THE TWINS: The Twins completed the 2019 regular season with a record of 101-61, winning the American League Central on September 25 atter defeating Detroit by a score of $5-1$, followed this ALDS tomorrow travel home for an off-day and a workout on Sunday (time TBA) followed hy Game 3 on Monday which would mark the Twins first home playof a time BA, , ollowed by Game 3 on Monday, which would mark the Twins first home playoft game since october 7, 2010 and third ever played at Target Field...the Twins spent 171 days in first place, tied with the 1970 AL West champions for most in club history (since 1961).

IEW YORK STATE OF MIND. Th Twins went 24 ainst the Yanees in NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: The Twins went 2-4 against the Yankees in the regular season,
going 1-2 at Yankee Stadium May 3-5 and 1-2 at Target Field July 22-24...they are 261going 1-2 at yanke Stadium May 3-5 and 1-2 at Target Field July 22-24...they are 261New York...they are 10-27 at Yankee Stadium II since 2009...Twins have split the last eight regular season games at 4-4, dating back to September of 2018.
$\Phi$ This marks the 14th time in MLB postseason history that two 100-win teams have matched up...last was Boston (108) \& Houston (103) in the 2018 ALCS...last in ALDS was Boston (108) \& New York-AL (100) in 2018.

## EXORCISING THE DEMONS: The Twins have played 15 postseason games against the Yankees

 in their history (since 1961), their most vs. any opponent...they are 2-13 all-time in those games, going 2-6 in New York ( $0-4$ at Yankee Stadium II) and 0-7 in Minnesota...they are looking to snap a 13-game losing streak in the postseason ( 10 to the Yankees and 3 to Oakland) dating back to Game 1 of the ALDS in 2004...the last time the Twins played in a postseason game was the Wild Card Game in 2017, losing 8-4 at Yankee Stadium.$\Phi$ In six of their last 10 playoff games against the Yankees (all losses), the Twins have held a lead or a tie through six innings...three losses have been in extra innings
$\Phi$ Both postseason wins at Yankee Stadium were started by Johan Santana as he made the starts on September 30, 2003 and October 5, 2004.
$\Phi$ Twins are returning nine players that were active from the 2017 Wild Card Game: José Berríos, Tyler Duffey, Taylor Rogers, Ehire Adrianza, Jason Castro, Mitch Garver, Max Kepler, Jorge Polanco and Eddie Rosario.

$\Phi$ This marks the second postseason appearance for Berríos... the other came back in the 2017 American League Wild Card Game, here against these Yankees...in that game, the right-hander was handed the loss after throwing 3.0 innings of relief, allowing three runs on five hits (1 HR) with four strikeouts.
$\Phi$ Entering the game in the third inning in relief of Ervin Santana, Berríos was greeted by a Gary Sánchez double, who came around to score on a two-out single by Greg Bird...the fourth inning saw more Yankee offense, as a one-out Brett Gardner single was followed by a home run from Aaron Judge, giving the Yankees a 7-4 lead...finished his outing with a perfect fifth
Including the Wild Card Game, Berríos is 1-3 in four lifetime games (3
Bombers, with a 6.35 ERA (17.0 IP, 12 ER), allowing 22 hits ( 3 home runs), eight walks, 20 strikeouts and an opponents' slash' line of . $306 / .390 / .500$ (22-for-72).
玉 In Yankee Stadium, he is 0-3 with a 9.58 ERA (10.1 IP, 11 ER ) and an opponents' OPS of 1.032.
TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos finished his 2019 campaign with a 3.68 ERA, and saw an uptick in
performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019.


Berrios finished the regular season fourth in the American League (10th in MLB) with 21 quality
starts, while 23 out of his 32 went at least 6 . inninos (including 1170 inning efforts) starts, while 23 out of his 32 went at least 6.0 innings (including $117.0+$ inning efforts)...not only
that, but in 103 career regular season starts, Berríos has thrown 51 quality starts ( 49.5 percent).

CAREER-BESTS: In what was a breakout year for the Puerto-Rican right-hander, Berríos set several career-bests, including: Wins (T-2017), quality starts (21), innings pitched (200.1), ERA (3.68), ground ball percentage (43.2\%), walk percentage (6.1\%), walks-per-9.0 (2.29), strikeouts/walks
