THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-2 through six games on their final homestand of the 2019 season, taking two of three from Chicago and going 2-1 vs. Kansas City the last three nights...today the Twins will play the four-game series finale with the Royals, their final home game of 2019...this afternoon the Twins will travel to Detroit for an off-day tomorrow, three vs. the Tigers from Tuesday-Thursday, then conclude the regular season with three in Kansas City next weekend.

ROYALS SEPARATE THEMSELVES IN THE NINTH: The Twins lost to the Royals last night by a score of 12-5. José Berríos was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing five runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Jorge Alcala made his major league debut, pitching 0.2 innings with one hit and one walk...the offense recorded nine hits, led by LaMonte Wade Jr. who homered and tripled...the attendance was 37,750, Target Field's 12th sellout of the season.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the 16th of 19 scheduled games this season...they are 11-4 vs. KC this season, going 4-2 at Kauffman Stadium and 7-2 at Target Field...the Twins have gone 21-7 in their last 28 vs. KC overall, their best 28-game stretch vs. KC in franchise history...Twins most ever wins over KC was in 2002, going 14-5.

FULL NELSON: Nelson Cruz has 39 home runs, third most in the AL, trailing Jorge Soler and Mike Trout, each with 45 and ninth most in all of baseball...23 of those home runs have been hit since the All-Star break, most in the AL, ahead of Soler's 22...below is where Cruz ranks on MLB's all-time home run list:

NOTE: One more homer and Cruz will become the ninth Dominican-born player to reach 400 homers, joining Pujols (656), Sosa (609), M. Ramirez (555), Ortiz (541), Beltré (477), Guerrero (449), Encarnación (414) and Soriano (412).

THIS IS 40?: Nelson Cruz is one homer shy from becoming the 26th player in baseball history with at least four seasons of 40-plus homers (Cruz previously: 40 with BAL in 2014, 44 with SEA in 2015 & 43 with SEA in 2016)...one more homer and he will become the third different Twin (since 1961) to hit 40, joining Harmon Killebrew (7x: '61, '62, '63, '64, '67, '69, '70) and Brian Dozier ('16)...full homer count on page 193 of 2019 Twins Media Guide.

FLIPPING THE CALENDAR: At 12-7 with 27 scheduled September games, two more wins would give the Twins all six winning months this season...the only other times in their history (since 1961) to win all six months were 2002 and 1965.

☞ The Twins had a winning month in September of 2018...a winning September would mark seven consecutive winning months for the second stretch in club history, previously having done so in eight straight months from June-September of 1969, then continuing the streak from April-July of 1970.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1968, César Tovar plays one inning at each position for the Minnesota Twins, becoming only the second major leaguer in history to do it...Bert Campaneris of the Oakland Athletics was the first, earlier that season.

LAST START: Martín did not factor into the decision last Tuesday vs. the White Sox after tossing 4.2 innings of three-run ball with 10 hits and four strikeouts...marked just his ninth career game with 10-plus hits allowed and his second resulting in a win, the last coming April 5, 2018...

Scattered three hits and no runs in the first three innings until a lead-off double from Eloy Jimenez and a single from James McCann brought in their first run of the game in the fourth inning...a two-run two-hit fifth inning got started with back-to-back singles from Adam Engel and Leury García...

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .240 (86-for-358) with an OPS of .702 when the bases are clear...

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 30 games, Pérez has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (4 games), Castro (10 games) and Garver (16 games)...below is a breakdown of how the left-hander has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches, courtesy of Baseball Reference:

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact in 2019, as referenced by the 85.2 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, the second lowest in baseball behind Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough (83.7 MPH)...

A DEEPER LOOK AT TIMES THROUGH THE LINEUP: Pérez has done his best work early in ballgames, as he boasts a 2.91 ERA (58.2 IP, 19 ER) while he weaves through a given lineup for the first time in a game, with a BAA of .222 and just 14 XBH...

ROYAL SHOWDOWN: Pérez is making his seventh career start against the Kansas City Royals, fourth this season...owns a 1-1 record with a 4.46 ERA (36.1 IP, 18 ER) against the Royals while holding their hitters to a .270 average (37-for-137).

His lone win against these Royals came on July 14, 2017 at Kauffman Stadium (7.0 IP, 8 H, 3 R, 1 HR, 1 BB, 1 SO).

Oddorizzi will be making his 30th start on Tuesday opposite of Spencer Turnbull...in his last start on Wednesday vs. the White Sox he was dealt his seventh loss of the season after allowing two runs on seven hits with a walk and nine strikeouts marking his fifth nine-strikeout performance of the season...

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
• According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
• Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
• His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
• Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
