**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 4-0 through four games on their 10-game roadtrip, starting with a three-game sweep of the White Sox and a win over the Tigers last night...tonight the Twins will continue the trip with the second of four at Detroit through Monday, followed by three vs. the Red Sox from Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins have 28 games remaining, 12 against teams above .500 and 16 against team below .500.

**MOTOWN TAKE-DOWN:** The Twins beat the Tigers last night at Comerica Park by a score of 13-5...Kyle Gibson (13-6) was the starter and winner, allowing four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the bullpen combined for 4.0 innings with eight strikeouts...the offense recorded 14 hits, three from both Jorge Polanco and Nelson Cruz...C.J. Cron added a home run, his 23rd of the season.

**BOMBA COUNTER:** The Twins now have 262 homers on the season and are within five of the MLB all-time record...below is baseball's all-time single-season home run list:

**ROAD RULES:** The Twins have gone 44-22 on the road this season, the most road wins in baseball...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 419-303...44 road wins marks their most on the road since 2017 (44-37), the club record being 51 (30 losses) in 1965...they are on pace to win 54 road games...below are the Twins longest road win-streaks (since 1961):

**CAUTION, HIGH WATER:** The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 32 games over .500, marking the first time being 32 games over since games of September 24, 2010 at 92-60...the last time they were 33 games over was at the conclusion of the 1970 season when they were 34 games over at 98-64.

**CALL 1-800-RUNS:** Twins have scored 795 runs this season, just five runs away from becoming the eighth team in club history to reach the 800-run mark...the club record is 877, done in 1996...the current club is on pace to score 961...just eight teams in baseball history have scored 961 runs, the most recent being the 2007 Yankees (968).

**TWINS AND TIGERS:** The Twins are playing the 14th of 19 games against the Tigers this season...each of the final seven meetings between these two teams will be in Detroit...they have gone 9-4 vs. Detroit thus far, 6-3 at Target Field and 3-1 at Comerica Park...Twins have won 11 of their last 15 over the Tigers and 15 of their last 20...Twins are 6-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last seven, home or away.

- ☞ Twins have out-scored the Tigers 85-57 this season.
- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .321 (42-for-131) with eight doubles, 11 home runs and 36 RBI in 33 career games vs. Detroit...he has nine homers and 27 RBI vs. DET in his last 20 games.
- ☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .342 (38-for-111) with seven doubles, eight home runs, 26 RBI and a 1.050 OPS in his last 29 vs. the Tigers.

**GRIDIRON GLORY:** This afternoon Target Field hosted College Football's Opening Weekend with North Dakota State vs. Butler, presented by Pioneer...it was the first-ever Division I game played at the home of the Twins...it marked the second football game ever played at Target Field, the previous coming on September 23, 2017 between Saint John's University and the University of St. Thomas as the Tommies beat the Johnnies 20-17 in front of 37,355 fans - an all-time NCAA Division III record for attendance.

**PÉREZ CONTINUES HOT STRETCH:** For the third time in 12 days, the Twins won a game started by Martín Pérez, as he carried the freight with 6.0 innings of two-run ball, scattering five hits and striking out five in a 7-4 Twins win last Sunday...from July 22-August 7, Pérez went 0-2 (Twins went 2-2 in his starts) with an 8.57 ERA (21.0 IP, 20 ER) and 10 home runs allowed...since August 8, he is 1-0 (Twins are 3-0) with a 2.12 ERA (17.0 IP, 4 ER) and zero home runs allowed.

☞ Donning his Player's Weekend jersey, emblazoned with "El De Las Matas", the Venezuelan-born Pérez was in prime form as he carved through 4.0 scoreless innings of work, scattering just two hits and a walk...he ran into a little trouble in the fifth inning as back-to-back doubles by Jordy Mercer and John Hicks to open the frame got the Tigers on the board, and Harold Castro knocked in Hicks with two outs...that would be the extent of the damage as he would retire his final four batters, eclipsing the 100-pitch threshold for the third start in his last four.

☞ Pérez reached a pair of significant milestones in his last start...with his strikeout of Willi Castro to end the fourth inning, Pérez reached 116 strikeouts on the season (139.0 IP), a new single-season career high, surpassing his 115 strikeouts in 2017 (185.0 IP)...with his second-to-last out in the game (groundout by Dawel Lugo in the sixth inning) he reached the 900.0-career innings pitched threshold, becoming 375th left-hander in baseball history to throw at least 900.0 innings, while also becoming just the 15th Venezuelan pitcher to do so.

**TROUBLE WITH MEN ON:** Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .235 (74-for-315) with an OPS of .696 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .306 average (70-for-229) with an .822 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .273 (36-for-132) with 10 XBH and 50 RBI with RISP, including .294 (20-for-68) with 26 RBI with RISP and two outs.

**THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY:** Over his 26 games, Pérez has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (4 games), Castro (9 games) and Garver (13 games)...below is a breakdown how the left-hander has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches, courtesy of Baseball Reference:

**SWEET, SOFT CONTACT:** Pérez has created a lot of weak contact in 2019, as referenced by the 84.9 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, the second lowest in baseball behind Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough (83.9 MPH), with a minimum of 300 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 149 feet, fourth-best in the American League.

☞ Pérez also ranks in the 94th percentile in opponents' hard hit percentage (5th in baseball, 29.0%, min. 300 batted balls).

**ANTE LOS TIGRES (AGAIN):** Pérez is making his second consecutive start against the Tigers, third overall this season, and seventh career (also 1 relief appearance)...brings a 5.50 career ERA (34.1 IP, 21 ER) against them.

☞ Is facing the Tigers for the second consecutive start...this is the second time he's made consecutive starts against a single opponent, the other time being June 16 and 21 vs./at Kansas City (0-1, 6.17 ERA).

☞ Last pitched in this ballpark on May 8, 2016 (ND, 6.0 IP, 2 ER in 8-3 Rangers win)...is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA lifetime in Detroit (3 starts).

**ROAD-TRIPPIN':** Pérez is set to make his third start away from Target Field: since August 13...has fared better on the road, as he owns a 4-2 record with a 4.30 ERA (58.2 IP, 28 ER) away from Minnesota...the road in 2019 has been better than usual for Martín, as for his career, he owns a 20-31 record away from his home ballpark (Target Field, Globe Life Park), with a 4.88 ERA (413.1 IP, 224 ER).

### TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA RHP (SEASON: 10-5, 4.16 ERA ; CAREER: 50-46, 4.07 ERA)

Pineda will get the ball for the series finale tomorrow afternoon against these Tigers...has faced them thrice this season, most recently in this ballpark on June 7, pitching the Twins to a 6-3 win with 5.0 innings of three-run ball with eight hits allowed (no-decision)...overall is 1-0 with a 4.76 ERA (17.0 IP, 9 ER) against them this season...hasn't won in Detroit since his first career start against them on April 28, 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners...has fared well against AL Central opponents this season, going 4-1 (Twins are 6-2 in his starts) with a 4.11 ERA (46.0 IP, 21 ER), and is riding a three-start winning streak against AL Central teams, dating back to June 29 at Chicago-AL.
