THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-2 on their current homestand, sweeping the Royals in three games over the weekend, followed by a three-game series loss to the Braves this week...tonight the Twins will continue their season-long 10-game homestand with the first of four games against the Indians through the weekend...Twins enter today with a 2.0-game division lead over the Tribe...each of the Twins next 10 games are against teams above .500 and have a combined record of 186-158 (.541).

TWINS CAN'T TAKE SERIES FROM BRAVES: The Twins lost to the Braves yesterday afternoon by a score of 11-7...Martín Pérez (8-5) was the starter and loser, allowing seven runs (6 earned) on 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched (Twins pitchers have allowed 23 runs on 32 hits in their last two games)...the offense recorded 13 hits and struck out 12 times...they scored all seven runs after the fifth inning...Jake Cave doubled twice and Miguel Sanó hit his 20th home run of the season...the defense turned their second triple play of the season and 14th in club history.

SINCE WE LAST SPOKE: The last time the Twins played the Indians came on July 14 at Progressive Field, leaving Cleveland with a 6.5-game lead in the division...since July 15, the Indians have won five more games than the Twins, going 17-6, compared to the Twins 12-10...below are AL Central standings (left) and overall AL standings (right):

NOTE: Twins have spent 123 days in first place of the AL Central...only Los Angeles-NL has spent more days leading their division this season (127 days).

TWINS-TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the 10th of 19 scheduled meetings this season...Twins are 5-4 vs. the Indians this season...including tonight's game, they play each other 10 more times this season, three at Progressive Field and seven at Target Field.

- ☞ Nelson Cruz has 23 career home runs vs. the Indians (second-most among actives, Cabrera - 46), including 12 in his last 21 games (21 RBI).
- ☞ Max Kepler has five home runs and eight RBI in nine games against CLE this season...five homers lead baseball vs. CLE...his 13 career homers vs. CLE are his most (next CWS & BAL - 9).
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .324 (89-for-275) with 13 doubles, four triples, 16 home runs, 36 RBI and a .933 OPS in 73 career games vs. Cleveland.

THIS IS MY BOOM STICK: Nelson Cruz has hit 32 home runs, the fifth most in baseball...16 of those home runs have been hit since the All-Star break, the most in baseball, ahead of four players with 10 (including Kepler)...he is on pace to hit 45 home runs and record 108 RBI...below is where Cruz ranks on baseball's all-time home run list:

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins 224 home runs are the most in baseball, 21 more than second-place New York-AL (203)...they need just one home run to match the club record of 225, set in 1963...they need 43 home runs to match the MLB all-time record of 267 set last season by New York-AL...Twins are currently on pace to hit 318 with 48 games remaining.

- ☞ Miguel Sanó's home run yesterday afternoon gave the Twins five players with 20-plus home runs, as he joins Nelson Cruz (32), Max Kepler (31), Eddie Rosario (24) and Mitch Garver (21)...the 1964 team set the club record with six (Allison, Hall, Killebrew, Mincher, Oliva and Versalles), while the 1986 club had five (Brunansky, Gaetti, Hrbek, Puckett and Smalley)...the MLB record is seven, by seven teams (most recently the 2018 Los Angeles Dodgers).
- ☞ **IN CASE YOU MISSED IT...** Yesterday Triple-A Rochester set a franchise home run record with their 155th homer of the season, passing their mark of 154 set in 1959.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Randy Dobnak from Triple-A Rochester...Dobnak appeared in seven games (5 starts) for the Wings this season, going 4-1, 2.00 ERA (36.0 IP, 8 ER), 14 walks, 27 strikeouts and a .175 opponent batting average...the 24-year-old appeared at three levels in the Twins minor league system this season, combining to go 11-3, 2.02 ERA (125.0 IP, 28 ER), 24 walks, 102 strikeouts and a .214 opponent batting average in 22 games (19 starts) between Rochester, Double-A Pensacola and Single-A Ft. Myers...to make room for Dobnak on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Kohl Stewart to Rochester...Stewart pitched 3.0 innings yesterday vs. the Atlanta, allowing four runs on five hits with one walk and one strikeout.

A TALE OF TWO MIGGYS: Miguel Sanó is hitting .301 (34-for-113) with six doubles, one triple, 11 home runs, 30 RBI, 19 walks, 24 runs scored, a .402 OBP/.664 SLG/1.065 OPS in his last 34 games since June 28...prior to that date, he was hitting .195 (23-for-118) with a .278 OBP/.483 SLG/.761 OPS in 31 games to begin the season.

ALL A-RRAEZ: Luis Arraez is hitting .348 (57-for-164) with a .419 on-base percentage in 48 games this season...in 38 games since June 18, he ranks first among American League rookies in hits (48), second in batting average (.343) and on-base percentage (.410), third in OPS (.817), tied for third in runs (24), and fifth in walks (15)...he has four hits and one walk in 13 plate appearances vs. CLE this season.

