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THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-2 on their current homestand, sweeping the Royals in three games over the weekend, followed by a three-game series loss to the Braves this week...tonight the Twins will continue their season-long 10-game homestand with the first of four games against the Indians through the weekend...Twins enter today with a 2.0-game division lead over the Tribe...each of the Twins next 10 games are against teams above . 500 and have a combined record of 186-158 (.541).
TWINS CAN'T TAKE SERIES FROM BRAVES: The Twins lost to the Braves yesterday afternoon by a score of 11-7...Martín Pérez (8-5) was the starter and loser, allowing seven runs ( 6 earned) on 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched (Twins pitchers have allowed 23 runs on 32 hits in their last two games)...the offense recorded 13 hits and struck out 12 times...they scored all seven runs after the fifth inning.... Jake Cave doubled twice and Miguel Sanó hit his 20th home run of the season...the defense turned their second triple play of the season and 14th in club history.

SINCE WE LAST SPOKE: The last time the Twins played the Indians came on July 14 at Progressive Field, leaving Cleveland with a 6.5 -game lead in the division...since July 15 , the Indians have won five more games than the Twins, going 17-6, compared to the Twins 12-10...below are AL Central standings (left) and overall AL standings (right): 12-10....below are AL Central standings (left) and overall AL standings (right):

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins 224 home runs are the most in baseball, 21 more than second-place New York-AL (203)...they need just one home run to match the club record of 225, set in 1963...they need 43 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 318 with 48 games remaining.
क Miguel Sano's home run yesterday afternoon gave the Twins five players with 20-plus home runs, as he joins Nelson Cruz (32), Max Kepler (31), Eddie Rosario (24) and Mitch Garver (21)...the 1964 team set the club record with six (Allison, Hall, Killebrew, Mincher, Oliva and Versalles), while the 1986 club had five (Brunansky, Gaetti, Hrbek, Puckett and Smalley)... - IN CASE YOU MISSED IT...Yesterday Triple-A Rochester set a franchise home run record - IN CASE YOU MISSED II...Yesterday Triple-A Rochester set a franchise home rin with their 155th homer of the season, passing their mark of 154 set in 1959.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Randy Dobnak from Triple-A Rochester...Dobnak appeared in seven games ( 5 starts) for the Wings this season, going 4-1, 2.00 ERA (36.0 IP, 8 ER), 14 walks, 27 strikeouts and a 175 opponent batting average...the 24-year-old appeared at three levels in the Twins minor league system this season, combining to go 11-3, 2.02 ERA ( $125.0 \mathrm{IP}, 28$ ER), 24 walks, 102 strikeouts and a .214 opponent batting average in 22 games ( 19 starts) between Rochester, Double-A Pensacola and Single-A Ft. Myers...to make room for Dobnak on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Kohl Stewart to Rochester...Stewart pitched 3.0 innings yesterday vs. the Atlanta, allowing four runs on five hits with one walk and one strikeout.
A TALE OF TWO MIGGYS: Miguel Sanó is hitting . 301 (34-for-113) with six doubles, one triple, 11 home runs, 30 RBI, 19 walks, 24 runs scored, a 402 0BP/ 664 SLG/ 1.065 OPS in his last 34 games since June 28 ...prior to that date, he was hitting .195 ( 23 -for-118) with a .278 OBP/. $483 \mathrm{SLG} / .761$ OPS in 31 games to begin the season.
ALL A-RRAEZ: Luis Arraez is hitting. 348 ( 57 -for-164) with a 419 on-base percentage in 48 games this season..in 38 games since June 18 , he ranks first among American League rookies in hits (48), second in batting average (.343) and on-base percentage (.410), third in OPS (.817), tied for third in runs (24), and fifth in walks (15)...he has four hits and one walk in 13 plate appearances vs. CLE this season.

BRING 'EM OUT, BRING 'EM OUT!: Twins rank fifth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,602,616 this season, trailing New York $(2,454,278)$, Los Angeles $(2,127,840)$, Boston $(2,124,776)$ and Houston $(2,050,387)$...they have drawn $30,000+$ in 23 of their last 28 home games ( 33,409 avg)...the Twins have sold out 169 regular season games at Target Field since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and eight in 2019.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his 11th win of the season (fourth consecutive) while recording his ninth quality start of the season, tossing 6.2 innings, allowing three runs ( 2 earned) with six strikeouts in an 11-3 victory over Kansas City last Saturday night....after a clean first inning, allowed a solo home run to Jorge Solar before yielding another on a two-out, RBI single by Meibrys Viloria in the second...didn't allow another baserunner until a Jorge Soler walk to lead off the sixth inning, and he'd later score on a fielder's choice...exited with the bases loaded and two outs, as Ryne Harper included a fly out from Whit Merrifield to end the frame. $\Phi$ Threw a season-high 110 pitches his most since throwing 114 in a $5-1$ win at Oakland on Sept. 23 of last year.

CLEVELAND CALLED: Gibson is making his 20th career start against Cleveland tonight and his second this season....he last faced the Indians July 12 at Progressive Field, his first start after of the All-Star break...did not factor into the decision after allowing just three runs ( 1 earned) on four hits with one walk and five strikeouts over 3.2 innings....went 1-3, 4.66 ERA ( 29.0 IP, 15 ER) with 15 walks and 23 strikeouts in his five starts vs. the Indians last season; is 0-6, 6.22 ERA (46.1 IP, 32 ER ) with 17 walks and 38 strikeouts in nine career starts at Target Field...Gibson's last win against the Tribe came on June 15 of last season at Progressive Field, when he threw 7.0 innings of one-run ball, allowing three hits with four walks and three strikeouts; the Twins won the game 6-3.
$\Phi$ Gibson is 4-1, 3.29 ERA (41.0 IP, 15 ER ) with nine walks and 45 strikeouts in seven starts vs. the AL Central this season....over his career, he is 29-27, 4.19 ERA (446.2 IP, 208 ER) with 149 walks and 352 strikeouts while holding batters to a .266 average.
(Wwww)INNING WaYs: The Twins have gone 15-7 in Gibson's 22 starts this season (15-6, excluding his 1.0 -shutout inning as an opener July 7 vs. Texas), and his 11 total wins are second on the staff behind Jake Odorizzi (12)...the Twins are 30-24 in Gibson's 54 starts since the beginning of the 2018 season (30-23 in traditional starts)
$\Phi$ Has a four-game winning streak over his last nine starts (including July 7 vs. Texas as an opener)...is $4-0$ with a 3.74 ERA ( $43.1 \mathrm{IP}, 78 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in that span, with 44 strikeouts against 13 walks...the Twins are 6-3 ( $6-2$ in his traditional starts).

GROUND WORK: Gibson owns a 0.80 GIDP/9 this season which is 23 rd in all of baseball and 11 th in the AL..since 2014, Gibson is first in GIDP in the majors with 130 and is fourth in GIDP/9 with 1.1... has induced 11 double plays in 2019, ranks T-14th in the AL.

GIBBY'S TURF: The right-hander has posted impressive numbers when pitching at Target Field this season....he is 7-1, 4.02 ERA, (65.0 IP, 39 ER) with 18 walks and 58 strikeouts... however, on the road, Gibson is 4-2, 4.03 ERA ( 58.0 IP, 26 ER ) with 66 strikeouts and 17 walks.
$\Phi$ Hasn't lost at home since June 19 vs. Boston, a span of six starts.
