THE TWINS: The Twins completed their final homestand of the season with a record of $5-2$, going 2-1 vs, the White Sax and $3-1$ vs. the Royals...finished their regular season home slate with a record of 46-35. he Twins will begin a six game roadtrip to end the 2019 regular season tonight with the first of three in Detroit against the Tigers... will play tomorrow and Thursday here at Comerica Park, followed by three over the weekend at Kansas City...the Twins open the roadtrip with a magic number of three to clinch their first American League Central Division title since 2010
TWINS VICTORIOUS IN HOME FINALE: The Twins beat the Royals on Sunday by a score of 12-8...Martín Perez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing five runs on eight hits in 2.1 innings pitched...the bullpen worked 6.2 innings allowing only three runs (2 earned)...the offense recorded 12 hits, led by Miguel Sane who clubbed two home runs, marking his fifth multi-homer game of the year.... Nelson Cruz became the 57th player in baseball history to reach the career 400 home run plateau with a solo shot in the fourth (off Gape Speier)...the attendance was 31,628, bringing the Twins season total to 2,294,152 at Target Field, the most since 2013
ROAD RULES: The Twins have won 11 of their last 14 away from Target Field and have gone $50-25$ (.667) on the road this season, marking the most road wins and highest road winning percentage in baseball... Twins have outscored opponents on the road $464-343 \ldots 50$ road wins is their most on the road since 2017 ( $44-37$ ) and one shy of the club record of 51 ( 30 losses) in 1965 ...they are on pace to win 54 road games....below are the Twins all-time best road seasons (since 1961):

WNS AND TIGERS: The Twins and Tigers are playing the 16th of 19 scheduled games this season... they are 11-5 vs. Detroit this season, going 5-2 at Comerica Park and 6-3 at Target Field...since 2017 , Minnesota has gone $34-20$ against Detroit and has a +91 run differential in those games ( $326-235$ ), their best vs. any opponent in that time span.
क Nelson Cruz is hitting . 354 (23-for-65) with four home runs, 14 RBI and a .966 OPS in 14 games vs. Detroit this season...in his last 30 games vs. the Tigers, is hitting .345 ( 41 -for-119) with six doubles, seven home runs, 27 RBI and a .997 OPS.
क Mitch Garver is 13 -for-30 (.433) with four doubles, one triple, four home runs, 10 RBI, 11 walks and 1.619 OPS in 10 games vs. Detroit this season...is 7 -for-14 (.500) with three home runs and six RBI in four games here at Comerica Park.
क Eddie Rosario is hitting . 321 (17-for-53) with two doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI in 12 games vs. Detroit this season...he has five homers and 18 RBI vs. DET in his last 25 games.

WHOA, NELLY: Nelson Cruz now has 40 home runs, third most in the AL (KC's Jorge Solver and LAA's Mike Trout each have 45)... 24 of those home runs have been hit since the All-Star break, most in the AL, ahead of Sober's 22... below is where Cruz ranks on MLB's all-time home run list:

NOTE: Cruz becomes the ninth Dominican-born player to reach 400 homers, joining Puiols (656) Sosa (609) M Ramirez (555), Ortiz (541), Beltré (477), Guerrero (449), Encarnacion (414) and Soriano (412).

THIS IS 40: With his home run on Sunday vs. Kansas City, Nelson Cruz became the third player in bsebal history to hit 40 homers in a season at age 39-or-older (courtesy: STATS), joining Hank Aaron (40 in 1973 at age 39) and Barry Bonds ( 45 in 2003 at 39 , and 45 in 2004 at 40 )...he is also the 26 th player in baseball history with at least four seasons of 40-plus homers (Cruz previously: 40 with BAL in 2014, 44 with SEA in 2015 \& 43 with SEA in 2016)...Cruz is just the third different Twin (since 1961) to hit 40, 44 with SEA in 2 Killebrew ( $7 x$ : ' 61 , '62, '63, '.64, '67, '69, '70) and Brian Dozier (' 16 ).

