THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-0 through three games on their 10-game roadtrip, starting with a three-game sweep of the White Sox...tonight the Twins will continue the trip with the first of four at Detroit through Monday, followed by three vs. the Red Sox from Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins have 29 games remaining, 12 against teams above .500 and 17 against team below .500...the remaining opponents have a combined win percentage of .464 (371-428).

TWINS SWEEP UP THE SOX: The Twins beat the White Sox yesterday afternoon by a score of 10-5, securing their 10th sweep of the season...José Berrios (11-7) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Randy Dobnak earned his first career save with 3.0 scoreless innings...the offense recorded 16 hits, three from C.J. Cron, who doubled and homered...Jake Cave recorded his second career multi-homer game - both coming in the last week.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the 13th of 19 games against the Tigers this season...each of the final eight meetings between these two teams will be in Detroit...they have gone 8-4 vs. Detroit thus far, 6-3 at Target Field and 2-1 at Comerica Park...Twins have won 10 of their last 14 over the Tigers and 14 of their last 19...Twins are 6-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last seven, home or away.

☞ Twins have out-scored the Tigers 72-52 this season.
 ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .317 (40-for-126) with seven doubles, 10 home runs and 33 RBI in 32 career games vs. Detroit...he has eight homers and 24 RBI vs. DET in his last 19 games.
 ☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .327 (35-for-107) with seven doubles, eight home runs, 24 RBI and a 1.039 OPS in his last 28 vs. the Tigers.

BOMBA COUNTER: After three home runs yesterday the Twins now have 261 homers on the season, moving into third on baseball's all-time list and within six of the MLB all-time record...below is baseball's all-time single-season home run list:

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 31 games over .500, marking the first time being 31 games over since games of September 24, 2010 at 92-61...the Twins high in 2010 was 32 over on September 24 at 92-60.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have won seven straight on the road and 11 of their last 13 away from Target Field...last seven-game road win-streak was July 23-August 6, 2006 when they won eight straight...they have gone 43-22 on the road this season, tied for most road wins in baseball with Tampa Bay...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 406-298...43 wins marks their most on the road since 2017 (44-37), the club record being 51 (30 losses) in 1965...they are on pace to win 53 road games.

FLORIDA'S FINEST: Outfielder Trevor Larnach yesterday was named Florida State League Player of the Year...ranked as MLB.com's 94th best prospect, the Twins 2018 first round pick (20th overall) hit .316 (101-for-320) with 26 doubles, six home runs, 44 RBI and a .842 OPS in 84 games prior to being promoted to Double-A Pensacola on July 16...he also posted a .382 on-base percentage and slugged .459.

GRIDIRON GLORY: Tomorrow afternoon Target Field will host College Football's Opening Weekend with North Dakota State vs. Butler, presented by Pioneer...it will be the first-ever Division I game played at the home of the Twins, kickoff slated for 3:00 pm...it marks the second football game ever played at Target Field, the previous coming on September 23, 2017 between Saint John's University and the University of St. Thomas as the Tommies beat the Johnnies 20-17 in front of 37,355 fans - an all-time NCAA Division III record for attendance.

THIS AND THAT:

- ☞ Jake Cave is hitting .391 (25-for-64) with nine multi-hit games, seven doubles, six home runs and an OPS of 1.241 in his last 25 games.
- ☞ The Twins now have 52 home runs in the month of August, their fourth straight 50-HR month becoming the first team in MLB history to have four 50-HR months in a season (consecutive or not)...hit 56 in May, 51 in June and 52 in July.
- ☞ The Twins have produced a barreled ball in 9.8% of batted balls in the 2019 season (353/3,611) -- Rank: 1st of 30 in MLB; League Avg: 7.1%.
- ☞ Twins hitters have a Well-Hit Avg of .139 (336/2,413) with two strikes this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: .113.
- ☞ Twins hitters have grounded into 11 double plays in 177 opportunities (6.2%) over the last 30 days (27 Games) -- best in MLB; League Avg: 10.7%.

