INSIDE THE LAST 10: The Twins have gone 10-5 in their last 15 games...during that span, they have out-scored opponents $66-33$ and out-hit opponents $88-75$...pitchers have posted a 2.97 ERA ( $91.0 \mathrm{IP}, 30 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with a .220 opponent batting average in those 10 ; starters have gone 7-1, 2.45 ERA ( $62.1 \mathrm{IP}, 17 \mathrm{ER}$ ) and relievers have posted a 215 opponent batting average.

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 27 games over . 500 , their highest since October 2,2010 when they were 94-67...the last time they were 28 games over . 500 was through their game on September 29,2010 when they were 93-65.

EXTRA! EXTRA!: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base hit in 65 straight games, dating back to May 20 ...it is the eighth longest XBH-streak in club history...one extra-base hit tonight would tie their seventh longest streak, done September 16, 1984-June 7, 1985...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009.
MAD MAX: Max Kepler has hit seven home runs in his last 14 games... 28 of his 30 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, three players in baseball reached 30 homers from the leadoff spot last season: Francisco Lindor (37), Mookie Betts (32) and Matt Carpenter (30)...the club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Brian Dozier in 2017 (Kepler already second).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2001, Kirby Puckett and Dave Winfield, along with Bill Mazeroski and Hilton Smith, were inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame...Puckett is the Twins all-time leader in hits ( 2,304 ), runs ( 1,071 ), second in doubles (414), and third in RBI ( 1,085 )...Winfield dons a San Diego cap in his HOF plaque but the St. Paul native recorded his 3,000th hit in a Twins uniform on September 16, 1993 at the Metrodome.

DANDY DOZEN: Odorizzi has set a career high with 12 wins ( $12-5$ in 21 starts), surpassing his 11 victories for Tampa Bay in 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts)...the first-time All-Star is tied for sixth in the AL in wins...is 0.1 -inning shy of qualifying for additional leaderboards; otherwise, he would rank ninth in the AL in opponents' batting average (.229, 92-for-401), 10th in strikeouts-per-9.0 innings ( $9.36,113$ SO in 108.2 IP), 11th in opponents' OPS (.682), 11th in FIP (3.91), 12th in WHIP (1.19) and 13th in ERA (3.73; 108.2 2 PP, 45 ER).
$\Phi$ Odo, along with rotation-mates Kyle Gibson (11-4) and José Berríos (10-5), have given the Twins three 10-game winners for just the third time this decade ( 6 in 2010 and 3 in 2017).

BACK ON TRACK?: Jake earned his 12th win in his last start, a 2-1 victory July 30 at Miami... worked 5.2 innings, allowing one run on four hits with a walk and five strikeouts, departing with a one-run lead after throwing 103 pitches...Tyler Duffey, Sergio Romo and Taylor Rogers held the Marlins hitless over the final 3.1 innings to close out the win.

THE TWO JAKES: While his effort in Miami resulted in a win, Odorizzi still finished July just 2-2 with a 7.43 ERA (23.0 IP, 19 ER) in five starts...in fact, Odo's season can be broken into two distinct sections, his 14-start stretch through June 15 in which he led the American League with a 2.24 ERA and 10 wins, and his seven outings since.... closer look at Jake's two seasons within

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the American League against right-handed hitters, yielding a league-low . 174 batting average ( 38 -for-219)...he ranks fourth with a .565 OPS vs. righties.

HOME SWEET HOME?: The Twins lost both of Odorizzi's starts during their most recent homestand (7/19 vs. Oakland and 7/24 vs. New York-AL), as he went $0-1$ and surrendered 12 runs on 16 hits in 9.0 innings ( 12.00 ERA)...his start against the Yankees was the worst of his career, allowing nine runs in 4.0 innings of a 10-7 loss.
$\Phi$ Even with those two outings, Odo is still 6 -1 with a 3.81 ERA ( $56.2 \mathrm{IP}, 24 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 10 home starts this season (the Twins are 7-3)...his home ERA has jumped 1.54 points (from 2.27) over his last two Target Field starts.
क In his first 26 home starts for Minnesota, 0do is 11-5 with a 4.33 ERA (137.1 IP, 66 ER)...the Twins are 17-9 (.654) when he takes the mound at Target Field.

MORE INTERLEAGUE SUCCESS: With his July 30 win at Miami, Odorizzi improved to $10-6$ with a 3.47 ERA (140.0 IP, 54 ER) in 26 career starts against the National League...is 3-4, 4.45 ( 60.2 IP, 30 ER ) in 12 starts vs. NL East opponents...is now 1-2 with a 6.55 ERA (11.0 IP, 8 ER) in three Interleague starts this year, bouncing back from losses at Philadelphia on April 5 and New York-NL on April 10.

EVERY FOUR YEARS, THE BRAVES: Odorizzi will face Atlanta for the first time since making a pair of starts against them in a Tampa Bay uniform during the 2015 season, pitching to a 6.00 ERA ( 12.0 IP, 8 ER) in those games...suffered a 2-1 loss May 20, 2015 in Atlanta ( 6.0 IP, 2 ER), and received a no-decision in the Rays' $9-6$ win on August 12,2015 ( 6.0 IP, 6 ER).

TIME FOR THE HEATER: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.9 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 57.2 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of $54.1 \%$ )...used his four-seamer $60.6 \%$ of the time through his first 14 starts (10-2, 2.24 ERA), however, threw it just $47.8 \%$ of the time over his next six (1-3, 8.44)...returned to the heater in his July 30 win at Miami, throwing it for 66 of his 103 pitches ( $64.1 \%$ )...below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:
