THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 7-2 through nine games on their 10-game roadtrip, starting with a three-game sweep of the White Sox, followed by three wins in four games at Detroit then going 1-1 in Boston the last two nights...tonight the Twins will complete the trip with the third of three at Fenway Park...the Twins will travel home post-game tonight to begin a six-game, seven-day homestand with three vs. the Indians this weekend, an off-day Monday and three vs. the Nationals next Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins have 23 games remaining, 11 against teams above .500 and 12 against teams below .500 .

TWINS FALL IN FENWAY: The Twins lost to the Red Sox last night by a score of 6-2...José Berríos (11-8) was the starter and loser, allowing six runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched... the offense recorded eight hits, two each from Eddie Rosario, Miguel Sanó and C.J. Cron... Rosario hit his 28th home run, setting a single-season career-high, passing his previous high of 27, done in 2017...Twins have won just three times in Boston in their last 11 attempts.

ROAD RAGE: Twins have won 11 of their last 13 on the road, out-scoring opponents 96-59 in that span...they lead baseball in road wins, going 47-24 away from Target Field...below are the Twins all-time best road seasons (since 1961):

BULLPEN BULLIES: In 18 games since August 16 , the Twins bullpen has posted a 2.25 ERA ( 68.0 IP, 17 ER ) with six home runs allowed, 12 walks, 73 strikeouts and an opponent batting average of .238...in that span, they rank first in the AL in ERA with a 1.29 -run differential between second place Houston (3.54)

CLUTCHING UP: The Twins are hitting . 269 (433-for-1609) with 86 home runs with two outs this season...their 86 home runs are tied with New York-AL for most in baseball...their 433 hits rank second to Boston (447) and their . 269 average ranks third, trailing Boston (.276) and New York-AL (.272).

THE RED-HOT TWINS: The Twins have gone 14-5 since August 15, tied with Atlanta (14-4) for the second most wins in the majors since that date, trailing St. Louis (15-6)...since that date Minnesota ranks second in batting average (.297), and runs (135), both marks trail Washington (. 300 AVG /135 R)...additionally, they lead baseball since then in hits (208)

DISASTER STRIKES IN DETROIT: Following a three-game stretch in which Pérez was dominant (1-0, 2.12 ERA), with the third start being a 6.0-inning, two-run effort against the Tigers at home, the left-hander went to Detroit to battle again, only to be bludgeoned for eight runs (7 earned) on nine hits over 2.2 innings pitched, tying his season-low for innings pitched as a starting pitcher...the eight overall runs also set a season-high, marking the most he's allowed since April 16, 2018 (46 games, 36 starts in between).
$\mp$ Allowed just one run through his first 2.0 innings (first inning sac fly from Ronny Rodríguez), before being tagged for eight hits and seven runs in the third inning (4 1B, 2 2B, HR, BB).
玉 Entered the start with a 4.30 ERA on the road ( $58.2 \mathrm{IP}, 28 \mathrm{ER}$ ) before the outing...now sits at 4-3 with a 5.14 ERA on the road.
$\Phi$ Faced only right-handed batters in the start...his splits are noticeable from left-to-right, as he holds lefties to a 235 AVG (28-for-119) while righties are hitting . 283 (125-for-441).

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the windup, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .239 (77-for-322) with an OPS of 699 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a . 319 average ( 76 -for-238) with an .864 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting . 292 (40-for-137) with 11 XBH and 56 RBI with RISP, including .304 (21-for-69) with 27 RBI with RISP and two outs.

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE BATTERY: Over his 27 games, Pérez has thrown to each of the three catchers this season: Astudillo (4 games), Castro (9 games) and Garver (14 games)...below is a breakdown of how the left-hander has fared, depending on who's calling his pitches, courtesy of Baseball Reference:

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact in 2019, as referenced by the 85.0 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, the second lowest in baseball behind Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough ( 83.8 MPH), with a minimum of 300 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 151 feet, fourth-best in the American League.
$\Phi$ Pérez also ranks in the 94th percentile in opponents' hard hit percentage (T-4th in baseball, $29.3 \%$, min. 300 batted balls).
SHIPPIN' UP TO BOSTON: Pérez didn't face the Red Sox when these two teams met in Minneapolis in June...he'Il be making his first appearance against them since July 3, 2017 in Texas (ND, 5.2 IP, 7 H, 5 R, 2 ER, 4 BB, 3 SO).
$\Phi$ Owns a lifetime 7.56 ERA ( $16.2 \mathrm{IP}, 14 \mathrm{ER}$ ) at Fenway...he won his first career start here on April 8, 2014, allowing four runs over 6.1 IP in a 10-7 Rangers win...Prince Fielder was the starting first baseman for the Rangers in that game, while Grady Sizemore batted fifth and played center field for the Red Sox.
क Has found some success against the American League East this season, posting a 3-1 record in seven starts (Twins are 4-3), with a 4.42 ERA ( 38.2 IP, 19 ER) and a 33/12 S0/BB ratio... those numbers include a 2.2 IP, 6 ER outing in Tampa Bay on May 30.
© His run support in starts against the AL East has been significant, as he has been given 38 runs of support over the course of his seven starts against AL East opponents (5.43 AVG)...in fact, his 7.75 run support average this season ranks second-best in the AL, behind only last night's Sox starter, Eduardo Rodriguez.

ROAD-TRIPPIN': Pérez is set to make his fourth start away from Target Field since August 13...he owns a 4-3 record with a 5.14 ERA ( 61.1 IP, 35 ER) away from Minnesota...the road in 2019 has been emblematic of Martín's career, as he owns a 20-32 record away from his home ballpark (Target Field, Globe Life Park), with a 5.00 ERA (416.0 IP, 231 ER) in his career.

- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25 -or-younger and
the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went $10-6$ with a 3.62 ERA ( 50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American

League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
