👁 Nelson Cruz (41), Max Kepler (36), Miguel Sanó (34), Eddie Rosario (32) and Mitch Garver (31) became the first set of five teammates

**DOBNAK MAKES HISTORY IN DETROIT:** In what was his ninth big league appearance, fifth start, Dobnak pitched 6.0 innings with just one hit allowed September 25 at Detroit, becoming the second rookie in Twins/Senators franchise history to throw at least 6.0 innings while allowing no more than one batter to reach safely via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch...previous Twins pitcher was Camilo Pascual on September 14, 1954 at Cleveland.

Tobback set down the first two batters of the game before Miguel Cabrera reached on a Jorge Polanco error...Jeimer Candelario knocked a double into the right-center field gap in Detroit, plating the only run (unearned) for Detroit, as he would go on to set down all 17 batters he faced, including another infield error that allowed Cabrera to reach again in the fourth. æ

It marked his longest career start and first quality start, while he set a career-high in strikeouts.
