**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 1-2 through three games on their six-game, seven-day roadtrip, losing a three-game series to the Indians over the weekend...tonight the Twins will begin a three-game series with Washington, all night games, through Thursday...the Twins have 19 games remaining, six against teams above .500 and 13 against teams below .500...Twins enjoyed their penultimate off-day yesterday; they are 12-7 following an off-day.

- ☞ This week and next week all Monday-Thursday home games will be played at 6:40 pm (CT)...2019 marks the first time the Twins have done so with the months of April, May and September.
- ☞ Twins are 12-16 at home since the All-Star break (20th in MLB), compared to 20-6 on the road (1st in MLB).

**SUNDAY BLOODY SUNDAY:** The Twins lost to the Indians on Sunday afternoon by a score of 5-2, losing the three-game series as the division lead fell one game to +5.5...Randy Dobnak (0-1) was the starter and loser, allowing two runs on three hits in 2.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded just five hits, highlighted by a Mitch Garver solo home run in the fourth inning, his 29th...LaMonte Wade Jr. reached three times, walking twice and earning his first major league hit, an RBI-single in the seventh inning.

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Twins have placed Byron Buxton on the 60-day IL with a left shoulder subluxation, have reinstated Kyle Gibson from the 10-day Injured List and have selected the contract of infielder Ronald Torreyes from Triple-A Rochester...Buxton suffered the left shoulder subluxation on August 1 in Miami, missed the remainder of the month, but returned September 1 and played in five games last week in a defensive replacement role and as a pinch runner...Gibson missed the Twins last nine games with Ulcerative Colitis...Torreyes, who was signed by the Twins last offseason, spent 2019 with Triple-A Rochester and Single-A Ft. Myers...the 27-year-old infielder played in 79 games for the Red Wings this season, hitting .256 (79-308) with 11 doubles, one triple, 11 home runs, 42 RBI, 48 runs scored and 12 walks.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The Twins have gone 7-10 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 2-2 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami and 1-2 vs. Atlanta...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7).

- ☞ From 1997 (IL Play's inception) to 2009, the Twins went 132-96 in IL Play, second to only the Yankees (133-95) in wins during that span...since then they have gone 98-111 in IL Play, tied with Houston for 20th most wins in baseball during that span, sliding down to tied for sixth most in baseball at 218 (201 losses).
- ☞ Miguel Sanó has reached base safely in each of his last 25 starts in IL Play, hitting .295 (278-for-95) with eight doubles, six home runs, 17 RBI, 16 walks, a .402 on-base percentage and a .970 OPS in that span.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .304 (21-for-69) with three doubles, six home runs and 14 RBI in 17 games vs. the NL this season...14 RBI are tied for fourth most among AL players.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco is a career .303 hitter (50-for-165) with a .827 OPS in 47 IL games.
- ☞ Mitch Garver is batting .333 (15-for-45) with a 1.237 OPS in 11 IL games this season...Garver's eight IL home runs this season are tied with Yuli Gurriel for most among AL players...Garver's eight home runs are second most in club history, trailing Trevor Plouffe's nine IL homers in 2012.

**TWINS & THE CAPITAL:** The Twins are 8-7 all-time against the Montreal/Washington franchise, losing five straight, dating back to June of 2013...excluding Montreal, the Twins are 5-7 against Washington.

- ☞ For 60 years, the Senators played baseball in our nation's capital, winning one World Championship and three AL pennants...in 1961, owner, Calvin Griffith, moved the Senators from Washington, DC to Bloomington, Minnesota...the Senators played from 1901-1960, compiling a record of 4223-4864...the Senators beat the New York Giants in the 1924 World Series in seven games, marking the only World Series victory for the franchise during their first 60-year tenure in Washington.
- ☞ The Twins enter tonight's game with an all-time record (since 1961) of 4667-4733 and an all-time Franchise record (Senators and Twins) of 8890-9597.
- ☞ The Nationals are one of two teams to have never played at Target Field, San Francisco being the other...the Giants will visit here May 4-6 of next season.

### #OLDFRIENDS: Nationals as former Twins:

- ☞ Brian Dozier was drafted by the Twins in the eighth round of the 2009 MLB Draft...he played parts of seven seasons with the Twins from 2012-2018 before being traded in July of last season to Los Angeles-NL for Devin Smeltzer, et al...he earned an All-Star appearance in 2015 and won the AL Gold Glove in 2017...he ranks ninth on the Twins all-time list in home runs (167) and first in leadoff home runs (28)...his 42 home runs in 2016 made him one of two Twins to ever reach the 40 homer plateau, joining Harmon Killebrew (7x)...a full list of team awards Dozier won during his time here can be found on pages 230-232 of the Twins Media Guide.
- ☞ Kurt Suzuki spent 2014-16 with the Twins...he was named to the AL All-Star team in 2014, hosted by Target Field...he caught the final inning, helping teammate Glen Perkins secure the save for the AL in a 5-3 victory over the NL...he caught Berríos' ML debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
- ☞ Fernando Rodney spent most of 2018 with the Twins, going 3-2, 3.09 ERA (43.2 IP, 15 ER) with 25 saves in 31 opportunities...he was traded on August 9 to Oakland for Dakota Chalmers.
- ☞ Aníbal Sánchez was in Twins spring training in 2018 after signing a one-year deal in late February...he appeared in two spring training games for the Twins before being unconditionally released March 11, as the Twins signed Lance Lynn the next day.

