INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 6-7 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 1-1 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami and 1-0 vs. Atlanta...they have seven more IL games remaining, two vs. the Braves, two at Milwaukee August 13-14 and three vs. the Nationals September 10-12...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7).

© Miguel Sanó has reached safely in each of his last 21 starts in IL Play, hitting .288 (23-for-80) with eight doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, 12 walks, a .387 on-base percentage and a .925 OPS in that span.

© Eddie Rosario is hitting .319 (53-for-166) with 13 doubles, 11 home runs and 27 RBI in his last 41 games vs. NL opponents.

© Jorge Polanco is hitting .318 (48-for-151) with an .860 OPS in 43 career games vs. NL teams.

© C.J. Cron is hitting .306 (56-for-183) with 13 doubles, 11 home runs, 36 RBI and a .920 OPS in 67 career IL games.

© Max Kepler is tied for AL-lead with Renato Núñez for most IL homers with six.

© DID YOU KNOW? José Berríos struck out Ronald Acuña Jr. in the 2019 All-Star Game on five pitches.

CHOP CHOP: Twins and Braves are playing each other in the regular season for the 18th time in their history...Twins are 8-9 all-time against the Braves in the regular season...they have won three straight over Atlanta, dating back to 2016 after losing seven straight to the Braves from 2010-16.

STAY HOT: The Twins have gone 9-2 in their last 11 games...during that span, they have out-scored opponents 71-36 and out-hit opponents 96-84...pitchers have posted a 2.88 ERA (100.0 IP, 32 ER) with a .223 opponent batting average in those 10; starters have gone 7-1, 2.37 ERA (68.1 IP, 18 ER)...Twins are looking to win five straight...their season-long is six, done May 20-26.

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 28 games over .500, their highest since games through September 28, 2010 when they were 28+ with a 92-65 record...last time they were 29 games over was through games of September 26, 2010 at 92-63.

BRINGER OF SANÓ: Miguel Sanó is hitting .292 (31-for-106) with six doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 26 RBI, 17 walks, 22 runs scored, a .390 OBP/.651 SLG/1.041 OPS in his last 32 games since June 28...prior to that date, he was hitting .195 (23-for-118) with a .278 OBP/.483 SLG/.761 OPS in 31 games to begin the season...he ranks seventh in baseball in Isolated Power (min. 250 PA's) at .321, trailing Yelich (.369), Trout (.368), Bellinger (.350), Cruz (.349), Gallo (.344) and Alonso (.326)...in terms of Hard Hit Rate, he ranks second in baseball at 55.3%, trailing Aaron Judge (59.8%) and ahead of Nelson Cruz (53.8%).

EXTRA STRENGTH: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base hit in 66 straight games, dating back to May 20... it is tied for the seventh longest XBH-streak in club history (also 1984-85)...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009...the Twins lead baseball in both extra-base hits (460) and slugging percentage (.500).

MAD MAX: Max Kepler has hit eight home runs in his last 15 games...29 of his 31 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, three players in baseball reached 30 homers from the leadoff spot last season: Francisco Lindor (37), Mookie Betts (32) and Matt Carpenter (30)...the club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Brian Dozier in 2017 (Kepler already second).

TOOK HIS TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH: Making his sixth start on the road in his last seven outings Berrios dominated the Miami Marlins last Wednesday, spinning 7.0 innings of two-hit shutout ball with a season-high 11 strikeouts and no walks...the right-hander earned the win with his 16th quality start of the year (T-4th in AL), and now owns a 2.31 ERA (4th in MLB) over his last 12 starts, dating back to May 24 vs. Chicago-AL.

 Berrios recorded his fourth career start of 10+ SO and two-or-fewer hits and no runs...
 that ties Madison Bumgarner, Sandy Koufax and Sam McDowell for the most such starts in the Live Ball Era (1920-present) at age 25-or-younger.

 In his last start, he notched 11 strikeouts despite throwing just 81 pitches...became just the sixth pitcher in baseball history to accomplish the feat, second this season (TB's Blake Snell struck out 12 Rangers with 80 pitches on June 30).

 José has not allowed more than three earned runs in 12 consecutive starts, a career-long streak, and the longest single-season stretch by a Twins starter since Johan Santana (22 straight starts) from June 9-Sept. 29, 2004.

LA CASA DE JOSÉ: In nine starts at home this season, Berríos is 5-2 with a 2.10 ERA (60.0 IP, 14 ER) with 57 strikeouts, compared to going 5-3, 3.31 ERA (81.2 IP, 30 ER) with 76 strikeouts away from Target Field...has 23 career wins at Target Field, second to only Kyle Gibson since its inception in 2010...below is a chart of all-time wins at Target Field.

• His 2.10 home ERA is the lowest by a qualifying Twins starter since Hall of Famer Bert Blyleven's 1.91 ERA in 1974 (11-7 in 20 starts)...it is the fourth lowest in Twins history (since 1961) behind Blyleven, Camilo Pascual (1.89 ERA, 1963) and Jim Perry (1.81 ERA, 1965)...it is also the second-lowest in AL this season, trailing Houston's Wade Miley (2.02).

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 2.80 ERA through 22 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019. 2017

- Berrios is tied for fourth in the American League (T-7th in MLB) with 16 quality starts, while 17 out of his 22 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including nine 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 93 career starts, Berríos has thrown 46 quality starts (49.5 percent).
- The 1.91 BB/9 rate is the lowest by a qualifying Twins starter since Phil Hughes' 0.69 (16 BB in 209.2 IP) in 2014...teammate Michael Pineda currently owns a 1.77 BB/9 rate (23 BB, 117.0 IP).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the top young pitchers in Twins history...his 2.80 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 30 walks in 22 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an 8.45 SO/9

ratio (122 SO), and is on-pace to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).

Berríos has 133 strikeouts through 22 starts and an ERA of 2.80...he is trying to become the third Twins starter, at age 25 or younger, to record 200-plus strikeouts and a sub-3.00 ERA, joining Johan Santana (2.61 ERA, 265 SO, 25 years old in 2004) and Bert Blyleven, who did it five years in a row from 1971-75 (age 21 through age 25 seasons).