BRING 'EM OUT, BRING 'EM OUT!: Twins rank fifth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,602,616 this season, trailing New York (2,454,278), Los Angeles (2,127,840), Boston (2,124,776) and Houston (2,050,387)...they have drawn 30,000+ in 23 of their last 28 home games (33,409 avg)...the Twins have sold out 169 regular season games at Target Field since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and eight in 2019.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his 11th win of the season (fourth consecutive) while recording his ninth quality start of the season, tossing 6.2 innings, allowing three runs (2 earned) with six strikeouts in an 11-3 victory over Kansas City last Saturday night...after a clean first inning, allowed a solo home run to Jorge Soler before yielding another on a two-out, RBI single by Meibrys Vilorio in the second...didn't allow another baserunner until a Jorge Soler walk to lead off the sixth inning, and he'd later score on a fielder's choice...exited with the bases loaded and two outs, as Ryne Harper included a fly out from Whit Merrifield to end the frame. ☞ Threw a season-high 110 pitches his most since throwing 114 in a 5-1 win at Oakland on Sept. 23 of last year.

CLEVELAND CALLED: Gibson is making his 20th career start against Cleveland tonight and his second this season...he last faced the Indians July 12 at Progressive Field, his first start after the All-Star break...did not factor into the decision after allowing just three runs (1 earned) on four hits with one walk and five strikeouts over 3.2 innings...went 1-3, 4.66 ERA (29.0 IP, 15 ER) with 15 walks and 23 strikeouts in his five starts vs. the Indians last season; is 0-6, 6.22 ERA (46.1 IP, 32 ER) with 17 walks and 38 strikeouts in nine career starts at Target Field...Gibson's last win against the Tribe came on June 15 of last season at Progressive Field, when he threw 7.0 innings of one-run ball, allowing three hits with four walks and three strikeouts; the Twins won the game 6-3.

☞ Gibson is 4-1, 3.29 ERA (41.0 IP, 15 ER) with nine walks and 45 strikeouts in seven starts vs. the AL Central this season...over his career, he is 29-27, 4.19 ERA (446.2 IP, 208 ER) with 149 walks and 352 strikeouts while holding batters to a .266 average.

(WWW)INNING WAYS: The Twins have gone 15-7 in Gibson's 22 starts this season (15-6, excluding his 1.0-shutout inning as an opener July 7 vs. Texas), and his 11 total wins are second on the staff behind Jake Odorizzi (12)...the Twins are 30-24 in Gibson's 54 starts since the beginning of the 2018 season (30-23 in traditional starts).

☞ Has a four-game winning streak over his last nine starts (including July 7 vs. Texas as an opener)...is 4-0 with a 3.74 ERA (43.1 IP, 78 ER) in that span, with 44 strikeouts against 13 walks...the Twins are 6-3 (6-2 in his traditional starts).

GROUND WORK: Gibson owns a 0.80 GIDP/9 this season which is 23rd in all of baseball and 11th in the AL...since 2014, Gibson is first in GIDP in the majors with 130 and is fourth in GIDP/9 with 1.1...has induced 11 double plays in 2019, ranks T-14th in the AL.

GIBBY'S TURF: The right-hander has posted impressive numbers when pitching at Target Field this season...he is 7-1, 4.02 ERA, (65.0 IP, 39 ER) with 18 walks and 58 strikeouts...however, on the road, Gibson is 4-2, 4.03 ERA (58.0 IP, 26 ER) with 66 strikeouts and 17 walks.

☞ Hasn't lost at home since June 19 vs. Boston, a span of six starts.
☞ In 90 games (89 starts) at Target Field, Gibson has 31 career wins, most since the ballpark's inception in 2010.

THE SHERIDAN STORY: Gibson, along with catcher Jason Castro, is proud to support The Sheridan Story, an organization dedicated to fighting child hunger in Minnesota...the innovative organization serves more than 6,500 kids in over 200 schools - with the aid of strong community partnerships...Kyle will donate \$100 for every Twins win while Jason will contribute \$250 per victory...coming into today's start, Gibson is set to donate \$7,000...on behalf of the Minnesota Twins, Major League Baseball's "Home Plate Project," Big League Impact and the Garth Brooks "Teammates for Kids" Foundation, Twins pitchers Kyle Gibson and Martin Pérez will present a check tomorrow morning to The Sheridan Story for \$30,000 in support of the nonprofit's vision of "Every child. Every meal."

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI (SEASON: 12-5, 3.61 ERA // CAREER: 59-53, 3.91 ERA)

Odorizzi will take the ball in game two of this four-game set here tomorrow night making his 23rd start of the season and his third against Cleveland...has a career high 12 wins and ranks 12th in the AL with a 3.61 ERA (114.2 IP, 46 ER)...in his last start on Monday vs. the Braves, he did not factor into the decision after throwing 6.0 innings of one-run ball, striking out seven while recording his eighth quality start of the season (Twins won 5-3)...in two starts against the Indians this season, Odo is 1-0, 1.59 ERA, (11.1 IP, 2 ER) with four walks and 13 strikeouts...his last win vs. the Tribe came in his last start on July 13 at Progressive Field...he allowed just one run on three hits while striking out two over 5.1 innings pitched...he owns a 2-4 record, a 4.89 ERA, (53.1 IP, 29 ER) over 11 career starts against Cleveland.

- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.
- Since the start of 2014, he has induced 130 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martín Pérez is third with 115.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30+ starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11, 2018 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
