THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-0 on their current homestand, sweeping the Royals in three games over the weekend, followed by a win over the Braves last night...tonight the Twins will continue their season-long 10-game homestand with the second of three vs. Atlanta...after this series, the Twins will host division rival Cleveland for four games from Thursday-Sunday...Twins enter today with a four-game division lead over the Tribe...each of the Twins next 12 games are against teams above .500 and have a combined record of 248-204 (.549).

AND WE'LL SEE YOU, TOMORROW NIGHT! The Twins beat the Braves last night by a score of 5-3 in walk-off fashion...Jake Odorizzi was the starter, allowing one run on five hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Trevor May earned the win with 2.0 scoreless innings pitched...the offense recorded eight hits, two from Luis Arraez, who drove in the Twins first two runs and reached on a single in the ninth inning, leading to a Miguel Sanó pinch-hit walk-off homer...below are the Twins all-time pinch-hit walk-off homers (since 1961) prior to Sanó's:

THIS IS MY BOOM STICK: Nelson Cruz has hit 30 home runs, tied for sixth most in baseball...14 of those home runs have been hit since the All-Star break, the most in baseball, ahead of Max Kepler's 10...he is on pace to hit 43 home runs and record 104 RBI...Atlanta (6 games), Philadelphia (5 games) and San Francisco (12 games) are the only three teams in baseball in which Cruz has never homered against...below is where Cruz ranks on baseball's all-time home run list (left) and his ranks in baseball this season (right):

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins 219 home runs are the most in baseball, 27 more than second-place Los Angeles-NL (192) and New York-AL (192)...they need just two home runs to match their second most of 221, done in 1964...they need 48 home runs to match the Major League Baseball all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 316...below are the Twins all-time single-season home run totals:

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 6-7 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 1-1 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami and 1-0 vs. Atlanta...they have seven more IL games remaining, two vs. the Braves, two at Milwaukee August 13-14 and three vs. the Nationals September 10-12...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7).

- ☞ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in each of his last 21 starts in IL Play, hitting .288 (23-for-80) with eight doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, 12 walks, a .387 on-base percentage and a .925 OPS in that span.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .319 (53-for-166) with 13 doubles, 11 home runs and 27 RBI in his last 41 games vs. NL opponents.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .318 (48-for-151) with an .860 OPS in 43 career games vs. NL teams.
- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .306 (56-for-183) with 13 doubles, 11 home runs, 36 RBI and a .920 OPS in 67 career IL games.
- ☞ Max Kepler is tied for AL-lead with Renato Núñez for most IL homers with six.
- ☞ DID YOU KNOW? José Berríos struck out Ronald Acuña Jr. in the 2019 All-Star Game on five pitches.

CHOP CHOP: Twins and Braves are playing each other in the regular season for the 18th time in their history...Twins are 8-9 all-time against the Braves in the regular season...they have won three straight over Atlanta, dating back to 2016 after losing seven straight to the Braves from 2010-16.

STAY HOT: The Twins have gone 9-2 in their last 11 games...during that span, they have out-scored opponents 71-36 and out-hit opponents 96-84...pitchers have posted a 2.88 ERA (100.0 IP, 32 ER) with a .223 opponent batting average in those 10; starters have gone 7-1, 2.37 ERA (68.1 IP, 18 ER)...Twins are looking to win five straight...their season-long is six, done May 20-26.

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 28 games over .500, their highest since games through September 28, 2010 when they were 28+ with a 92-65 record...last time they were 29 games over was through games of September 26, 2010 at 92-63.

BRINGER OF SANÓ: Miguel Sanó is hitting .292 (31-for-106) with six doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 26 RBI, 17 walks, 22 runs scored, a .390 OBP/.651 SLG/1.041 OPS in his last 32 games since June 28...prior to that date, he was hitting .195 (23-for-118) with a .278 OBP/.483 SLG/.761 OPS in 31 games to begin the season...he ranks seventh in baseball in Isolated Power (min. 250 PA's) at .321, trailing Yelich (.369), Trout (.368), Bellinger (.350), Cruz (.349), Gallo (.344) and Alonso (.326)...in terms of Hard Hit Rate, he ranks second in baseball at 55.3%, trailing Aaron Judge (59.8%) and ahead of Nelson Cruz (53.8%).

EXTRA STRENGTH: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base hit in 66 straight games, dating back to May 20...it is tied for the seventh longest XBH-streak in club history (also 1984-85)...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009...the Twins lead baseball in both extra-base hits (460) and slugging percentage (.500).

MAD MAX: Max Kepler has hit eight home runs in his last 15 games...29 of his 31 home runs have come from the leadoff spot, the most in baseball, three players in baseball reached 30 homers from the leadoff spot last season: Francisco Lindor (37), Mookie Betts (32) and Matt Carpenter (30)...the club record for homers at the leadoff spot is 34, done by Brian Dozier in 2017 (Kepler already second).

- ☞ Twins 'pen is 21-16-32 with a 4.42 ERA (376.2 IP, 185 ER), 57 holds, 137 walks & 395 strikeouts this season (112 games)...allowing a .257 opp. batting avg. (378-for-1469).
- ☞ Relievers are 2-2-1 with a 6.69 ERA (40.1 IP, 30 ER), 9 holds, 28 walks, 40 strikeouts and a .293 batting average against (48-for-164) in 11 games vs. NL-East teams this season.
- ☞ Since the All-Star break, Twins pen' has gone 5-6-6 with a 4.87 ERA (77.2 IP, 42 ER), that is 9th-highest bullpen ERA in MLB (behind Colorado, Atlanta, Washington, Milwaukee, Cincinnati, Detroit, Baltimore & Arizona)...have 9 blown saves in the second half, most in the American League & in ML baseball.
- ☞ For the season, Twins 'pen still ranks 5th in the AL and 9th in the majors in save percentage (68.1%, 32-for-47), while the 15 blown saves are T-6th-fewest in the AL...Twins have 2nd-fewest relief innings pitched in the AL (376.2 IP) behind Cleveland (350.1 IP).
- ☞ Most saves of more than three outs among Twins relievers since 2000: Taylor Rogers, 2019 (8), Bob Wells, 2000 (3), Brandon Kintzler, 2017 (3), Brandon Kintzler, 2016 (3), Glen Perkins, 2015 (3), Joe Nathan, 2007 (3), Eddie Guardado, 2001 (3) & LaTroy Hawkins, 2000 (3).
