THE TWINS：After completing their short three－game homestand with a record of 2－1 vs． Tampa Bay，the Twins began their six－game，seven－day roadtrip with a loss to the White Sox last night．．．today they will play the second of three on the South Side．．．they will complete the series tomorrow afternoon then travel to northern California，enjoy an off－day in the Bay Area on Monday，then play three against Oakland from Tuesday to Thursday．．．the Twins play eight more games leading up to the All－Star break，five on the road and three at home．

THE SANÓ SHOW，NOT ENOUGH：The Twins lost to the White Sox last night by a score of 6－4 José Berríos（8－4）was the starter and loser，despite pitching 7.1 innings，allowing six runs （ 3 earned）on nine hits and no walks．．．the offense recorded nine hits，including two two－run homers from Miguel Sanó．．．the loss snapped a seven－game winning streak over the Sox．
历 Despite the loss last night，Berríos recorded his 14th quality start of the season，becoming the seventh Twin（10th occurrence）to have 14－or－more quality starts pre－All Star Break， first since Scott Erickson in 1991 （also 14）．．．also joins Bert Blyleven（17 in 1972， 16 in ${ }^{\prime} 73$ ），Frank Viola（16 in ’88），Dean Chance（15 in＇68， 14 in＇67），Jim Perry（14 in＇70） and Jim Kaat（14 in＇69 and＇72）．

TWINS AND SOX：Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the fifth of 19 times this season．．．Twins enter today having won seven of their last eight over the Sox．．．Twins have gone 27－15 vs．Chicago since the start of 2017

$\underset{\sim}{\Phi} \boldsymbol{\Phi}$ At 52－29，the Twins currently own their second－best record through the halfway point of any season in Twins history（tied with 1965 Twins），trailing only the 1970 squad that won 54 of their first 81 （54－27），and finished the year 98－63，first in the AL West，（lost ALCS to Baltimore 3－0）．

ANOTHER ROSTER SHUFFLE：The Twins announced today that they have reinstated outfielder Byron Buxton and infielder／outfielder Marwin Gonzalez from the 10－day Injured List．．．Buxton， who missed the Twins last 13 games with a right wrist contusion，is hitting ． 266 （ 55 －for－ 207）in 65 games this season，with 21 doubles，three triples，nine home runs， 38 RBI， 40 runs scored and a .851 OPS．．．Gonzalez，who missed the Twins last nine games with a right hamstring strain，is hitting .255 （ 59 －for－231）in 63 games this season，with 11 doubles， nine home runs， 26 RBI， 28 runs scored and a .743 OPS．．．to make room on the 25 －man roster， the Twins have optioned outtielders Jake Cave and LaMonte Wade Jr．to Triple－A Rochester．

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE STARS：Triple－A Rochester outfielder Brent Rooker and catcher Tomás Telis have been selected to the International League All－Star Team．
$\Phi$ Rooker， 24 ，is batting $.285 / .410 / .564$ with 12 doubles， 12 homers， 38 RBI， 36 runs scored，and a stolen base in 50 games this season．． he ranks sixth in the IL in on－base percentage，seventh in OPS，and 10th in slugging percentage．．．Rooker strained his left wrist and was placed on the Injured List on May 17．．．since being reinstated on June 1，he ranks among league leaders in runs（1st，23），OBP （1st，．522），walks（1st，23），RBI（2nd，26），OPS（3rd，1．181），AVG（4th，．354），total bases（T－6th，54），hits（7th，29），and SLG（8th，．659）．
历 Telis， 28 ，is batting ．286／．331／．449 with nine doubles，five homers， 20 RBI，and 19 runs scored in 41 games this season．．．this is his sixth career All－Star selection，joining 2017 and 2015 in the Triple－A Pacific Coast League（with New Orleans and Round Rock）， 2014 and 2013 in the Double－A Texas League（with Frisco），and 2011 in the Single－A South Atlantic League（with Hickory）．
$\Phi$ The pair will join Stu Cliburn，who was previously announced as the IL＇s Pitching Coach．
ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY：Harmon Killebrew was born on this date in 1938 in Payette，Idaho．．．Killebrew made his MLB debut on June 23， 1954 and would finish his career with 2，086 hits， 573 home runs and 1,584 RBI as he was a 13 －time All－Star，the American League MVP in 1969，a six－time home run champion and three－time RBI champ．．．also， 25 years ago in 1994：Manager Billy Heywood led a miraculous comeback as the Twins tied the Seattle Mariners，forcing a one－game playoff to decide the final postseason berth in the American League，with the game to be played in the Hubert H．Humphrey Metrodome．．．Game No． 163 headed to extra innings，but the Mariners took the lead in the top of the 10th．．．with two outs in the bottom half，Lou Collins cracked a ball deep to center field，only to watch as Ken Griffey Jr．robbed the game－winning，walk－off home run，ending the Twins＇season．．．Heywood would never manage again， as he decided to retire and return to junior high．