TWO-OUT TALLIES: With eight two-out RBI on Sunday, the Twins now have 331 two-out RBI on the season, surpassing the previous club record of 324 , done back in 1977 .
CROSSING THE PLATE: The Twins reached the 900 -run mark for the first time in franchise history with their six-run first inning on Sunday...after scoring six more times, Minnesota has scored 906 runs this season,

BULLISH PEN: Since August 16, Twins relievers lead the American League and rank second in all of baseball with a 3.37 ERA ( $144.11 \mathrm{IP}, 54 \mathrm{ER}$ )...during that 35 -game stretch, the 'pen is $11-3$ with 13 saves (in 16 opportunities), 36 walks and 167 strikeouts the Twins have gone 23-12 in that span overall, the third-most wins in the AL (one behind Houston and Oakland, both 24-10).

LET IT SANÓ: In 101 games this season, Miguel Sanó is hitting . 248 ( 91 -for-367) with 72 runs scored, 19 doubles, 33 home runs, 77 RBI and a . 927 OPS...below is where his numbers rank in the AL since making his season debut on $5 / 16$ :

FLIPPING THE CALENDAR: At $13-8$ with 27 scheduled September games, one more win would give the Twins all six winning months this season...the only other times in their history (since 1961) to win all six months were 2002 and 1965 .
$\Phi$ The Twins had a winning month in September of 2018...a winning September would mark eight consecutive winning months for the first time since previously doing so in from June-September of

THE ICING ON TOP: Odorizzi takes the ball tonight and possibly Sunday at Kansas City, looking to top off what is arguably his best big league season...the first-time All-Star has already set a career high $\Phi$ The Twins' 690 winning percentage ( $20-9$ ) with Odorizzi on the mound is tops of any Minnesota pitcher (min. 20 starts)...meanwhile, Odo has the lowest run-support average of that group (5.71). F Tonight's start will be Jake's 30th of the campaign, the fourth time in his six full Major League seasons he has reached the 30 -start threshold.
ODO-METER: With enough innings to qualify ( 3.0 IP short), Odorizzi would rank among the top-15 AL pitchers in 14 statistical categories (and in the top-10 in 10)...below is a chart of where 0do ranks in three categories, along with how those numbers compare to his career bests:

HIGH QUALITY, IF NOT HIGH QUANTITY: Odorizzi averages about 5.1 innings per start and owns just nine efforts of 6.0 -plus innings, including only two in his last 15 trips to the hill...he throws the most pitches-per-batter in the majors at 4.23 and most pitches-per-inning in the AL at 17.6 . T The Twins are 8-1 when Jake pitches at least 6.0 innings, while he is personally 7-0 with a 1.45 ERA ( 56.0 IP, 9 ER) and a 169 opponents' batting average (33-for-195).
A RETURN TO FORM: Jake's last nine starts have produced seven Twins wins, while he is 3-2 with a 3.06 ERA ( 50.0 IP, 17 ER), 16 walks and 63 strikeouts...in his first 14 starts (through June 15),

SWING AND A MISS: Odorizzi owns a career-best rate of 10.06 strikeouts per 9.0 innings and, with 171 total (in 153.0 IP), is three shy of matching his career high 174 (set in 2014 with lampa Bay). Jake has 34 strikeouts in 22.0 innings over his last four starts, and 63 over 50.0 frames in his last nine trips to the hill.

KEEPING IT IN THE YARD: Pitching during the year of the home run, Odorizzi has yielded an average of 0.94 per 9.0 innings (16 HR in 153.0 PP), his lowest rate since 2015 ( 0.96 ) and what would rank
as fourth-best in the AL...has allowed just one homer in his last seven starts (165 batters faced).

ROAD RULES: The Twins have won all five of Odorizzi's road starts since the All-Star break (including September 2 here at Detroit), while he is $3-0$ with a 3.25 ERA (27.2 IP, 10 ER). $\Phi$ He is $9-4$ with a 3.80 ERA ( 68.2 IP, 29 ER) in 14 road starts overall this season (Twins are 10-4). ## CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berrios (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007.
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career. - Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained
until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-Iongest perfect game bid in Rays history.
