THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-0 so far on their six-game roadtrip, following a sweep in Detroit...they will begin their final regular season series this evening in Kansas City...they will conclude the regular season with two more games here over the weekend...the Twins are a season-high 39 games over .500, their best mark since ending the 1965 season a club-record 42 games over (102-60).

TWINS SWEEP UP THE TIGERS: The Twins beat the Tigers yesterday afternoon by a score of 10-4, earning their 11th sweep of the season...Devin Smeltzer (2-2) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 13 hits, highlighted by Williams Astudillo, who went 4-for-5 with a home run (4)...Jonathan Schoop hit his 23rd home run, the 300th for the Twins on the season.

LET'S PARTY LIKE ITS 2010: The Twins clinched the AL Central on Wednesday night for the seventh time and first time since 2010...below are the final results from previous postseasons (since 1961):

ROAD RULES: The Twins have won 14 of their last 17 away from Target Field and have gone 53-25 (.679) on the road this season, marking the most road wins and highest road winning percentage in baseball...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 483-350...53 road wins surpassed the Twins' single-season record set back in 1965 (51)...below are the Twins all-time best road seasons (since 1961):

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the 17th of 19 games this season...they are 12-4 vs. KC this season, going 4-2 at Kauffman Stadium and 8-2 at Target Field...the Twins have gone 18-8 in their last 26 overall vs. KC.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .331 (39-for-118) with 43 RBI, a .402 OBP, a .712 SLG and a 1.113 OPS in his last 31 vs. Kansas City.
☞ Nelson Cruz's 26 RBI this season vs. Kansas City match Texas' Juan Gonzalez in 1998 for the most ever in a single-season vs. the Royals.

300: Jonathan Schoop hit the Twins' 300th home run yesterday afternoon, the first team in baseball history to reach 300 homers in a season...they lead baseball in home runs, two in front of the New York Yankees, who have three games against the Rangers in Arlington this weekend...the Rangers have allowed 234 home runs this season, tied for ninth most in baseball.

CENTRAL HEATING: The Twins enter today's matchup with Kansas City with a record of 48-25 against teams in their own division...if the Twins win each of their three remaining games, they would set the all-time club record for wins against the AL Central...entering today, 48 wins is second-most single-season wins against the division, trailing only the 2002 club (50-25).
