5.0+ innings, within his first five career games, in a non-primary role, since Aaron Slegers relieved Fernando Romero (1.2 IP, 8 ER) on May 30, 2018 at Kansas City.

GET TO KNOW THE KID: Smeltzer was raised in New Jersey and graduated from Bishop Eustace Preparatory School in Pennsauken Township in 2014 (became the ninth New Jersey-born player, seventh pitcher to make his debut for the Twins, first since RHP Rob Delaney on Sept. 4, 2010)...was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the 33rd round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft, but chose to continue his development at Florida Gulf Coast University.

- Following his season at FGCU, the left-hander transferred to San Jacinto College North in San Jacinto, Texas, where he would go on to lead the NJCAA League 14 in ERA (1.18) and strikeouts (128), while ranking third with nine wins...won the National Junior College Athletic Association Player of the Week award for April 4-10, 2016, after throwing a complete game no-hitter in an 8-0 win over Wharton County Junior College, in which he struck out 16 batters and walked three...also threw two no-hitters in high school and one in a college summer league game.
- Smeltzer had planned to transfer to Texas Tech University, but forewent the opportunity after being drafted in the fifth round (No. 161 overall) in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers, one pick before the Toronto Blue Jays selected Cavan Biggio out of Notre Dame (son of Hall of Fame infielder Craig Biggio)...the Twins selected right-handed pitcher Jordan Balazovic (7-4, 2.78 ERA between Ft. Myers and Cedar Rapids this season) eight picks before the Dodgers selected Smeltzer.
- Spent parts of three seasons in the Dodgers organization before being traded to the Twins, along with infielder Luke Raley, for infielder Brian Dozier at last year's trade deadline...amassed a 5-5 record, 4.52 ERA (95.2 IP, 48 ER) between Double-A Tulsa (LAD) and Double-A Chattanooga last year, including 10 relief appearances for the Lookouts, allowing six runs (4 earned) with 16 strikeouts.

SMELTZER THE CANCER SURVIVOR: When Smeltzer was just nine years old, he was diagnosed with pelvic rhabdomyosarcoma (bladder cancer), as a tumor had formed against his bladder that was connected to his prostate...he underwent surgery and chemotherapy at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and sent the cancer into full remission in 2012.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI (SEASON: 12-5, 3.73 ERA // CAREER: 59-53, 3.93 ERA)

Odorizzi will take the ball tomorrow night in the series opener against the Atlanta Braves, welcoming them to Minneapolis for the first time since July, 2016...leads the Twins and is tied for sixth in the American League with a career-high 12 wins...was the starter and 2-1 winner in his last outing on Tuesday at Miami after tossing 5.2 innings of four-hit ball, allowing just one run with a walk and five strikeouts...marked his 11th start this season allowing one or fewer runs...is 1-2 with a 6.55 ERA in Interleague Play this season, losing to the Phillies and Mets in April before beating the Marlins last Tuesday...this will be his first start at home against a National League opponent this season...faced the Braves twice in his career, both times back in 2015, going 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA.
