LAST TIME OUT: Was the starter and winner last Tuesday night at Guaranteed Rate Field after tossing 5.0 innings of one-run ball with four hits, a home run and eight strikeouts... extended his win-streak to four games and has now been on earned the win in five of his last eight starts dating back to July 6 vs. Texas....pitched three perfect innings until a solo shot from Tim Anderson in the fourth inning put the White Sox on the board marking his only earned run of the game....exited after the fifth inning after giving up a single to Yolmer Sánchez, forcing Adam Engel into a pop-fly, and striking out Leury García and Tim Anderson.

STAYING IN THE WWWWIN COLUMN: Pineda is 6-2, with a 3.09 ERA (70.0 IP, 24 ER) over his last 12 starts dating back to June 13...he ranks eighth in the AL for ERA since June 13 (min. 70.0 innings pitched)...the Twins have went 9-3 over that stretch...he has allowed 59 hits, with 13 walks, 60 strikeouts and an opponents' slash line of .256/.287/.444.
$\Phi$ Pineda is 6-2 in his last eight decisions while going 4-1 on the road and 2-1 at Target Field over those eight.
$\Phi$ He has limited teams to three earned runs-or-less in 16 of his last 18 starts, dating back to May 5 at New York-AL...he owns a 3.60 ERA (105.0 IP, 42 ER) while striking out 99 batters over that stretch (Twins are 21-6), with 10 quality starts and a 1.09 WHIP.

WALK TALK: Pineda is tied for third fewest in all of baseball with 25 free passes this season with at least 20 starts (excludes openers)... his walks-per-nine innings rate is 1.68 , which ranks seventh best in the majors among starters with at least 130.0 IP... has eight starts without walking a batter this season and 10 with walking just one.
$\Phi$ Michael also averages one walk per 0.45 batters he faces, which is the sixth lowest in baseball among pitchers with at least 125.0 IP while his 4.71 strikeout-to-walk rate sits 15th in the majors.
$\Phi$ Pineda has a combined 18 starts this season with walking one or fewer batters...over those 18 he owns a 9-4 record.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Pineda is making his fifth start away from Target Field since July 26...has had success on the road this season, as he owns a 7-2 record with a 4.14 ERA (67.1 IP, 31 ER) with 13 walks and 64 strikeouts away from his home turf...his road numbers have fared well in 2019, but as for his career, he owns a $24-26$ record away from his home ballpark with a 4.36 ERA ( 394.2 IP, 191 ER).
$\Phi$ Pineda now has seven wins over 12 road games this season, which matches a ca-reer-high and is the most since his 2015 season where he went 7-5 over 12 games away from home (all starts).

AGAINST THE TIGERS: Pineda will be making his eighth career start against Detroit and his fourth of the season (second at Comerica Park)...is 2-2, 4.28 ERA (40.0 IP, 19 ER) with six walks and 42 strikeouts in his career... is 1-0, 4.76 ERA (17.0 IP, 9 ER) over thee starts this season... his last win in Detroit came June, 22016 as a member of the Mariners, allowed one run on seven hits with zero walks and eight strikeouts over 5.2 innings.... is a career 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA when facing the Tigers in Detroit.
$\Phi$ Last time out vs. the Tigers was June 7 of this season...took a no-decision after allowing three runs (all earned) on eight hits and zero walks with three strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work.
