THE TWINS: The Twins completed their short three-game homestand with a record of 2-1 vs. Tampa Bay...tonight the Twins will begin a six-game, seven-day roadtrip with three vs. the White Sox over the weekend, an off-day in the Bay Area on Monday, then three against Oakland July 2-4...the Twins play nine more games leading up to the All-Star break, six on the road and three at home.

RAIN DELAY...18 INNINGS...LOSS...SERIOUSLY...: The Twins lost to the Rays yesterday afternoon by a score of 5-2 in 18 innings, tied for the fifth longest game in Twins history, by innings... Martin Pérez was the starter and one of 10 pitchers used by the Twins...Twins relievers pitched 11.0 innings, allowing just five hits and five walks, while striking out 11...the Twins offense went just 8-for-61, scoring both runs in the first inning...the game was played in 5:42, the fifth-longest game in Twins history.

TWINS AND SOX: Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the fourth of 19 times this season...Twins enter today having won their last seven over the Sox, their longest win-streak over Chicago since September 14, 2010-July 8, 2011 when they won nine straight...Twins have gone 27-14 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

☞ The Twins went 5-4 at Guaranteed Rate Field last season, going 1-1 in their last series here August 21-22 and going 1-1 in series play here overall.

☞ Mitch Garver is hitting .370 (17-for-46) with five doubles, seven RBI, five walks and a .953 OPS in 15 career games vs. the Sox.

☞ Max Kepler is hitting .382 (13-for-34) with four doubles, one triple, four home runs, 14 RBI, a .912 slugging percentage and a 1.333 OPS in his last nine vs. the Sox...he has homered and doubled in each of his last three vs. CWS and has 12 RBI in his last four.

☞ Jorge Polanco has seven home runs and 20 RBI in 17 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field...the homers and RBI are his personal most in any opposing ballpark.

☞ Jonathan Schoop has reached base safely in 14 of 15 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field and in each of his 13 here.

ROSTER SHUFFLE: The Twins announced several roster moves today:

- ☞ Eddie Rosario has been placed on the 10-day Injured List with a left ankle sprain (retro to June 27)...Rosario is hitting .282 (87-for-308) with 14 doubles, 20 home runs, 60 RBI, 51 runs scored and an .841 OPS in 75 games.
- ☞ The Twins have activated infielder Ehire Adrianza from the 10-day Injured List...Adrianza, who missed the last 10 games with abdominal issues, is hitting .271 (29-for-107) with two doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI and a .772 OPS in 43 games this season.
- ☞ Right-handed pitcher Zack Littell has been optioned to Triple-A Rochester...Littell recently appeared in three games for the Twins, pitching 4.0 scoreless innings with two walks and two strikeouts.
- ☞ Left-handed pitcher Lewis Thorpe, the Twins' 2018 minor league Pitcher of the Year, has been recalled from Triple-A Rochester...Thorpe, 23, started 14 games for the Red Wings this season, going 3-4 with a 5.71 ERA (69.1 IP, 44 ER), 21 walks and 88 strikeouts...the Melbourne, Australia native was signed by the Twins in July of 2012 and is looking to make his ML debut...he will wear number 43.

BACK TO THE FUTURE: Rosters for the 2019 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game were announced this morning, which will be played at 7 pm (ET) on Sunday, July 7 at Progressive Field in Cleveland...for the first time in its history, the game will feature an AL vs. NL format, following the U.S. vs. World match-ups of the last 20 years...the AL Team features 13 former first round draft picks, including Minnesota's own Royce Lewis, the former first overall pick in the 2017 First-Year Player Draft, and Jordan Balazovic, who was drafted by the Twins in the fifth round of the 2016 draft...Lewis, the California native, is hitting .228 (67-for-294) with 13 doubles, five home runs and 23 RBI over 72 games with Single-A Ft. Myers and Balazovic, the Canadian native, is 6-2, 2.48 ERA (61.2 IP, 17 ER) with 15 walks and 87 strikeouts in 12 starts this season between Low-A Cedar Rapids and Ft. Myers...this marks the first Futures Game appearance for both players.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, KOSKIE!: Former Twins third baseman Corey Koskie is celebrating his 46th birthday today...he shares with a birthday with Mark Grace (55), Brandon Phillips (38), and former Twin Ron Mahay (48).

LAST TIME OUT: Berríos did not factor into the decision as the Twins defeated the Royals in Kansas City last Saturday, despite throwing 7.0 innings of two-run, five-hit ball...left in the eighth inning with a blister on his right ring finger...in it, **he eclipsed 500.0 career innings pitched, becoming the 47th pitcher in Twins history to throw 500.0-or-more innings**, joining teammate Kyle Gibson, who reached 1,000.0 IP June 14 vs. Kansas City, and the most recent member, Ervin Santana, who overcame the threshold at the end of 2017.

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos has a 2.84 ERA through 16 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019.

EL REY DE CHICAGO: Berríos owns a lifetime line of 8-1, 2.05 ERA (66.0 IP, 15 ER) with 16 walks and 71 strikeouts over 10 games (all starts) vs. the Pale Hose; **2.05 ERA is the ninth-lowest ERA all-time vs. the Sox (minimum 10 starts)**...in four starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, Berríos owns a 3.80 ERA (21.1 IP, 9 ER), with his last win here coming on May 4, 2018, when he threw 6.0 innings, allowing four runs on six hits in a 6-4 Twins win...his lone loss here came back on August 24, 2017 when he allowed all five runs of a 5-1 loss, but only three were earned.

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact off the bat of his opponents for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 85.8 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.0) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.5), (min. 500 batted balls).

A HISTORIC MONTH OF JUNE: José enters tonight's start with a 1.63 ERA in June through four starts...among pitchers with at least four starts in June, Berríos' ERA is the fifth-lowest in Twins history, trailing only Johan Santana (1.05 in 2006), Bert Blyleven (1.21 in 1973), John Smiley (1.34 in 1992) and Kevin Tapani (1.56 in 1991)...since 2016, only 15 players in the Majors have had lower ERAs in June, five in the American League.

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the great young pitchers in Twins history...his 2.84 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 20 walks in 16 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits with an 8.34 SO/9 ratio (97 SO), and is looking to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON- 4-4, 5.02 ERA ; CAREER- 44-45, 4.15 ERA]

Pineda will be on the hill tomorrow afternoon against the White Sox...the right-hander was the starter on Sunday against the Royals, and received his fourth loss of the season as he allowed five runs in 5.0 innings with eight hits and five strikeouts...despite the big number, Pineda threw well in four of the five innings, allowing just three hits and no runs in the first, second, fourth and fifth innings combined, but surrendered five runs on five hits in the third inning alone...lifetime is 1-3 with a 3.60 ERA (25.0 IP, 10 ER) and an opponents' batting average of .231 against the Pale Hose...hasn't seen them since July 6, 2016, as Tim Anderson and José Abreu were the only two current White Sox to face Pineda that day.

CAREER NOTES

- Teamed with Jake Odorizzi (11 Ks on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Given 2018 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA...also awarded with the Carl R. Pohlad Community Service Award.
- Became 21st pitcher in Twins history to reach the 200-strikeout mark in a season (202 in 2018).
