CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 34 games over .500 for the fourth time this season...prior to 2019, last time the Twins were 34 games over was when they ended the 1970 season at a record of 98-64...last time they were 35 over was at the end of the 1965 season when they were 42 over with a record of 102-60.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 8-10 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-3 vs. New York, 2-2 vs. Milwaukee, 2-1 at Miami, 1-2 vs. Atlanta and 1-0 vs. Washington...they have had just one winning season against the NL since 2010, that coming in 2017 (13-7).

♣ The Twins are 9-7 all-time against the Montreal/Washington franchise...excluding Montreal, the Twins are 6-7 against Washington.

♣ From 1997 (IL Play's inception) to 2009, the Twins went 132-96 in IL Play, second to only the Yankees (133-95) in wins during that span...since then they have gone 99-111 in IL Play, tied for 16th most wins in baseball during that span, sliding down to sixth most in baseball at 219 (201 losses).

♣ Mitch Garver is hitting .333 (16-for-48) with a 1.277 OPS in 12 IL games this season... Garver's nine IL home runs this season are tied with Nolan Arenado for most in baseball...he is now tied with Trevor Plouffe (2012) for most single-season IL home runs in club history.

♣ Eddie Rosario is hitting .306 (22-for-72) with four doubles, six home runs and 14 RBI in 18 games vs. the NL this season...14 RBI are tied for fourth most among AL players.

♣ Jorge Polanco is a career .302 hitter (51-for-169) with a .825 OPS in 48 IL games.

#OLDFRIENDS: Nationals as former Twins:

Brian Dozier was drafted by the Twins in the eighth round of the 2009 MLB Draft...he played parts of seven seasons with the Twins from 2012-2018 before being traded in July of last season to Los Angeles-NL for Devin Smeltzer, et al...he earned an All-Star appearance in 2015 and won the AL Gold Glove in 2017...he ranks ninth on the Twins all-time list in home runs (167) and first in leadoff home runs (28)...his 42 home runs in 2016 made him one of two Twins to ever reach the 40 homer plateau, joining Harmon Killebrew (7x)...a full list of team awards Dozier won during his time here can be found on pages 230-232 of the Twins Media Guide.

Kurt Suzuki spent 2014-16 with the Twins...he was named to the AL All-Star team in 2014, hosted by Target Field...he caught the final inning, helping teammate Glen Perkins secure the save for the AL in a 5-3 victory over the NL.

Fernando Rodney spent most of 2018 with the Twins, going 3-2, 3.09 ERA (43.2 IP, 15 ER) with 25 saves in 31 opportunities...he was traded on August 9 to Oakland for Dakota Chalmers.

ROCCO ON THE 90'S: One more win and Rocco Baldelli will become the sixth manager in Twins/Senators franchise history to reach 90 victories in his first full managerial season...Ron Gardenhire went 94-67 in his first season in 2002, Billy Martin went 97-65 in 1969, Bill Rigney went 98-64 in 1970, Joe Cronin went 99-53 in 1933 and Bucky Harris went 92-64 in 1924...last managers to reach 90 wins in their rookie seasons were Boston's Alex Cora (108-54) and New York's Aaron Boone (100-62) both in 2018.

PITCHING FIGURES: Where Twins pitching ranks in a few key categories on the season (all MLB): third in overall pitching WAR (21.0), eighth in ERA (4.14), sixth in K/BB (3.18), fourth in fewest homers allowed (176), eighth in WHIP (1.30) and third in first-pitch strike percentage (62.8%)...since the trade deadline (August 1): second in team pitching WAR, second in bullpen WAR, sixth in bullpen ERA, and fourth in win probability.

BACK AT IT IN BOSTON: Following his seven run, 2.2 inning performance, which was tied for his shortest start of the season, on August 31 in Detroit, Pérez moved right back to the win colum after tossing 6.0 innings of one-run ball with just two hits, two walks and a strikeout in Beantown on September 5...marked his 11th quality start of the season and his fifth start in his last eight lasting 6.0 innings.

- ♣ Pitched a perfect three innings before Mookie Betts connected on a solo shot in the fourth inning for his only run of the game...tossed another perfect inning in the fifth and gave up one hit in the sixth, a double to Betts, before his exit.

- May 6 at Toronto...now has seven career starts in which he gave up two or less hits

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .233 (79-for-339) with an OPS of .690 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .317 average (76-for-240) with an .860 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .290 (40-for-138) with 11 XBH and 56 RBI with RISP, including .300 (21-for-70) with 27 RBI with RISP and two outs.

average distance on balls in play of 150 feet, tied for third-best in the American League.