**3/30:** Mitch Garver has 29 home runs, Eddie Rosario has 28 and Miguel Sanó has 27...if any of them make it to 30, they would join Max Kepler (36) and Nelson Cruz (35) and become the fifth trio of Senators/Twins to reach 30 HR apiece...Twins have never had four players do so...the other trios: Tom Brunansky (32), Gary Gaetti (31) and Kent Hrbek (34) in 1987...Bob Allison (32), Harmon Killebrew (49) and Tony Oliva (32) in 1964...Allison (35), Jimmie Hall (33) and Killebrew (45) in 1963...Allison (30), Killebrew (42) and Jim Lemon (33) in 1959.

**HAPPY B-DAY, BELLO!** Twins coach Cibney Bello is celebrating his 37th birthday today...Bello joined the Twins earlier this month as the rosters and staff expanded, coming from Double-A Pensacola where he was the club's pitching coach...he shares a birthday with Paul Goldschmidt (32), Joey Votto (36), and Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (56).

**BERRÍOS BEAT UP IN BEANTOWN:** The second-time All-Star continued his second-half, lasting just 5.0 innings with six earned runs in his last start on Sept. 4 in Boston, receiving his eighth loss.

☞ **Reigning AL MVP Mookie Betts** hit the first pitch of the game over the Green Monster, preceding another Betts homer in the second that saw the Twins down 4-0 before Berríos could record his fifth out in the game...he followed with a scoreless third, fourth and fifth innings, but saw his night come to an end after Christian Vázquez and Betts each drove in a run in the sixth inning, putting the Twins in a 0-6 hole.

☞ José didn't receive any runs of support, departing with a 0-6 deficit, marking the fifth time all season he hasn't received any help from the offense (3rd since the All-Star break)...still, his run support average of 6.05 ranks 10th-best in the AL.

☞ **Berríos is tied for fourth in the American League (T-12th in MLB) with 18 quality starts**, while 19 out of his 28 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including nine 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 99 career starts, Berríos has thrown 48 quality starts (48.5 percent).

**HAPPY CENTENNIAL, JOSÉ!** Berríos will be making his 101st major league appearance, and his 100th as a starting pitcher, becoming the 26th pitcher in Twins history to start at least 100 games.

☞ **In his last outing, he set the record for the most strikeouts by any Twin in history through 100 career games (559), surpassing Hall of Famer Bert Blyleven, who concluded his 100th career game on Sept. 16, 1972 vs. Kansas City with 553 strikeouts.**

☞ The Bayamón, Puerto Rico native owns the record for most strikeouts through 100 career games among Puerto Rican big leaguers, as the record was previously held by Javier Vázquez (Ponce, PR), who amassed 496 strikeouts through his first 100 career games.

**WITH AUGUST IN THE REARVIEW, BERRÍOS LOOKS TO FINISH STRONG:** Earlier this season, Berríos made his second career appearance in an All-Star Game as he pitched to an 8-5 record with a 3.00 ERA (117.0 IP, 39 ER) with 104 strikeouts and 15 home runs allowed in 18 starts...since then, he has amassed a 3-3 record with a 5.37 ERA (57.0 IP, 34 ER) with 65 strikeouts and nine homers in 10 starts (Twins are 4-6).

☞ During August, he posted a 7.57 ERA (27.1 IP, 23 ER) following a 12-start stretch in which he went 4-3 with a 2.31 ERA (78.0 IP, 20 ER), from May 24-July 31.

☞ **He owns a career 3.58 ERA (379.1 IP, 151 ER) from March-July (62 starts), but has pitched to a 5.63 ERA (195.0 IP, 122 ER) with 30 home runs allowed from August-October (39 games, 37 starts, includes postseason).**

**THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY:** Over his 28 starts, Berríos has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (4 games), Castro (14 games) and Garver (10 games)...below is a breakdown how La Makina has done, depending on who's calling his pitches:

**BERRÍOS VS. NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Berríos is making his 15th career start against a National League opponent, third this season...is 1-2 in 2019 with a 5.30 ERA (18.2 IP, 11 ER) in Interleague Play.

☞ This marks his first career start against the Washington Nationals...they become the 29th team he has faced in his career, facing every team in MLB aside from his own team...**made his Major League debut on April 27, 2016, with Nationals catcher Kurt Suzuki behind home plate, and Nationals' second baseman Brian Dozier behind him, batting second.**

☞ Has limited history against a few Nationals hitters: Yan Gomes (1-for-7), Adam Eaton (1-for-3), Gerardo Parra (1-for-3) and Asdrúbal Cabrera (1-for-2, HR).