LAST START: Pineda was the starter last Sunday at Kansas City where he suffered his first loss since May 5 at NYY, snapping a seven-start stretch in which he went 2-0 with a 3.67 ERA (41.2 IP, 17 ER )...stranded a base runner in the second, fourth and fifth innings, but allowed five consecutive hits with one out in the third, all of which scored..allowed five runs (all earned) on eight hits with zero walks and five strikeouts.

- Gave up a three-run shot to Alex Gordon in the third inning marking his 15th home run allowed this season.

WALK HARD: Through 15 starts, Pineda has only issued 14 walks in 80.2 innings, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second in all of baseball among starters with at least 80.0 innings pitched....owns 754 career strikeouts, 171 walks and a lifetime S0/BB ratio of 4.41...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 43 starts...since 2016, is one of nine starters with an active streak of $40+$ starts with three-or-less walks in each, (full list below).

VS. CHICAGO-AL: Pineda is making his 16th start of the season and his first against the White Sox this afternoon...is 1-3, 3.60 ERA (25.0 IP, 10 ER) with six walks and 22 strikeouts in his career...last time out against the Sox came July 6, 2016 ...received the loss after allowing five runs on five hits and three walks with five strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work...last win against Chicago-AL was September 24, 2015, allowed one run on eight hits with zero walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings....looking for first career win at Guaranteed Rate Field...is $0-2,4.85$ ERA ( 13.0 IP, 7 ER) with five walks and eight strikeouts here

- In five starts against AL Central opponents this season, Pineda is 1-1, 4.85 ERA (26.0 IP, 14 ER) with one walk and 23 strikeouts...however, in his career he is $10-12,3.99$ ERA (171.1 IP, 76 ER) with 30 walks and 167 strikeouts over 29 starts.

MORE WALK TALK: Pineda's is tied for the second fewest in the all of baseball with 14 free passes this season, and the fewest in the American League among starters with at least 15 starts...Pineda is one out away from qualifying, but if he did, his walks allowed per nine innings rate is 1.56 , which would rank fifth-best in the majors and is second in the American League (behind Mike Leake-1.43)... has six starts without walking a batter this season and five with walking just one.

- Big Mike did not walk a batter for the sixth time in 15 starts this season, two behind José

Berríos and one shy of Mike Leake for most in the American League (excluding openers).

JUNE JITTERS: "Big Mike" owns a 6-10 career record and a 4.09 ERA (158.1 IP, 72 ER) in the month of June....his 39 walks are the most of any month...this season he is $0-1,4.15$ ERA (21.2 IP, 10 ER) with three walks and 17 strikeouts...in 2017, Pineda finished June 2-2, with a $5.35 \mathrm{ERA}(33.2 \mathrm{IP}, 20 \mathrm{ER})$, including a season-high 11 strikeout appearance on April 10.

THE DOWN-LOW: Since his debut in 2011, Pineda has recorded 967 ground balls to his 730 fly balls, a 44.5 percent ground ball rate, would be 17th in AL among actives, if qualified.

## CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched. - Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August. - Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of 198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16 -year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