LAST TIME OUT: Gibson was the starter and winner last Saturday vs. the Tigers after allowing five runs (4 earned) on a season-high 10 hits (1 home run) and eight strikeouts... the 10 hits are the most he's given up since allowing 11 on September 16 of last season at Kansas City...pitched a pair of scoreless innings before Dawel Lugo hit a leadoff home run in the third inning, which was later followed up by a sac fly from Ronny Rodríguez... gave up two more runs in the fourth inning on a two-out Victor Reyes single...exited in the sixth inning following a leadoff double to Willi Castro (who later scored on another Reyes single) and a strikeout to Lugo.

☞ Earned his 12th win of the season in his 26th game (25th start) of the season which ties his fastest to 12 wins over his career...needs one win to tie career-high of 13 done in 2014 (went 13-12 over 31 starts).

☞ The last time Gibby recorded a win while allowing 10-plus hits was Sept. 16 of last season at KC...marked just his 4th career win in a start with 10+ hits (4-9 record in those games).

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 27 games, Gibson has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (3 games), Castro (9 games) and Garver (15 games)...below is a breakdown of how he has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches:

☞ Mitch Garver owns baseball's fifth-best catcher's ERA this season (min. 50 starts as catcher) at 3.75 (555.0 IP)...in fact, the 3.75 CERA is the lowest by a Twins catcher with at least 50 starts since Joe Mauer's 3.69 CERA (990.2 IP) in 2005.

AGAINST THE TIGERS: The right-hander is making his 22nd career start against the Tigers, his third this season and second consecutive...owns a career record of 9-9 with a 5.37 ERA (117.1 IP, 70 ER) against them...in his last start against Detroit last Saturday at Target Field, Gibson earned the win after throwing 5.1 innings, allowing five runs (4 earned) on 10 hits with eight strikeouts, in a 8-5 Twins victory...his last win over the Tigers at Comerica Park came August 11 of last season, after he pitched 7.0 innings of one-run ball with seven hits, two walks and four strikeouts...is a career 4-5 with a 4.88 ERA when facing the Tigers in Detroit.

☞ Gibson is one of just three players on the current Twins roster ever on a Ron Gardenhire-managed team in Minnesota, starting 10 games for Gardy in 2013 and 31 games in 2014...the others: Trevor May pitched in 10 games (9 starts) in 2014 and Jorge Polanco played five games in 2014.

GROUND POUND: Since 2014, nobody has induced more ground ball double plays than Gibson, who has 134 over 1020.1 IP in that span...so far this season, Gibby has continued the trend, recording 15 GIDPs, eighth-best in the American League, and the best on the Twins...in fact, he averages 0.94 GIDPs per 9.0 IP, 11-best in the AL, 14th in the Majors.

☞ Only four Twins since 1961 have recorded more double plays than Gibson...the list includes Jim Kaat (248 from 1961-73), Brad Radke (174 from 1995-2006), Bert Blyleven (158 from 1970-88) and Dave Goltz (148 from 1972-79).

THE SHERIDAN STORY: Gibson, along with catcher Jason Castro, is proud to support The Sheridan Story, an organization dedicated to fighting child hunger in Minnesota...the innovative organization serves more than 6,500 kids in over 200 schools - with the aid of strong community partnerships...**Kyle will donate \$100 for every Twins win while Jason will contribute \$250 per victory...coming into tonight's start, Gibson is set to donate \$8,200...on behalf of the Minnesota Twins, Major League Baseball's "Home Plate Project," Big League Impact and the Garth Brooks "Teammates for Kids" Foundation, Twins pitchers Kyle Gibson and Martín Pérez presented a check on August 9 to The Sheridan Story for \$30,000 in support of the nonprofit's vision of "Every child. Every meal."**

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ (SEASON: 9-5, 4.53 ERA // CAREER: 52-54, 4.62 ERA)

Pérez will take the ball tomorrow evening making his 27th start of the season and his third against the Tigers...this will be the second consecutive start against the Tigers, after earning his ninth win of the year on Sunday allowing just two runs on five hits over 6.0 innings pitched... has now lasted 6.0 innings in four of his last six starts dating back to July 27...owns a lifetime record of 2-3 with a 5.50 ERA (34.1 IP, 21 ER) with 16 walks and 30 strikeouts over seven games (6 starts) vs. the Tigers...is looking for his first career win at Comerica park in what will be his fourth career start here.

- Since the start of 2014, he has induced 134 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martín Pérez is third with 116.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11, 2018 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
